Dear Dr. Davis:

I am writing you on behalf of Dr. Ernest Holder who has been a pathological interne at Harlem Hospital for two and one-half years. Dr. Holder is colored. He prepared for medical school at Tufts University and graduated in the class of '31 from Meharry Medical College. He is single and 40 years of age.

Dr. Holder has served for 2 1/2 years as an unsalaried interne at Harlem Hospital. He has proven a very earnest and careful student and has become proficient in his work. He is a gentleman and has been cooperative. Dr. Weintraub, the pathologist, believes that he is capable of developing into a teacher or an investigator, if given an opportunity.

Dr. Paul Klemperer, pathologist at the Mount Sinai Hospital, is willing to accept Dr. Holder as a volunteer in his laboratory in order that he may obtain a larger experience and instruction in investigation from himself and his colleague, Dr. Otani. Dr. Gross, the Director of the laboratories, and Dr. Turner, the Medical Director of the hospital, have been approached and will approve this arrangement.

Dr. Holder, however, requires some means of support during the year of his instruction at Mount Sinai Hospital as the hospital cannot provide quarters or meals for him. It may be possible for Harlem Hospital to provide quarters but provision for meals and transportation must be found and, in my opinion, it would be advisable to provide quarters for Dr. Holder outside the hospital, and a stipend so that he might purchase clothes and books.

We have found at Harlem Hospital that Dr. Holder possesses such merit that it would be a good investment to foster his career, and I am approaching the Julius Rosenwald Fund with a view to securing some stipend for Dr. Holder. It is possible that when he has the additional training that can be obtained at the Mount Sinai Hospital, he will be able to secure employment as an instructor in one of the medical colleges for colored physicians - either at Howard or at Meharry, his Alma Mater.
