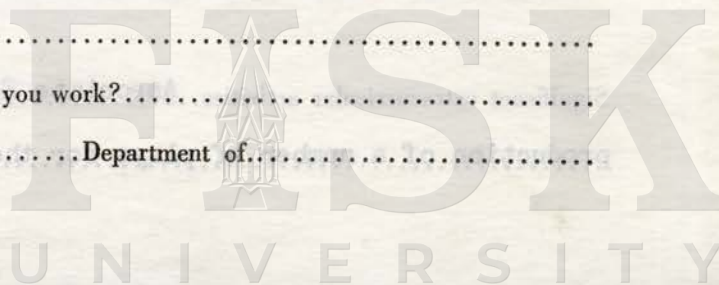

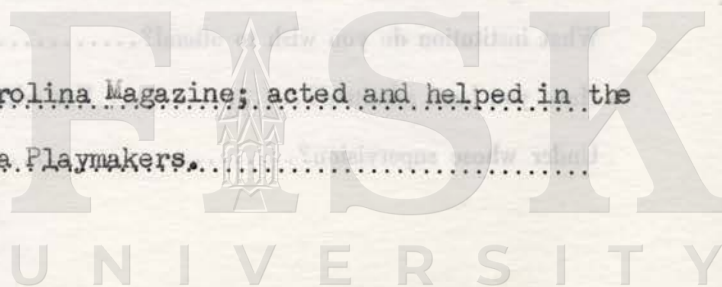

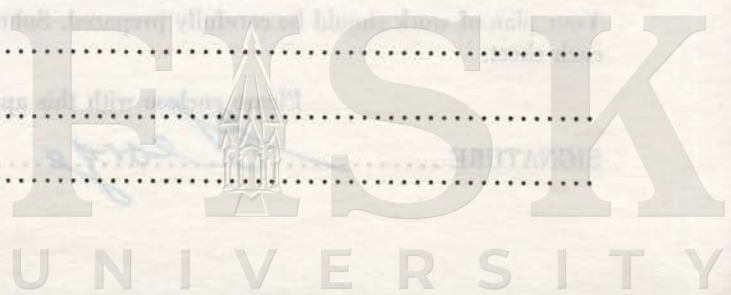

While working at Henry Street Settlement helped direct research and prepared final copy for reports on consumer problems, naturalization, housing needs (see "What Some Slum Dwellers Want in Housing" and "A Dutchman's Farm" in the Henry Street Studies series), etc. and was in full charge of the study of youth clubs from which I wrote the pamphlet "Rooms of Their Own". From 1939 through 1941 I did extensive research on southern poll tax measures (see report on Seven Poll Tax States prepared for New School of Social Research, 1941).

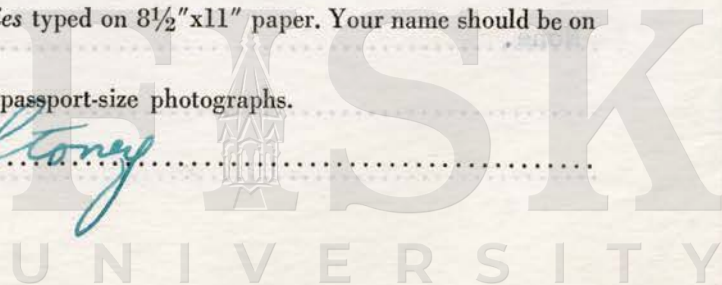

## Explanatory statement on budget.

This budget has been made up by listing the minimum figures furnished by Cooks travel agency and by drawing upon my own observation of the cost of living while in England and on the Continent last year. Should the G.I. Bill allowance for "on-the-job training" be granted for work overseas the amount for room and board can be cut by two-thirds. My own personal provision must be limited to \$500 because my wife is entirely dependent upon me for support.
