What institution do you wish to attend? None. My doctorate is at Northwestern.

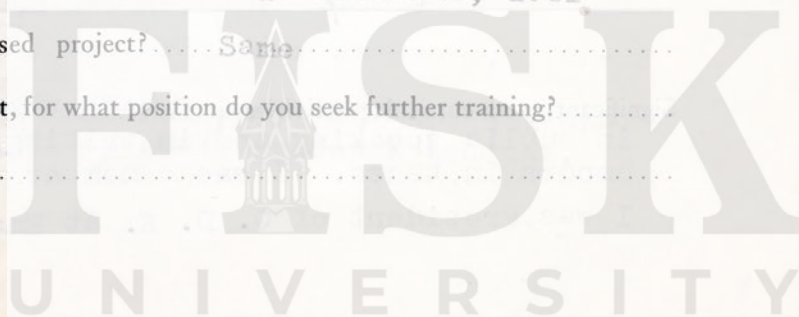

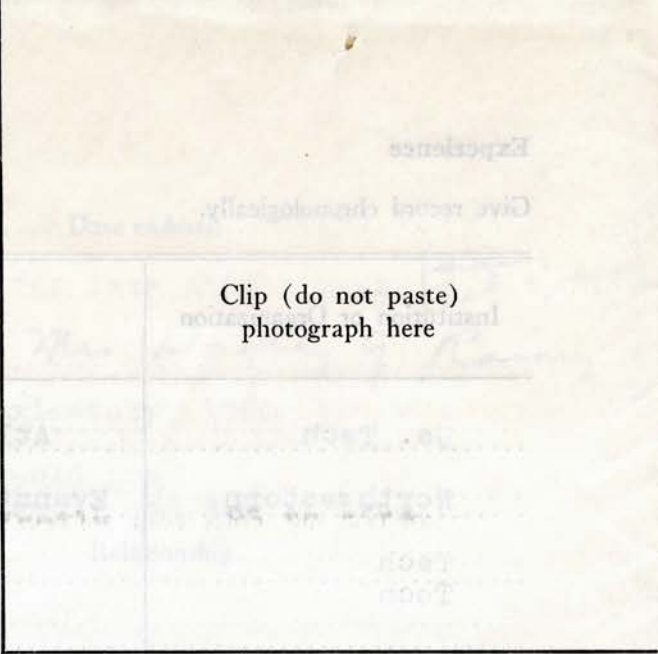
I had a \$300 scholarship <sup>in history</sup> during my master's year at Emory, 1928-29
