At the time we announced the appropriation of half the salary of your Rosenwald Building Agent last Spring it was stated that the Fund expected to cut this amount in half for the year 1928-29. But on learning that the states have not had opportunity to arrange for the additional expenditure in this item the Trustees of the Fund have made an appropriation of \$450 for 1928-29 to pay not more than one-half the salary and expenses of the building agent.



My dear Mr. Smith:

I appreciate very much the situation which you present in your letter of April 20th. However, since my budget has been made up for the next two years, it will be quite difficult for me to provide for the one-half salary of the Rosenwald Building agent during that time. Not knowing that the Rosenwald Fund would be withdrawn during the next biennium, I have made no provision for taking over this one-half salary. I dislike very much not being able to come to the rescue in this situation, but, recognizing that my money is very limited and that there is no way I can make provision for this one-half salary, I am hoping very much that you and your organization will be able to continue this work for us until I have had an opportunity to include it in my budget the next time.

Dear Mr. Hall: Since we are likely to give very little aid next school year toward the construction of schoolbuildings and are undertaking to curtail other commitments to a minimum for this period I am wondering if it will be satisfactory to you if we do not make an appropriation to pay one-half of the salary of the Rosenwald Building Agent? I note that he is supposed to work only half time and that the State Department pays one-half and the Fund one-half of his salary and expenses for half time.

Now that the General Education Board seems willing to furnish aid for a trained Negro supervisor in your state and some of the others it would seem that the continuation of a Rosenwald Building Agent might not be as necessary as in the past. I would like to hear from you at your earliest convenience and trust that it would be satisfactory to you for us to discontinue the aid for this work after the present year.

Dear Mr. Hall: Under our present agreement this will be the last check the Fund will send toward the salary and expenses of Mr. Walker, your Rosenwald building agent. It is as distressing to us as it is to you and to him that we cannot continue this aid. His work has been most satisfactory, which makes it all the more painful not to be able to continue our part of his salary and expenses. But in addition to the low market value of stocks, dividends are being omitted July 1, so that we will have no income except from the sale of our capital stock. We certainly hope that provision may be made in some way for him to continue this fine work in your state.



Dear Mr. Gresham: You will find attached application No. 8-K for the Kilmarnock School in Lancaster County, approved, to be paid by the General Education Board. It is my understanding that Mr. Davis has notified you that his Board has made the necessary appropriation to take care of this amount. As soon as the building is completed, will you please send the usual inspection report? If you haven't blanks on hand, we shall be glad to send them. You will note that we had to make slight changes in the amounts in order to distribute the \$1,200 among the items of estimated cost. Of course, your inspection report will change these amounts which will be entirely in keeping with our custom.

I am very glad that the General Education Board took care of this important project along with one other similar project in Georgia. So far as I know, there are now no moral hang-overs which might cause the states of the Fund any embarrassment anywhere in the South.


