CAREER SINCE TENURE OF FELLOWSHIP

Mr. Lawrence's fellowship was not renewed, but he has remained in New York as a graduate student in the Department of Sociology at Columbia University. He has a half-time position as director of religious education at the Colored Orphan Asylum, 5901 Palisade Avenue, Riverdale-on-Hudson, New York, which provides maintenance and car-fare. During this 1940-41 year he will complete the courses necessary for residence requirements for the doctorate and will probably take his preliminary examinations in the spring. 9/24/40 (Examinations still to be taken. 8/10/41)

Mr. Lawrence returned to Atlanta, Georgia, in the fall of 1941, as Co-executive, Southern Field Council, Student YMCA. 8/10/41.

At completion of his second fellowship, Mr. Lawrence went to Fisk University as instructor in sociology.

Since his application indicated that probably during the next year he would be largely working in the Sociology Department at Columbia University, meeting formal requirements for the doctor's degree, in the ordinary course of events he would not be able to do much actual work on dissertation subject. The Committee felt therefore that it might be wise to work on some other subject, and would like to have him consult Dr. Charles Johnson. Whatever agreement is reached between Dr. Charles Johnson and Mr. Lawrence is agreeable to committee.
