Dear Mr. Haygood:

Your letter of June 13 to Mr. Geist has been referred to me for answer, since the supervision of Allis-Chalmers graduate fellowships is within the jurisdiction of the Industrial Relations Division.

In the past year Allis-Chalmers has instituted one graduate fellowship at the Illinois Institute of Technology, in the amount of \$3000. This fellowship was financed under a development authorization. The entire amount is paid to the Illinois Institute of Technology, who in turn dispenses \$1800 to the student, \$600 for fees, and the remaining \$600 to the school for supplies in its power systems engineering unit. The program was developed primarily for training an expert in the use of the network calculating board, and a graduate of a recognized college of engineering was selected for the fellowship.

It is hoped that that will be the first of a series of fellowships granted by the Company in various schools for various qualified engineers of the Company for training in special projects.

The Company has made grants for research to other educational and research foundations, but none of these are specifically scholarships and therefore you would probably not care to include them in your directory. If, however, there is other information that you would need, please let us know and we shall supply it.

Your letter to Mr. McCormick in regard to the activities of this organization concerning awarding of scholarships and prizes has been referred to this department.

For the past 25 years we have been active with 4-H Clubs along this line and, now, since the Future Farmers of America National Foundation has been organized, we have contributed \$30,000 to be used for prizes, scholarships, etc., as they see fit.

Last year and again this year we are the donors for the 4-H Club Field Crops Contest and Frozen Foods Contest. In the Field Crops Contest the county winner receives a gold plated sterling silver medal of honor. The state winner an educational trip to the National 4-H Club Congress, which is held here in Chicago. The national winners are selected from the state winners and are four in number, one from each extension section, and each receives a \$200 Fowler McCormick Educational Scholarship.

The Frozen Foods Contest is somewhat similar, that is, the county winner a gold filled medal of honor; state winner, \$50 U.S. saving bond; and for each of the four national winners a trip to the National 4-H Club Congress.

Some of our previous contests and awards for 4-H are as follows:

- 1931 - \$50,000 in scholarships awarded (100 scholarships of \$500 each). This was the first organized Company-sponsored plan handled through 4-H headquarters.
- 1934 - Farm Accounting Contest.

- 1941 - National Farm, Home and Crops Enterprise Accounting Contest.


The Company awarded trips to the National 4-H Club Congress to sectional winners and twelve \$200 scholarships to national winners. Medals were given to county winners.

- 1942 - National 4-H Victory Achievement Contest. War bonds and  
1943 were awarded to 3 girls and 3 boys. Awards were based on all-around contribution to the war effort.

- 1944 - 4-H Food for Victory Contest. One trip was awarded to the National 4-H Club Congress and 6 war bonds were presented to 6 other winners--3 girls and 3 boys.
