MAP OF SCHOOL DISTRICTS

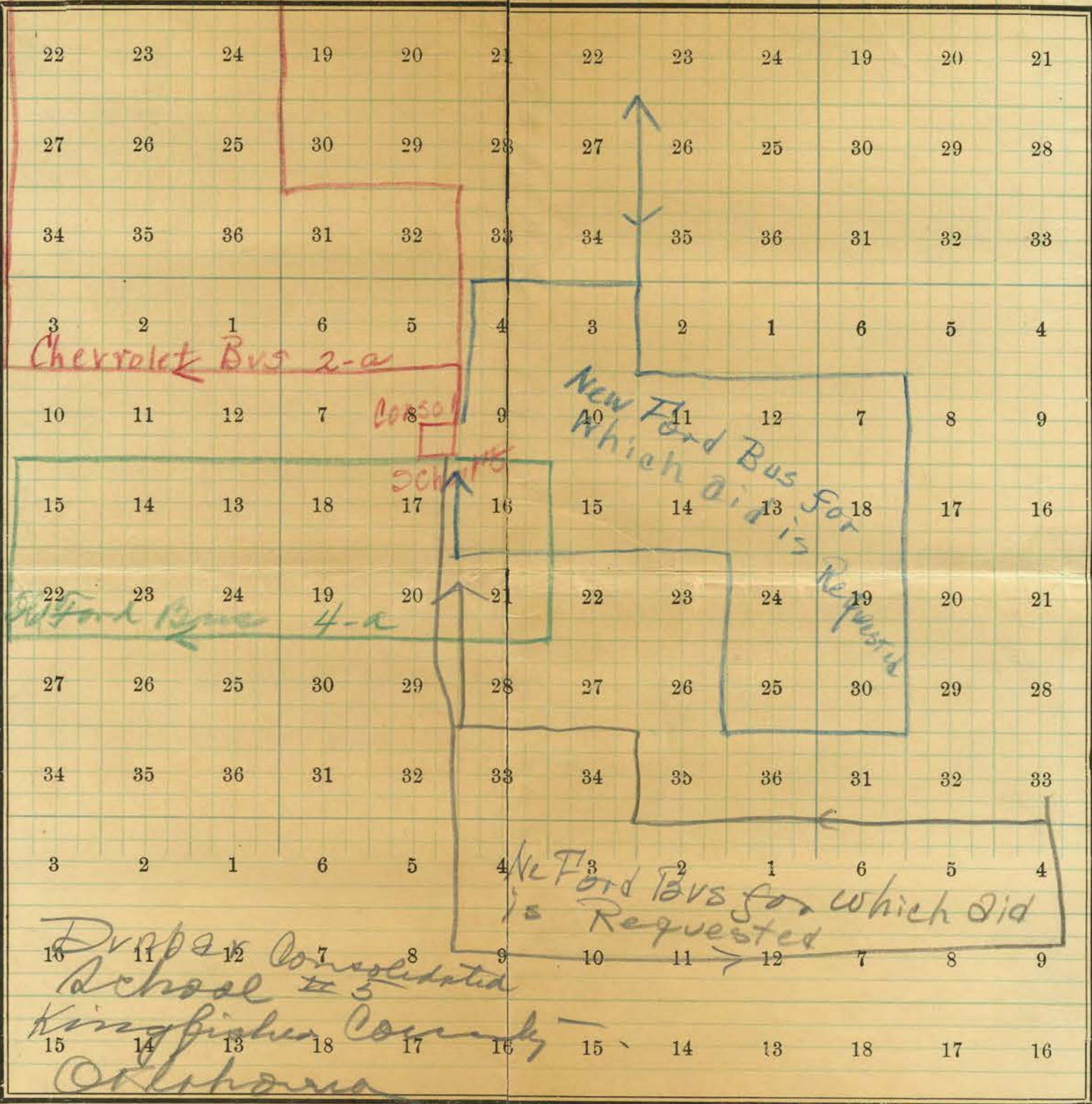

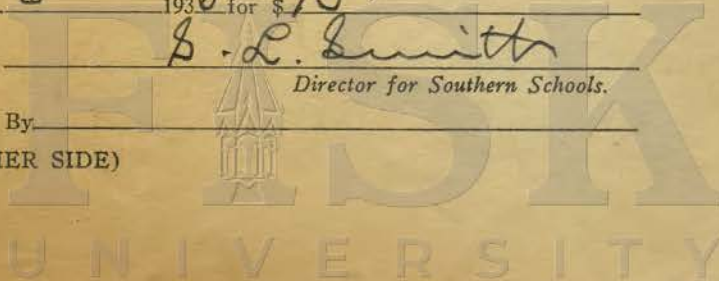

4 In accepting aid from the Fund - one-half the cost the first year, one-third the second year and one-fourth the third year - the public school authorities agree to continue the service at the end of the period without further aid. It is understood that the school term is not to be less than six months and no teacher's salary less than \$50 per month.
