Additional information: *Mr. Reynolds: I have been intending to write to you ever since the first of June. On the 7th of that month, however, I started teaching fifteen hours per week at the Ole Miss summer school. Then I went through the ordeal of getting a regular job and all the preparations for getting married on the 9th of last month. I have 15 hours work here and am enjoying it very much.*

I haven't yet published anything, but have been working on an article which will be a condensation of my work. The work done under your grant consists of 350 pages of double space typing plus twenty-odd tables. I fear that I shall not find much time during this school year to put finishing touches on it. I wish, however, to get it into print just as soon as is humanly possible. I should add that my manuscript deals only with slavery; some work was done on Slavery, but it was not possible in the time I had to complete the latter study and incorporate it with the other.
