
My dear Mr. Arthur:

I have two persons in mind whom it would be worthwhile for you to notice whenever you have funds for distributing further scholarships.

One is Doctor ~~Virginia Alexander~~ of Philadelphia. I enclose an article about her which you may have seen. She is one of the few physicians really gifted who is not in practice simply to make money, and who ought to study for the advancement of knowledge, especially in the line of helping Negroes. I think if your staff should inquire about her work in the Woman's Hospital in Philadelphia and the Pennsylvania Hospital, you would find out that she is an unusual person.

I have had in my office for a year Lula Faxon, who is a graduate of Hunter College. While I have been in Atlanta she has done a good deal of the auxiliary editorial work, collecting news and things of that sort. She wants to study and she ought to because she has a keen mind. She is still young and in the twenties but is worth watching.
