Dear Mr. Mitchell: Mr. Credle and I have talked over the plan in regard to consolidation at Cotton Plant, Woodruff County. In this particular case we are rating plan No. 6-B on a seven-teacher basis because you are building at the same time a three-room shop which will take care of the vocational work for both boys and girls. If the shop should not be completed and reported at the time the schoolhouse is, then it would have to be rated on a six-teacher basis, but if both are completed together you may notify the superintendent that the Fund's share will be \$3,350 on the schoolhouse and \$850 on the three-room brick shop. We can also give one-third the cost of vocational equipment up to \$100 for each of the three shop rooms.

We shall not undertake to pass on the Augusta plan in Woodruff County until we have heard from Mr. Baker and you further on this subject. However, in the mean time they are at liberty to begin work on the shop at that school.

We are willing to allocate the following aid on rebuilding the Gregory plant: Schoolhouse \$550, teachers' home \$450, shop (two rooms) \$500; or a total of \$1500 if all these are constructed. Please send in applications on this basis.

Dear Mr. McQuistion:-

I cannot understand why there should be delay in forwarding me the contribution which has been made by the Rosenwald people to you for the building of the negro school of El Dorado. I did not have an agreement with you in writing because I thought a gentlemen's agreement was sufficient.

It was agreed between you and me that if the building was completed in accord with plans submitted by you to the Rosenwald people and then referred back to you and from you to me with instruction to proceed and we would get the appropriation provided the building was built according to those plans. I borrowed the money, let the contract, built the building. I asked you at the time, as you will remember, whether the authority to grant this sum of money rested with anybody else save you. I was given to understand by you that you had full authority to write me the check when the building was completed according to specifications. There was absolutely nothing said nor required concerning land nor equipment. Then you went to New York and representatives of this fund have been tossing me about on first one excuse and another, and all the time as I understand it the money has been in your possession for distribution and I have been paying interest. With me an agreement is an agreement whether it is in writing or not.

I have not bought the seats for this school as it should be seated because I have not had the money. If I have had faith enough in you to invest \$1700.00 more in a \$9000.00 project it looks to me like you might release this \$1700.00 on my promise, to seat the school properly.

Now I think I have been treated roughly in this matter and all together unjustly. I think this money has been held up for arbitrary reasons and not because my part of the contract, in accord with my agreement with you, has not been wholly fulfilled. I do not care to fiddle along with the matter any longer. I simply want to know what you are going to do about it.

Dear Dr. Dicken:

I am somewhat embarrassed and at a loss to account for the position you take in your letter of May 8, regarding the negro school recently built in El Dorado.

You are right in saying that we agreed to give you the appropriation as soon as the building was completed according to plans as approved by the Fund. I can hardly see how you could become a party to an agreement and then feel that you were not obligated to complete it before requesting the Rosenwald Fund's contribution. I am enclosing a copy of the application blank which was properly executed by the county superintendent representing the El Dorado district and by me representing the Rosenwald Fund through the State Department, dated September 4. This is the identical form used in approximately 5,000 districts in the South and, so far as I know, you are the first man to feel that this application does not form the basis of the agreement between the two parties. As a matter of fact, you have been given more concessions on this project than have been given to any similar building among the more than three hundred now completed in Arkansas. As you know, these concessions include a reduced size of school site which probably saved you several thousand dollars, as it would have been necessary for you to buy at least the remainder of the city block adjacent to this building. You were also given the concession of submitting your own plan which was materially below the usual standard required by the Fund. Just how much saving this concession allowed you to make I do not know but certainly you felt, and so expressed yourself, that this would enable you to construct the building much cheaper than taking a regular plan.

As a representative of the State Department at the time the building project was started and as a representative of the Rosenwald Fund at present, I assure you that I have no inclination to give you any treatment than that which we agreed upon and which has been the standard plan of the Fund for ten years. I am very sorry that you should feel it necessary to question my veracity and jeopardize the friendship which has existed between us by expressing yourself as you have done. I can only hope that you will let the better element of your disposition correct your hasty expression.

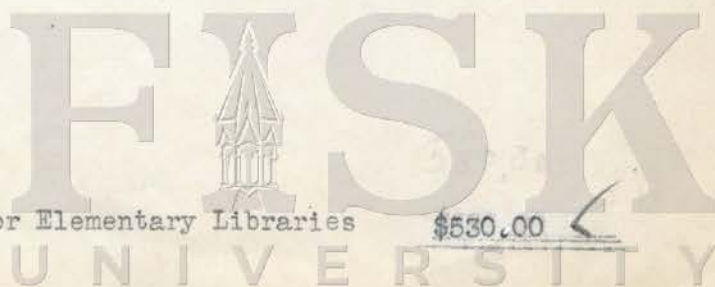
