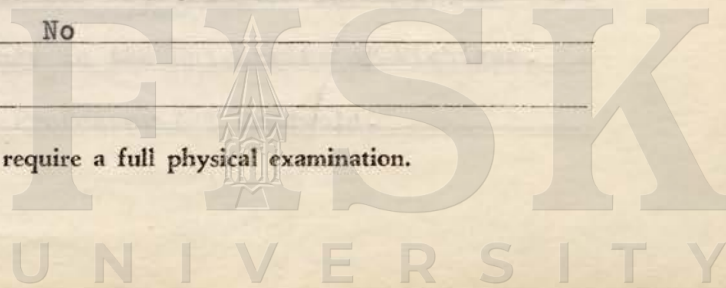

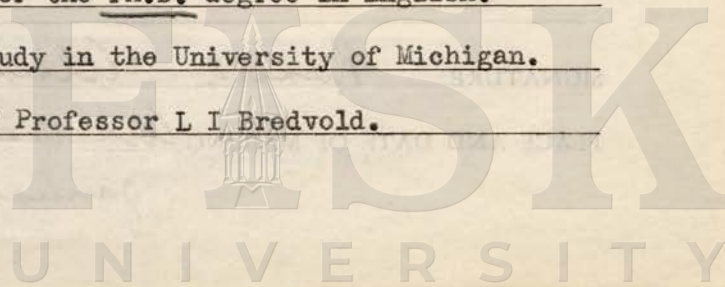
As yet, I have done little in the way of actual creative work. As part of my work done at the University of Michigan, however, I devoted, in a seminar course, a semester to the study of the English poet, John Donne. The results obtained from this limited research were given in a rather lengthy paper entitled A Study of the Emotional Seriousness of John Donne.

3. List of publications I have published nothing up to this point. I have several papers which, I think, might be worth publishing if I had adequate library facilities which would enable me to develop the studies more fully. I refer particularly to a study entitled The Satire of Byron and Pope, made as part of the work required in a course in the English Romantic Poets taken at the University of Michigan, under Associate Professor Bennett Weaver.

Plans for Work

I have in mind no definite position; I desire

- For what position do you seek further training? to prepare myself to be able to teach English more effectively in one of the Negro colleges or secondary schools.
- What course of study do you wish to take? I wish to take the course of study leading to an advanced degree in English literature.
- For what degree are you working? I desire to work for the Ph.D. degree in English.
- In what institution do you wish to study? I wish to study in the University of Michigan.

8. If awarded a fellowship

When would you wish to begin the study proposed? I would wish to begin my study during the 1937 summer school session.

What is your estimate of its probable duration? As my study would not consist of a definite project as such, I could not estimate accurately its probable duration. I wish, however, to begin actual work on the doctorate degree, which will entail the completing of residence requirements, and getting started on a research problem. When I have completed these arrangements I will be able to continue work on my project along with my regular Statement of Plan of Work teaching work. Estimating the probable duration roughly, if I were given a year of study, I could probably complete my study in approximately three and one-half or four years.
