REPORT OF WORK DONE ON FELLOWSHIP GRANTED JUNE 1st

1930.

Dr. Slaymaker 's clinic : Rush Medical College ;Apr. 1, 1930 to June, 16, 1930, Mondays and Thursdays 9 to 12.

Type of work done in this clinic was actual class room work including lectures on the etiology, diagnosis, and treatment of the various diseases of the heart; examination of the patient; and the technique of electro cardiography.

Michael Reese Hospital : Dr. Hamburger and Associates; Work done here was actual clinical work in the Mandel Clinic. The department of cardiology is divided into various groups of heart diseases such as, hypertension, auricular fibrillation, angina, pectoris, etc. Each one of these branches is supervised by one of the men. My work was divided among these various groups and included examination of the patient, diagnosis, and any instruction which I requested. The clinic met here Wednesday 9 to 12 , adults heart diseases; Sat. 9 to 12 children diseases.

Intensive course in heart diseases at the Michael Reese Hospital from June 16 to July 5, 1930 outline of which course is on record in your files.

At the completion of this intensive course I pursued the following work; Wednes and Saturday Michael Reese Hospital 9 to 12 Tuesday 9 to 1, Heart Clinic at the research hospital with Dr. Max Boletín. Mondays and Thursday 10 to 12;30 at the Central Free Dispensary 's department of electro cardiography with Dr. C. J. Lundy; Friday 9 to 1 in charge of heart clinic at the Provident Hospital.

The above mentioned schedule was continued to Oct. 1, 1930 at which time on Tuesday and Friday mornings from 9 to 11, I was a member of Dr. Herrick's clinic at Rush Medical College. This course lasting until Dec. 20, 1930, was an intensive study of the various heart diseases including diagnosis, etiology, differential diagnosis, electro cardiographic findings and treatment, with presentation of cases of each type of disease discussed.

The above mentioned course was in addition to the regular course taken .

From Jan. 1, 1931, up to the present time, I have been pursuing courses as described above, at the Michael Reese Hospital , Research Hospital, Central Free Dispensary, and Provident Hospital.

At the Research Hospital, I have been engaged with Dr. Bolotin in an exhaustive study of five hundred cases of Hypertension as to etiology, course and effects of various drugs upon.

I am enclosing an announcement of staff meeting of Provident Hospital as of March 18, 1931, at which I presented a case of auricular fibrillation which was diagnosed and treated in my clinic.

This years work has given me a far greater knowledge of diseases of the heart, and has given me an excellent foundation upon which to further broaden my knowledge in the field of cardiology.
