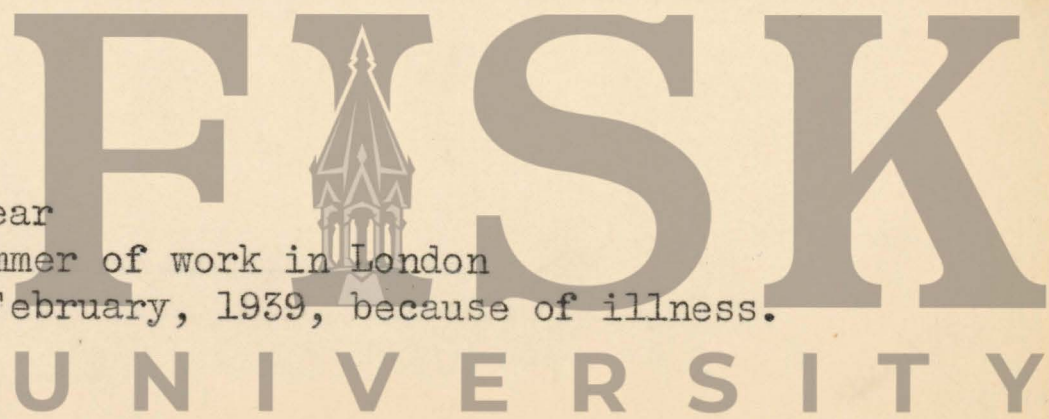

CAREER SINCE TENURE OF FELLOWSHIP

Will be on half-time from January to July, 1940, in order to complete her thesis. 10/19/39

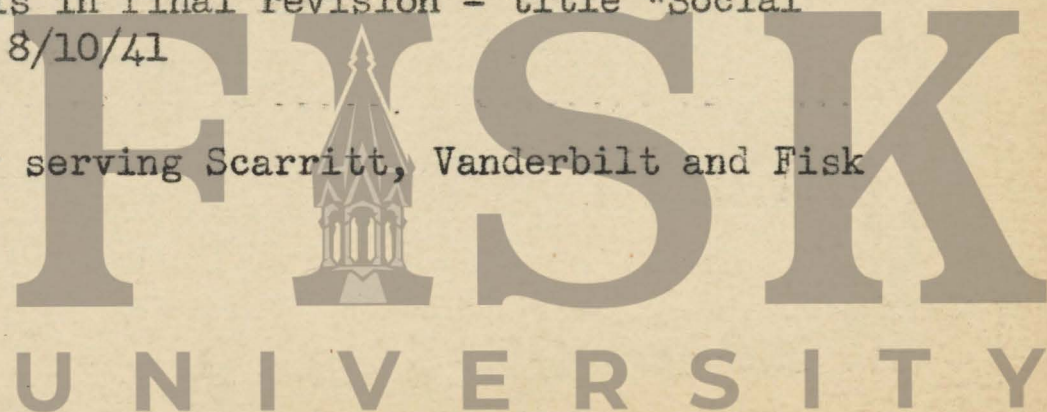

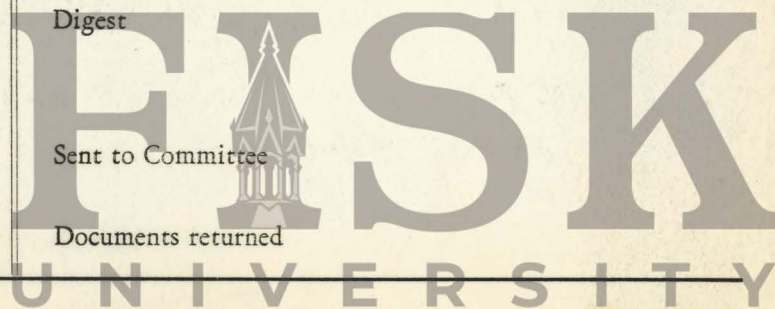

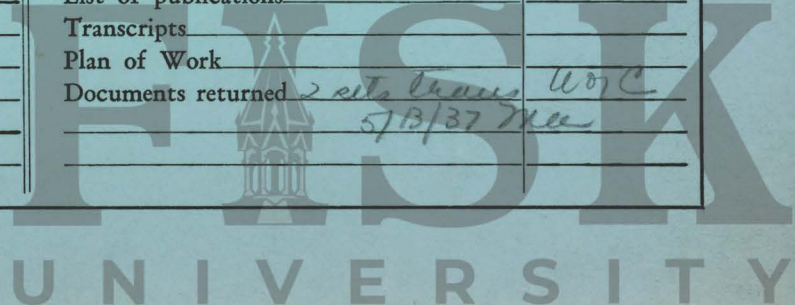
