It is proposed to conduct a field study of the culture of a group of isolated and inbred whites living in swamp land in Georgia, especially insofar as characteristic of a distinct and little known type of culture widespread in the South.

Field study to be conducted under supervision of Dr. W. Lloyd Warner, Mr. Robert Redfield. Duration of study one year to begin October, 1938.
