Dear Supt. Hill:

We are happy to announce to you that The Julius Rosenwald Fund on March 23, 1925, appropriated \$475,630, including administrative expenses, to aid in the construction of rural schools and teachers' homes through the State Departments of Education in the fourteen Southern States for the year beginning July 1, 1925, and ending June 30, 1926.

As Mr. Rosenwald authorized me to make up a budget for schoolhouse construction in the various southern states, keeping the total within the limit of \$450,000, I carefully prepared a budget, being guided largely by (a) the requests from the states (b) the number of projects approved and completed on the present year's budget and (c) the number and size of projects I felt that each state could provide funds for and adequately supervise the construction of for the year beginning July 1, 1925, and ending June 30, 1926.

The allotment for Arkansas is as follows:

Dear Dr. Shepardson:

Arkansas and Texas used up their budget allotments in approved applications about the first of September and have on file in this office applications in excess of the budget allotments, amounting to \$11,000 for Arkansas and \$16,000 for Texas. The State Departments in these two states are urging that they be allowed to go ahead and erect these buildings where the money is already and the people are impatiently waiting to begin the work.

Arkansas has completed 15 projects already this year and Texas 25. Both states have many other buildings far along under construction and claim that every one will be completed.

You will recall that the Trustees gave me permission last year to go ahead and approve applications in excess of the budgets in Arkansas, South Carolina, and Texas. At the time I asked permission to do this, I made the statement that there would doubtless be enough reverting in some of the states to take care of the excess in these three states. When the year closed we found that the total amount used out of the \$450,000 available was \$414,806. If the Board had not allowed us the privilege of approving the applications in these three states in excess of the budget allotments, we would have had considerably more than \$50,000 to revert.

Judging from the progress being made now in some of the states, I feel confident that there will be enough to revert in a few of them to take care of the excess in these two states that are going along at a steady pace and building good school-houses. Some of these buildings can be completed between now and January 1st, if I am given authority to approve the applications. I would like to be authorized to approve applications in Arkansas in excess of the budget allotment to an amount approximating \$10,000, and in Texas \$15,000. The State of Alabama has also used up the budget allotment and has several applications where the money is already raised and the work ready to be started. I should like to have authority to approve applications in Alabama not to exceed \$5,000 in excess of the budget, in case it becomes absolutely necessary.

In making this request I feel confident, as I have said before, that the total outlay for the year will not exceed the \$450,000 approved for the whole South, yet none of the states are willing at this time to release any part of their budget allotment.

Trusting to hear from you at an early date, I

I take great pleasure in announcing to you that The Julius Rosenwald Fund on June 4, 1926, appropriated \$450,000, including administrative expenses, to aid in the construction of rural Negro schools and teachers' homes through the State Departments of Education in the fourteen Southern States for the year beginning July 1, 1926, and ending June 30, 1927.
