Dear Dr. Jackson: Some time ago we carried on considerable correspondence with you, and Dr. Oppenheimer of Emory has again opened your case with Mr. Paty, our Director for Fellowships. It is practically impossible to secure a scholarship here merely for the training of a private practitioner.

Recently, I have heard some rumors that there may be an opening with the Georgia State Department of Health in the field of public health. I have no idea what this job would pay, but it may be that you would like to take a chance at it. It would require a year's training in public health and would then be a salaried job following that. I have no idea of what the State Health Department of Georgia would be willing to pay. I should think it would be somewhere around \$2500 or \$3000 and travel expenses. If you are interested, let me know.
