Dear Mr. McCrorey:

The Julius Rosenwald Fund is instituting programs of fellowships for (a) Negroes and (b) white Southerners who intend to make their careers in the South. The enclosed statement outlines the scope of these fellowships.

We hope you will be willing to cooperate in making these fellowships of the greatest possible service in the development of rare individuals under these two categories. We are eager that the fellowship programs become widely known in southern universities and among Southerners in various fields of public influence. While we realize that applications are likely to pour in upon us far beyond the grants available, we do not wish to overlook any individual who may be of exceptional promise.

Will you be good enough to post the enclosed notice and otherwise call it to general attention? In addition you can be very helpful if from time to time you refer to us individuals who may seem especially qualified for these fellowships.

Application forms are enclosed and additional forms will be supplied on request. It is important to keep in mind that, in order to be considered for the coming year, applications must be in hand as early as possible and in any case not later than February 28, 1937. Mr. Raymond Paty, formerly Dean of Men of Emory University, has been appointed Director for Fellowships. Detailed correspondence concerning candidates or other aspects of the fellowship program will be in his hands.

We shall appreciate the cooperation of you and your associates in an undertaking which we hope may be of service to the South and to the nation.
