My dear Dr. Bousfield:

I am in receipt of your letters of May 21st and 22nd. If you have read my application, you will have no doubt noted on page 3, that I stated, "should the Scholarship Committee of the Julius Rosenwald Fund see fit to grant me a scholarship, I would prefer to begin studying September 1936-ending June or August 1937." However I might have extended that time to include and September as I should be so grateful for such an opportunity to continue study at any time.

I am sorry you misinterpreted my question relative to "when as a rule is the announcement of the scholarships made", to mean that I expected any financial help from your organization funds this summer, or that I took for granted that I would even be considered for a scholarship; as I am fully aware of the time and procedure required in acting upon these measures. My plans to study this summer have long since been made.

Supt. Archer evitably misunderstood what was requested of him. I tried to explain, in an interview with him, that a letter from him would be necessary as a part of the application routine; therefore I was as surprised as you, upon the reception of the copy that I had been granted a leave to continue study. In the meanwhile, I have informed him of the mere probability of the whole thing, and assure you that his letter has in no way my position here in no way insecure.
