





You will find attached a copy of a report on the Rosenwald School Day

Program held March 4, 1932, in Afteen southern state.

Although there was an almost unprecedented downpour of rain throughout the entire day covering almost every section of the South, it is interesting to note that 2,808 schools in 633 counties reported the exercises held, compared with 1,968 in 513 counties the previous year, with 100,000 more pupils and community members participating than in the previous year, while the amount of money raised on that day (\$7,000) was a little more than \$2,000 less than on the same day of the previous year and the total reported raised for the year up to March 4 (\$63,800) was about \$15,000 less. The drop-off in the amount raised for the year is partly due to the fact that we have been unable to get any report on this item from Virginia where the amount reported for last year was \$10,000. The state agents have indicated that possibly not more than half of the schools participating filed reports.

It is interesting to note that Tennessee leads the list of states in the amount of money raised in cash on March 4 and the amount raised the entire year up to that date, while North Carolina leads in the number of schools and people participating.



We have waited until today before sending copy of the Rosenwald School Day Bulletin to the printer as we hoped to receive the small cut of Mr. Rosenwald. Inasmuch as it was not received in time to be used on our 1935 Bulletin, we will use the same cut that was used last year.

Our Bulletin this year will consist of a fourpage folder as a cover to the Beautification Pamphlet which you
sent. The cost of printing 1500 of these will be \$25.40. That,
plus the cost of mailing, will be the total amount we shall request
from your fund unless you have decided to permit us to use the
balance of the \$100 to supplement the premiums offered by the
Rosenwald Fund for the school making the best record in the beautification and improvement of its ground and school plant, or to pay
the traveling expenses of the state committee incurred in judging
the winners.

In reply to your letter of February 14, I beg to advise that the field workers in our Department do not have sufficient travel allowances to enable them to visit and judge a few of the schools entering this contest. Our high school inspectors' travel allowances are so limited that they will be able to visit only the emergency cases and perhaps not all of them. The other persons in the Department, except myself, have almost exhausted their travel allowances.

Dear Mr. Embree: You will be interested to know that in addition to the Rosenwald School Day Programs in the Negro schools of the South held on March 15, similar programs were held in a part or all of the white schools in practically all of the counties in which we have library demonstrations.

Counties in Tennessee, and Webster Parish, Louisiana, had the exercises in everyone of the white schools. Walker County, Alabama had exercises in the white consolidated high schools. The librarian of Jefferson County, Texas wrote that she was helping in the exercises in all the Negro schools, and that she was expecting to reach as many white schools as possible, although she might not be able to get in touch with all of them in the brief time available. Charleston and Richland Counties, South Carolina expect to have the exercises in a number of the white schools on March 29, which was designated as the Rosenwald School Day for South Carolina, as March 15 was a holiday for all schools on account of the State Teachers Meeting in that State. We hope to be receiving interesting reports of the Rosenwald School Day throughout the South within a short time.

We are in receipt of your letter of March 18. also your check #12695, in the amount of \$125.00, relative to expenses of the Rosenwald School Day Program.

Please be advised that we had five thousand copies of the bulletin printed to be distributed over the State, and the cost of printing this bulletin amounted to \$427.50. Mr. Worley, Director of our Negro School Division, advised us that the Julius Rosenwald Fund would pay approximately \$150.00 of the expense of publishing and printing the Rosenwald School Day Programs but at that time he estimated the cost to be \$300.00. However, after the bulletin was under way there were a number of necessary items included that brought the cost of the bulletin up to \$427.50.

Along with this cost, Mr. Worley paid from his personal funds \$15.00 for assembling statistical data for Chapter Eight, and \$4.39 to the Economy Engraving Company, totaling \$19.39.



The Oklahoma City Chapter of the American Association of University Women has provided the amount of \$75 to be given as a scholarship fund to one of our Jeanes teachers at the summer session of Hampton or Tuskegee, - Hampton preferred. This scholarship will be awarded by a committee composed of members of the local branch of the American Association of University Women.

We have a balance of \$47.70 remaining from the \$100 which you allotted to Oklahoma for the purpose of printing and mailing the Rosenwald School Day Program this year. If it meets with your approval I shall be glad to use this balance as a second scholarship for the Jeanes teachers in the amount of \$50, - the additional \$2.30 to be provided from other sources, - and award it to the Jeanes teacher whose county makes the best showing in the School Improvement and Beautification Contest or to the teacher whose county makes the second best showing in the event the American Association of University Women's Scholarship is awarded to the teacher whose county makes the best showing. I believe that this will stimulate activity and interest in the counties. Even if it is too late to stimulate such interest, it will be an acceptable award for the teacher who worked hard on the program without hope of reward.

In the event you decide that the remaining part of the fund may be used for this purpose and will let me know at once, I will notify the teachers that this second scholarship is made available by the Rosenwald Fund. We planned to use this balance for the purpose of paying the expenses of the committee that will judge the winner in the state contest, and we shall proceed with our original plan unless you prefer that it be used as a scholarship.

