FELLOWSHIPS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

The University of Colorado announces the following fellowships and scholarships which are available to students who have the necessary qualifications and who are graduates of Universities or Colleges of recognized standing. Applications should be filed with the Dean, on blanks provided for the purpose. The University is in session three full 16-week terms a year. The terms begin approximately July 1, November 1, and March 1. Awards are made for resident work during any two consecutive terms of the year starting July 1. Holders of fellowships and scholarships are expected to become candidates for higher degrees in the Graduate School in the department in which they hold appointment. Three or four hours per week in reading papers or assisting in other ways may be required of fellows. For application blanks, address the Dean of the Graduate School, University of Colorado, Boulder, Colorado.

All applications should be in the hands of the Dean on or before February 22. An official transcript of all work completed and a list of courses to be completed during the current year must be submitted. **At least three letters of recommendation from persons who can speak from first-hand knowledge of the applicant's ability and general fitness for the award should be sent directly to the Dean of the Graduate School.**

Usually the Graduate School awards about fifteen fellowships and forty-five scholarships.

RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS: Each amounting to \$400 and tuition. Designed primarily for students of high ability who expect to become candidates for the doctorate. Research fellowships are offered only to those who have already done some research and advanced study; in general, at least the master's degree or its equivalent is expected.

UNIVERSITY FELLOWSHIPS: Each amounting to \$200 and tuition. Open to students of promise who have not yet reached the attainment expected of research fellows but who have done some graduate work.

GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS: Each providing for tuition. Open to recent graduates of ability, serious purpose, and adequate preparation for advanced study.

A general fee of \$17 per term for the Student Health Service and other University services, not included in the scholarship and fellowship awards, must be paid by each holder of such award in the Graduate School.

GRADUATE ASSISTANTS

Some of the university departments of instruction employ graduate students as part-time assistants at stipends ranging from \$200 to \$800 for the academic year. Assistants pay the regular resident tuition. These appointments are not under the control of the Graduate School and no formal application blanks are provided. **Apply directly to the head of the department concerned.**
