

Negro Rural School Program

Transportation

- 1. Application of Ky. for transportation of 15 children by train instead of by bus in order that a one-teacher school may be abandoned and consolidated with better and larger school.

 Aid granted on same basis as that offered where busses are hired rather than operated by school authorities, with following conditions:
 - a. That the train schedule permits students using this method of transportation to be in school during the regular school hours.
 - b. That the school authorities recognize that by accepting our assistance over a three-year period they commit themselves to assume full responsibility after we have withdrawn our aid, either by continuing to transport the students by train or to provide bus transportation.
- 2. Additional aid for Kentucky granted at request of S.L.S. under date of August 21, 1929. Estimated allotment \$3,200.00.

Construction

It is satisfactory to approve applications for the total amount appropriated to a state in cases where states use up their total quota for permanent construction and special aid to backward counties. However the analysis should show disbursement for construction under three heads:

- 1. Regular aid.
- 2. Extra allowance for permanent construction.
- 3. Special aid for construction in backward counties.

Term Extension

In cases where schools have increased their teaching staff or have increased the rate of the salaries of teachers, the Fund will contribute one-third the total salaries instead of onethird the salaries on the basis of last year.



RADIO W.B.H. and E.R.E. have decided not advisable to distribute electrically operated radio sets to rural schools in the South, but keep to the battery sets. Per S.L.S's inquiry 9/6/29

Extension of Terms

Request for additional aid (from Missouri) for term extension refused - (would give them only regular aid). Also refused to give aid in order that school opportunities might be made available in communities where as many as eight Negro children reside (in order to cary out State law).

Transportation'

Aid not granted in cases where schools apply for aid on horse-drawn vehicles. (S.L.S's letter 9/10/29 requesting such aid for Ky. and Tenn.)

Libraries

High school library sets to be available for any Negro high school - <u>rural</u> or <u>urban</u>. Same applies to elementary sets.

Extension of Terms

Aid given only on condition that the extended term is six months or more. (WBH to SLS 10/17/29)



Dear Mr. Graves:

You will find inclosed inspection reports on the clean-up budget by States and schools showing the amount requested, the amount paid by Tuskegee, the amount paid by The Fund, the number of schools cancelled or transferred and the amount of money refunded by States.

You will notice that a few of the State Agents made some transfers early in the year, but we notified them after getting reports that this had been done not to make further transfers, but to allow the schools to be cancelled in case they could not be built and to refund the money; however, the few transfers made were on schools that were started under the Tuskegee regime, which were not included on our request under the clean-up budget. If they had not made the transfers they would have applied for aid under the new budget and would have received more money than they did receive under the clean-up budget.

Under the column of amount requested the original budget shows \$73,650, while our report shows \$73,850. This change was made necessary when, in searching the records, we found that the original request by Tuskegee for Powell school, Montgomery County, North Carolina, was \$400 and that \$200 had been paid by Tuskegee. This does not change the amount of cash involved under the clean-up budget, but it enables us to show that Mr. Rosenwald has contributed a total of \$400 on this school instead of \$200 as is shown on our original request.

You will note also that we included, as per your request of June 27th, \$600 for schools built by Tuskegee for which checks had been issued but not presented for payment until after the Tuskegee books had been closed.

This change of course increased the total amount paid by Tuskegee on the clean-up budget, because these checks were for the last payments on the above named schools, the first checks issued by Tuskegee having been cashed. As the Cool Springs school was rejected after we had sent you the inspection report you will please return that to us or destroy it. You included the \$500 for this school in the \$1,100 check sent to the State Department of Public Instruction of North Carolina as a final payment on the clean-up budget, but as this school was not on the clean-up budget its rejection does not affect the total in any way and the refund of \$500 on this school is not included on North Carolina's report of schools, but the \$500 intended for this school is included in the \$600 refund check from Morth Carolina, attached.

The clean-up budget has been a source of annoyance to you as well as to us, but we have done our best to straighten it out and close all past obligations for these schools. We feel happy to know that it is all behind us, and that such a condition cannot occur under the present plan for distribution of aid.

