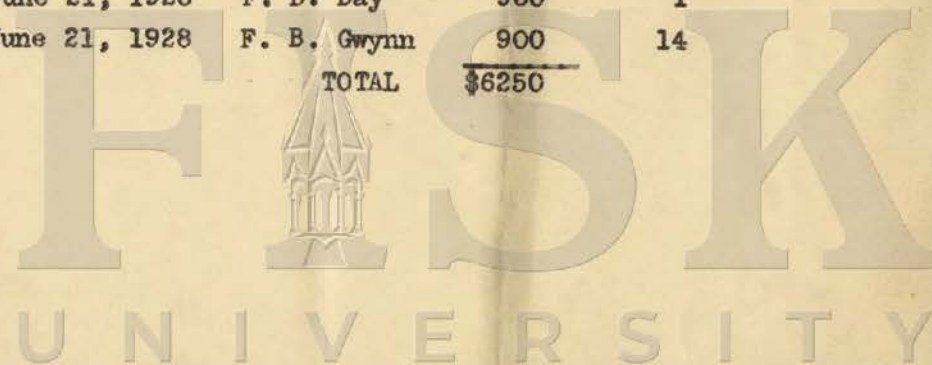

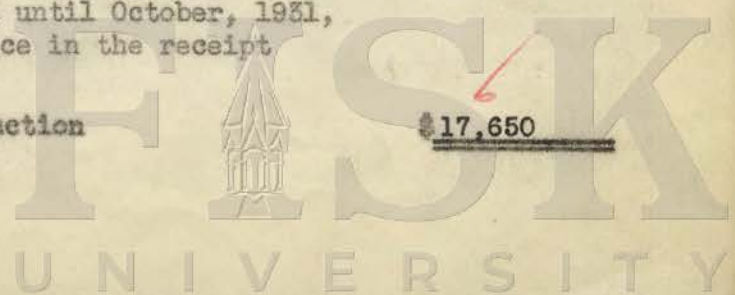

I should like to add that the four in which there were no exercises have only a very few Rosenwald schools.
