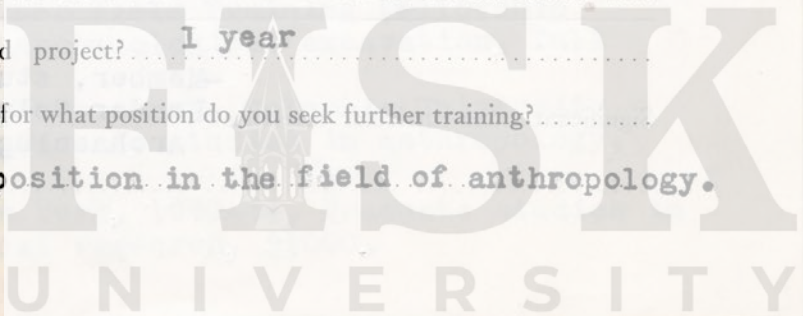

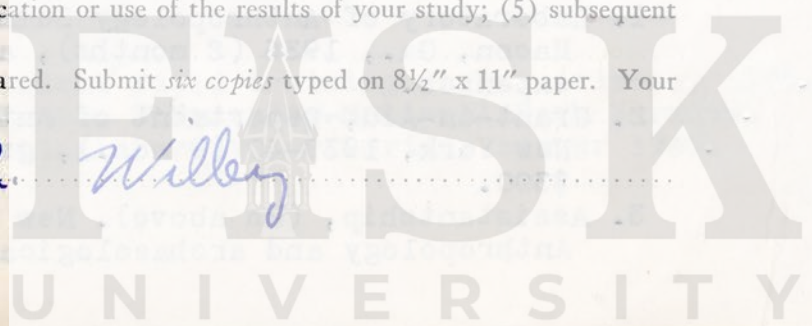

Statement of Plan of Work

Submit a statement giving detailed plans for your work during the tenure of your fellowship. This statement should include: (1) a full description of the project, including its character, scope, and significance; (2) the present state of the project (time of commencement, progress to date, etc.) and expectation as to completion; (3) the proposed university, institution of similar grade, or other place where work would be carried on, and the authorities with whom it would be done; (4) your expectation as to publication or use of the results of your study; (5) subsequent plans for your career.

Detailed Itemization and Explanation of Budget

Board and Room - \$1500. (rent - 75 per mo. -\$900)
(food - 50 per mo. -\$600)

Note- Washington, D.C. is an extremely expensive place to live. This rent estimate was made after discussing matter with Mr. Stirling and others. Food estimate for two people is less than enough for eating "out"; slightly more than enough for a couple housekeeping. Balancing meals while travelling with those while in residence should make estimate approximately correct.

Transportation - \$ 315.

2000 miles of travel (by auto) in Florida, during October 1941, at government rates of .05 per mile -----\$100.

1000 miles from Florida to north (Washington and New York), during 1st week in November, at above rate ----\$50.
