My dear Ross: Your letter of June 13th, received here on the 17th, brings me immediately to a final word with reference to your application for scholarship.

Shortly, I shall be confronted with the task of denying favorable consideration upon a number of similar applications upon my desk. Most of these applications were accepted in the hope that at the recent Trustee's meeting some new approaches to the needs of colored physicians in your position might be worked out. This did not prove to be the case, and instead an even more restricted program was drawn up. I have no alternative other than to state that the Julius Rosenwald Fund will not grant you a scholarship as applied for. I assure you that this is as disappointing to me as it is to you. There is no glory in being the medium of such an unsatisfactory reply.
