Reappointments

- Jacob Lawrence. This will be a terminal grant. Special letter to be written. \$1,200.
- Herman Branson. Refused summer session award. Will consider next year for full time grant. Special letter
- Thomas Bembry. Committee does not wish to renew. Will make an extension of \$425, the amount mentioned by one of his Columbia references as the stake he would advance him. Special letter.
- Langston Hughes CSJ - A leading figure, no doubt about it. When he makes a living his work falls off. To be considered further at April meeting.
- Edmonia Grant Did interesting work in Louisiana, and good work at Columbia. CSJ says a superior kind of person, and has made good headway. She resigned her post as principle of Peebles School in Nashville. Has had two posts offered to her recently. Discover Negro America will probably be published. Admits she does not rank in scholarship with Fowler and Certaine. Not reappointed.
- Ulysses Lee An excellent person, and difficult case to decide. Left for discussion at April meeting.
- Margaret Wormley RW. A competent person. She needs help now. Has done enough to justify renewal, though I hate to give it to her and not to Lee. Awarded \$1,800.
- Jeremiah Certaine Brilliant record. Yes, provided draft does not keep him out. \$1,065.
- Clyde Winkfield ERE - Winkfield gave recital. Do not care to renew. No further discussion.
- Robert Martin Given extension of \$565.
- Cleo Blackburn General opinion that he made no special case.
- Clifton Jones CSJ - Solid person. Hope to have him in good post, i.e., Hampton. Iowa thesis committee voted Dr. Park a courtesy member, and Dr. Park and Dr. Johnson are to supervise thesis. Granted \$1,100 if he is not drafted.