The Executive Committee approved the resolution authorizing us to expend up to \$15,750. during the coming year from the \$40,000. contingent fund, in helping to extend school terms. The conditions of our offer have been slightly modified. In paragraph 2 under item 4 beginning the sentence: "It is to be understood that the maximum salary, etc." This has been changed to read: "It is to be understood that the minimum teacher's salary toward which this aid is to be given, is \$50. per month." advisability of the Fund's specifying a maximum salary to these states was questioned and I do not think that there is any decided loss in our not doing so. At any rate, we are indicating what seems to us to be a minimum. I suggest that you present this matter to the State Agents so that they can put it in operation during the coming year.

Dear Mr. Gresham:

As an experiment the Julius Rosenwald Fund has made an appropriation for the school year 1928-29 to aid a maximum of 10 rural Negro schools and not more than 30 teachers in each of the fourteen states to extend the regular school terms one or two months. It is thought that this will have the effect not only of extending school terms in backward communities but also of raising the standard of teachers by increasing the annual salaries.

The following plan of cooperation is quoted from the docket (Item VI.), approved June 13, 1928:

"The basis of this offer is that for the first year & the cost of the extended term be paid from public funds and & by the Fund, and for the second year & from public funds and & by the Fund, it being a condition of the offer that public school authorities agree to meet the entire cost of the extended term after two years. It is to be understood that the minimum teacher's salary toward which this aid is to be given is \$50. per menth."

This matter was discussed at the conference of State
Agents at Signal Mountain, Tennessee, June 8th. It was brought
out that such aid is badly needed and could be wisely used to
promote better teaching in Negro schools. It was thought that
the State Department of Education in each state could carefully
select the schools and teachers where the experiments might be
tried, keeping in mind not only the need for the aid but the
possibility of having the authorities agree to carry it forward
as provided in the plan. When such schools and teachers are
decided on we shall be glad to have full details of each
submitted for approval before the Fund is obligated.







Transportation of Students

The Board of Trustees of the Julius Rosenwald Fund has made an appropriation to provide for bus service in transporting Negro children on the following conditions:

- I The Fund to provide \$1 for each dollar provided by local sources for the first year; \$1 for each \$2 provided in the second year; \$1 for each \$3 provided in the third year, with the understanding that the county will agree to continue the operation of the service after the three-year period.
- or 2 The Fund will pay ene-half the purchase price of new busses and in addition \$1 for each dollar raised from local sources to be applied toward the operating expense of duch transportation for the first year, on the condition that the Fund's share toward the purchase and operation of one bus shall not be more than \$500; \$1 for each \$2 the second year (not to exceed \$75 a year for each bus); \$1 for each \$3 the third year (not to exceed \$55 a year for each bus), with the understanding that the county will continue the service after the three-year period.
- 3 It is to be understood that no school is eligible for this aid unless it has a term of at least six months (eight months being preferred) and the salary of no teacher less than \$50. The kind of bus to be used under either "l" or "2" shall be a modern auto type with satisfactory body, which is to be approved in each case by the State Department of Education and the Fund before obligation is made.

The amount appropriated to pay the Fund's share for operating 6 auto transportation busses in Virginia for a period of nine months at an average of \$80 per month each is \$2,160 on conditions set forth in "1" above.



I am asking that you cancel second year extensions of term in applications No. 10-a for \$38.33, Oak Grove school in Jefferson County, and No. 12-a for \$90.00, Humphrey school in Jefferson County.

I have talked to Mr. Keith about these two schools and he is very much disappointed that they were not able to continue in their contract for term extension. The financial condition of these districts and Jefferson County as a whole, makes it absolutely impossible for them to go ahead, in fact most of the schools in Jefferson County are running a short term this year. The banks have been carrying their warrants heretofore on the anticipated revenue but due to the fact that the banks have been hard pressed for money themselves, they have shut off these districts and they have found it impossible to borrow the money elsewhere.

Mr. Keith wishes me to express his regrets in this matter. He has made a serious effort to help these districts borrow the money but has been unsucdessful.

We are also asking that you cancel first year application No. 5 for \$57.50, the Faith school in Jefferson County, for the same reason.

I am enclosing herewith our check; in the amount of \$185.83 for these three cancelled projects.






