RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS

Purpose of Fellowships. To afford professional training in the field of public fiscal management—the conduct of investigations and audits, preparation of analytical reports, and administration of budgetary units with particular emphasis on state and local governments. The course is designed for a career in which the non-political civic body rather than the governmental agency will be the client or employer. The demand for the services of graduates of the government management course is generally from the following sources: (1) civic associations requiring research facilities for the continuing appraisal of their local governments; (2) organizations professionally engaged in the survey of governmental agencies and the installation of improved accounting or administrative systems; (3) institutions of higher learning desiring trained faculty personnel for teaching and research in public administration.

Prerequisites. To be eligible for a fellowship the candidate must have at least a bachelor's degree from a fully accredited college. He must have completed a year's course in each of the following fields: political science, economics, and accounting; and at least an elementary course in statistics.* Applicants should be less than thirty-one years of age.

Stipend. The maximum fellowship stipend per twelve-month period is \$1,200 for single persons and \$1,800 for married men. The amount determined in each case will depend upon the age, qualifications and personal needs of the candidate. Additional allowances are made for transportation expense incurred in field work. Holders of fellowships pay the regular graduate tuition fee of \$75.00 per quarter, in each of the six quarters.

Applications must be filed not later than March 1, 1940. Application forms, together with a description of the fellowship training program, may be obtained from the Department of Government Management, School of Commerce, University of Denver, Denver, Colorado. Fellowship awards will be announced May 1, 1940. Ten fellowships were awarded for 1938 and 1939.

*In exceptional cases candidates with an otherwise outstanding record may be accepted with a temporary deficiency in one of these fields, provided that the required courses to eliminate the deficiency will have been completed prior to the fall quarter in 1940.
