Dear Mr. Smith:

Mr. Mc Cuiston and I have talked about the problem facing us regarding your reducing the contribution toward the salary of our Rosenwald building agent for 1928-29. We hope you will be able to re-consider this matter for two reasons: (1) the budget for the department was fixed and itemized by the recent legislature and we have no funds available for taking care of his salary. We will not have an opportunity to ask the legislature for funds to care for additional work before July 1, 1929, (2) Prof. Childress is the only Negro representative in the State Department of Education. He has served as the connecting link between the department and the Negro schools of the state for the past seven years during which time he has promoted and been largely responsible for the building of approximately 250 Rosenwald schools. He has the entire confidence of the department, school officials and Negro teachers of the state and the interest of Negro education in the state would be considerably handicapped through his loss at this time.

Dear Supt. Womack:

At the time we announced the appropriation of half the salary of your Rosenwald Building Agent last Spring it was stated that the Fund expected to cut this amount in half for the year 1928-29. The Number of one-teacher schools is the maximum on which the Fund will give aid the next budget year, and the number of two-teacher schools cannot be exceeded without special authorization by the officers of the Fund. In keeping with modern trends of education the Fund desires to concentrate more and more in the larger consolidated schools.

In order to stimulate the construction of more permanent buildings the Fund has increased its allotment \$50.00 per classroom for brick veneer, solid brick, or satisfactory concrete construction, as shown above in the last column, the maximum for a ten-teacher or larger being \$2,600. We now have a complete set of plans worked out in detail for brick veneer construction from a three-teacher to a ten-teacher type, which will be furnished the State Department as needed.

For the present budget year the Fund is giving aid on two types of shops - a one-room (\$200) and a two-room (\$400). Because of urgent demands from some of the states it was thought best to increase this aid for 1928-29 to \$600. for a three-room shop to include facilities for

home economics in the larger vocational schools. Plans for a three-room shop have been worked out in tentative form and will be adjusted to suit the needs of the schools to be served.

As the average term of the schools on which the Fund is giving aid the present year is more than six months, it has been decided to increase the minimum requirement for next year from five months to six months.

Please let me take this opportunity in behalf of the officers and Trustees of the Fund to thank you and your staff for your hearty cooperation and to assure you of our interest in every phase of progress in the education system of your State. When we can serve you, command us.

I have discussed with Mr. Irby the probable effect of the withdrawal of aid to Arkansas for the Rosenwald Building Agent. We earnestly hope that the Rosenwald Fund will continue the aid to Arkansas.

R. C. Childress, Rosenwald Building Agent for Arkansas, has served the state faithfully and well for nearly eleven years. He is 65 years old and has been in this particular work too long for him to attempt to find other work that will enable him to live comfortably. His limited savings are in the form of real estate and are liabilities now and will continue to be for some time to come.

It is unwise, perhaps impossible, to place Professor Childress on the state pay roll. We are reducing the pay roll, instead of increasing it, to meet an insistent demand from the people.

Under the present administration of the A. M. & N. College, Pine Bluff, I do not believe that we can find a place there for him. President Watson is not particularly friendly to Professor Childress.

Although we are unable to place Professor Childress on the Department pay roll, it seems almost necessary that he remain. He provides a means of contact that cannot be provided in any other way. Also, we are beginning a "repair" program in Rosenwald schools to extend over several years. His services in this program will be essential.

We are not unappreciative of the invaluable services rendered the State by the Rosenwald Fund and we appreciate the state of the market which makes retrenchment necessary. However, we hope that because of his long continued service in the cause of negro education, because of our inability to place him on the Department pay roll, and because of the need for his future services, your officers will consent to continue the annual appropriation which will keep him employed.
