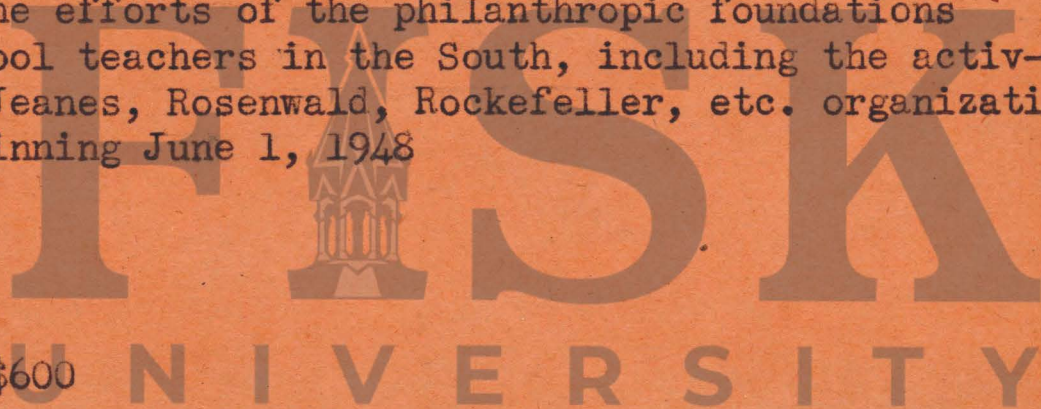

To determine the educational needs of teachers in the community-centered public school; 2. to evaluate the curricula of Arkansas teacher-training institutions in the light of these needs; 3. to prepare suggestions regarding possible changes necessary to provide prospective teachers and those already teaching with more nearly adequate training for fitting them into community situations.

Wishes to work for the Master's degree in Education at the University of North Carolina. Proposed study to cover twelve months of work beginning in September of 1942. Will not return to present position. Wishes instructorship of Education in teacher-training institution.
