PROFESSIONAL CAREER SINCE TENURE OF FELLOWSHIP

On his return from abroad, Mr. Hubert resumed his work at Fisk University. He also serves as collaborator with the Farm Security Administration, in which post he has found useful the materials and experiences gained abroad. The materials accumulated in the Danish study and the general setting of European economic history are useful as a basis for a new course in economic history at Fisk, "Evolution of World Markets." Spring of 1939 report.

10/25/39 Since June of 1939 Mr. Hubert has been on leave from Fisk serving as agricultural economist in the Farm Security Administration. He will return to Fisk in February of 1940, but will continue as consultant to the Farm Security Administration. At the suggestion of Dr. Johnson, Dr. Park, and others, he has stopped work on his study of the development of peasant proprietorship in Denmark in favor of a statement showing the position of the Negro farmer in the changing economic situation. His present post enables him to study this problem at first hand.

9/25/40 Mr. Hubert is now assistant to the director, Rural Rehabilitation Division, Farm Security Administration, Washington.

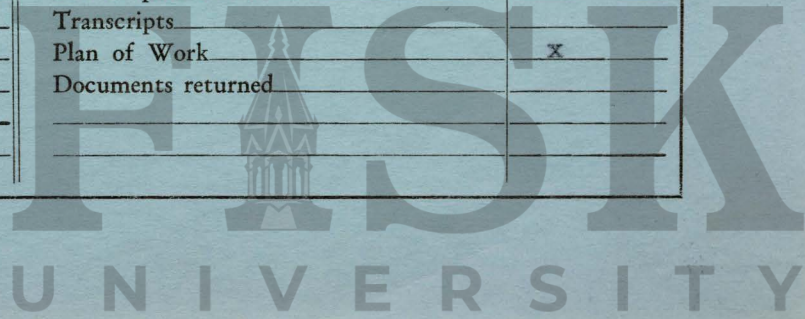

Moe: Questionable whether he should go to Denmark.

CSJ. This has been his desire for a five year period.

ERE thinks Hubert will be one of the important people in agricultural economics.

Moe would be delighted to vote for a grant to be put on ice until such time as he has done all the reading he can do in this country and has got into the language.

CSJ He is up on the literature and has done a lot on the language.

Moe Can he go until June and stay until February?

CSJ Our needs at Fisk do not have to be taken into consideration. We have loaned him to the Resettlement for a year. I think he had in mind doing some work in America, but this was not too closely related to the main work because it was work in the South which he can do when he gets back. He hoped to be away from Fisk for a year.

Finally decided to set up \$3000 for this grant, telling Hubert it was granted for one year at \$2400, with a chance to review it and extend for six months for an additional \$600.