I am sending a cerbon copy of this letter to Mr. Favrot with the request that he write you directly giving his reaction to the proposition. I understand that Mr. Favrot cooperated with you in promoting the School Improvement and Beautification Program.

It so happened, while I was away on a southern trip, that the comptroller issued a check for \$100.00 on February 26, 1934 at the request of Mr. Easom "as aid toward the cost of printing and distributing the Rosenwald School Day Programs". Mr. Easom had expected to receive more than this amount in order to have enough to pay the entire expense, but was limited to \$100.00. After paying for the printing of the bulletins he expected to use the remainder to apply on the cost of distributing the thousands of bulletins and other expenses relative to the program, but this was finally taken care of by the State and he was not required to reimburse the State. In issuing the check the comptroller sent nothing but the voucher to which the check was attached and did not ask for reimbursement of any unused balance, probably because she did not feel that there would be any balance. Mr. Essom went away to Yale for the summer and overlooked having it reimbursed. He used this balance of \$25.77 to apply on postage the present year. TO PARISH SUPERINTENDENTS AND SUPERVISORS OF SCHOOLS:

The purpose of this letter is to bring two matters to your attention. Please give your teachers the information this letter contains.

First. For about ten years the negro schools, especially the Rosenwald schools, have observed Rosenwald Day by rendering appropriate exercises in the school on a day named by this office and using program prepared by us. It is our hope that the memory of Mr. Rosenwald will be honored again this year. We are asking the local terchers to prepare their own program and to give the program on any convenient day during the month of March or the first week in April. The local teachers may obtain assistance from any local source they desire in both the preparation of the program and rendering it. We are furnishing a sheet containing some facts which might be brought into the program. We will not be in position to furnish any other facts or statements.

In order to stimulate more than usual interest in this program, we are in position to offer the following prizes:

> 1st - \$20 (in cash or books at the option of the school) 2nd - \$15 (in cash or books at the option of the school)

> 3rd - \$10 (in cash or books at the option of the school)

4th - \$ 5 (in cash or books at the option of the school)

The program must be given before April 4 and reports must be prepared and submitted to parish authorities by April 11. If more than four schools in any parish enter the contest, the superintendent or a committee named by him should judge the reports and select the four highest ranking reports and send them to us by April 20. No report received here later than April 20 will be considered in the State contest. Honorable mention will be given to the school in each parish winning first place in this contest.

Second. The second matter we wish to bring to your attention is that in addition to the libraries offered in the beautification program in the negro schools there will be available \$100 to supplement the elementary library prizes which have already been offered. To supplement the elementary prize offered, \$50 will be used for prizes to the group of schools which are entering the beautification contest this session for the first time and will be distributed as follows:

1st - \$20 (in cash or books at the option of the school)

2nd - \$15 (in cash or books at the option of the school)

3rd - \$10 (in cash or books at the option of the school)

4th - \$ 5 (in cash or books at the option of the school)

And \$50 will be available to supplement the elementary library prize offered to the group of schools which were in the contest last year and again this year. The amount will be distributed as follows:

1st - \$20 (in cash or books at the option of the school)
2nd - \$15 (in cash or books at the option of the school)
3rd - \$10 (in cash or books at the option of the school)
4th - \$ 5 (in cash or books at the option of the school)

The school improvement and beautification contest will close on May 15, 1936. A committee appointed by the superintendent should judge the schools in each parish and report to the superintendent. The superintendent should send all individual school reports and a consolidated report showing the four highest ranking schools in the parish to this office by June 1. As soon as the State Committee can determine the winners the prizes will be awarded. In each parish an honor certificate will be given to the school winning first place in each group. Blank forms to be used by the individual schools to report improvements and beautification to the superintendent's office will be forwarded from this office later. We are enclosing several copies of the suggestions for the improvement and beautification of school plants program.

Last year we were very much pleased with the results of the contest. 378 schools participated. \$44,000 was raised and spent in repairing the buildings, \$12,000 for equipment, \$7,000 on school plants, \$4,700 for other equipment, making a total of about \$68,000. Of this amount, \$35,000 was furnished from public funds and \$53,000 was raised by local communities. About 45,000 people attended the exercises. We hope that the result of the contest this year will be even better than last session and it can be if the teachers and officials will put forth their best efforts. There can be no question about the worthiness of the objectives in this contest. The schools should be repaired and painted, the grounds should be made more beautiful and equipment should be added.

A contest in schoolhouse improvement and beautification is open to white schools also. The same general rules and requirements will govern the contest in the white schools that prevail for the negre schools, except that the only prize offered in white schools is an elementary library worth \$36 for the winning school in each group. The schools will be judged separately either by the same committee or separate committees at the option of the superintendent. All reports should be made to this office.

I again want to assure you of the appreciation of Texas for the fine opportunity which the Rosenwald Fund gives us in our program of work here.
