PROFESSIONAL CAREER SINCE FELLOWSHIP

On completion of his study under the fellowship, Mr. Hill returned to his post at Hampton Institute, where he was promoted to Assistant Director of the George P. Phenix Training School. He teaches chemistry and spends balance of time assisting the director in administrative duties. He has been made an Assistant Professor since appointed to his fellowship. October, 1938

In September, 1939, Mr. Hill reported that he now holds appointment of Assistant Professor of Chemistry in Hampton Institute's College Division, with an increase in salary.

In September of 1940 Mr. Hill reported that he had returned to Cornell University for another year of graduate work toward his doctorate. 9/24/40

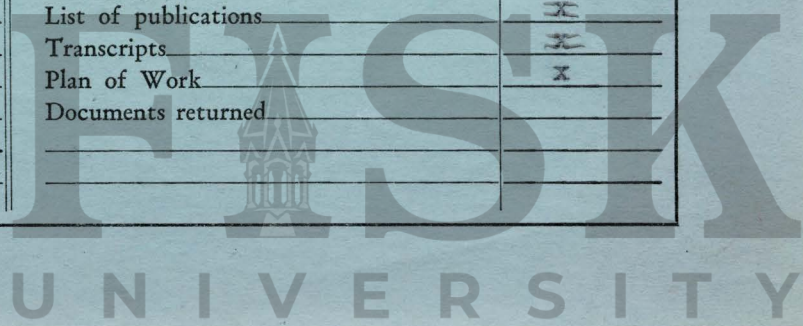
