#### Explanations

1. #28-I, Iberville Parish Training School.

The situation in this case is as follows: About three years ago Baton Rouge College, a Baptist institution, was moved from Baton Rouge to Plaquemine. A new two-story frame building was erected and the school was operated there under the auspices

of the negro Baptists of the State. There are outstanding obligations against the building which the Baptists find it difficult to meet and at the same time operate the school.

The school is erected on a site of about four acres which is admirably located and well drained. There are seven classrooms and a large office or industrial room on the first floor and a very large auditorium over the entire second floor. On the second floor it would be possible to partition in such way as to provide four classrooms and still leave an auditorium large enough to accommodate the school. The foundation is brick chain; the material used is #2; the workmanship is fair. Windows are grouped. I spoke to you about this project at Jackson, Mississippi.

This building can be purchased and equipped and put in first-class condition for about \$17,000 which the school board is inclined to do instead of erecting a new building on the regular Rosenwald plan. There are two outstanding benefits that would come from purchasing this building: First, a desirable site would be secured; and, second, the goodwill of the negroes of the district would be enlisted; whereas, if the school board should erect another building, it would make it impossible for this school to operate with any benefit and the negro Baptists' investment would be a dead loss to them. I think the goodwill of the people of the district and the good site would make the purchase of this property desirable, and I am therefore recommending that the Rosenwald appropriation be approved. I would be glad to have you or your representative come immediately to advise with us on the proposition.

2. #29-I, Donaldsonville or Ascension Parish Training School.

A good site has been secured just on the edge of the town of Donaldsonville for building a parish training school in Ascension Parish. The plan to be used is #6 modified by eliminating the auditorium and building two classrooms instead. They are ready to begin work on this building now.

3. #32-I, Southern University Practice School.

At Southern University we are going to reorganize the school of education and expand the teacher-training work in

that institution. We are about to complete a survey of the State in which the subject of teacher training is one of the principal subjects of study. Mr. Newbold of North Carolina is directing the study. The report will undoubtedly designate Southern University as the school where high-school teachers should receive their training. In addition to this feature Southern University should also continue to train elementary teachers.

The State has on hand now \$19,000 to put into a modern training school building. The General Education Board has committed itself to an appropriation of \$14,000 on condition that the training school building cost when equipped at least \$40,000. If we could secure \$7,000 more we would be ready to begin the construction of this building immediately. I hope the Rosenwald Fund will be willing to appropriate the difference and make the construction of the building immediately possible.

The plan for this building is being prepared by the school's architect, Mr. Charles Favrot, who is a brother of Mr. Leo Favrot. I am enclosing a copy of the preliminary plans. It is probable that the elevation will be changed. I know that the cupola on the roof will be removed. I don't especially fancy the elevation. We propose to erect this building on the east side of the lake and south of the road, just as you enter Southern University campus.

Dear Supt. Herris: You will find attached budget appropriations for 1950-51, on construction, extension of school terms (no appropriation for new schools in 1950-51), school libraries, Bosenwald Building Agent, and Rosenwald School Day Program.

The total appropriation for construction in 1930-31 is greater than the actual amount used by the Southern states during any budget year in the past. Judging from requests of the states for types above six-teacher, the lump sum appropriation will be ample to take care of these larger types and teachers homes, which will be allocated to states by specific applications.

Previous announcement has been made of the Fund's withdrawal of aid on one-teacher schools and the reduction on the two-teacher type from \$500 to \$400, beginning July 1, 1930, and the desire to place emphasis on (1) the construction of consolidated schools, (2) the development of high school opportunities, and (3) the stimulation of training in vocational subjects, where well trained teachers are to be employed.

On behalf of the Officers and Trustees of the Fund, please let us thank you and your staff for the fine co-operation given us in the past. We hope that you will feel free to offer any suggestions you may desire, looking to the betterment of the work in which we are all so vitally interested.

Dear Mr. Lewis: Mr. Smith and I have discussed at length the question of aiding you on the Baptist Association school, which is being considered for the Iberville Parish Training School.

Mr. Smith states that it is his understanding that Louisiana has a law forbidding the construction of two-story frame schoolhouses. Surely the Fund would not wish to cooperate on the purchase of a building which does not meet all the requirements of state law. Will it be possible for you to get a statement from your State Fire Marshall and the State Superintendent to the effect that the changes which you will make will meet all laws? After you have done this, I feel quite sure that you will be able to correct the arrangement of the windows and to provide for proper light in all of the classrooms. If these conditions can be met, Mr. Smith is of the opinion that the building can be aided on an eight-room basis, which would entitle you to \$3,000.
