My dear General: I am enclosing copy of a letter which was directed to Colonel H. C. Michie, Commander, Medical Corps, Camp Livingston, Louisiana. I think this letter is self-explanatory. Mizell is very much needed in Fort Lauderdale, and I imagine that the worry about his work there makes him reasonably unhappy in the Army. His worry is no primary reason for relieving him from duty. I am of the opinion, however, that his absence from Fort Lauderdale is sorely felt. I think this man should be sent home.
