To spread Extension information by simplified news writing among numbers of Negro farmers who may not otherwise be directly touched by farm and home agents; to prepare news articles and news stories with appropriate illustrations to meet the needs of persons with little or no formal education, and to correlate through simplified language, administrative rulings, procedures, etc. which in their original forms are "over the heads" of the persons intended to be helped.

Wishes to work at University of Wisconsin under Dr. William Sumner, possibly for Master's degree. Has not been admitted. Work would require one year. Would return to present position.
