Dear Valla: I've had no announcement of your wedding but this new appendage to your name must mean that best wishes are in order. My congratulations.

I am not very keen on radio sketches. The only one I have seen on Negro health which had grand possibilities turned up in Houston, Texas, a few years ago when the Southern Conference on Tuberculosis met there. Dr. F. C. Elliott, Dean of the Texas Dental College, was responsible for the sketch, and except for a racial reference here and there it was a grand piece of work. I am sending Dr. Elliott a copy of this letter in order to save time, and I hope that he will take it as a request for a copy of the sketch and mail it to you at once. If he grants you the right to use it he should also give you the privilege of making such adjustments in it as will be necessary for a Louisville presentation. I am sending you some material which may be relevant but I doubt it.
