Dear Miss Reitzes:

Your letter of January 20th at hand and may I say that I have been away during the past week, which is the reason you have not had a reply from me sooner.

In connection with the auditions for the fellowship candidates, I would say that I shall be very glad to cooperate with you again this year, which I understand you to say is the final year. I am wondering if it would be possible to hold these auditions this year on a Sunday. I would suggest that, if possible, we hold the Chicago auditions on March 7th and the New York auditions on March 21st. I can more easily arrange my work to hear these auditions on Sundays than on a Saturday and if it is not out of the range of possibilities, I would prefer it this way.

I can easily arrange the New York auditions at the Julliard School as we did during the past two years and if I am not mistaken, it would seem quite likely that the candidates might easily prefer coming to Chicago too on a Sunday. If this is satisfactory, please confirm by letter and I will go ahead with arrangements according to this plan.


