To make a sociological analysis of four Negro elementary school districts in St. Louis; such analysis being based upon eight sociological indices. The statistical unit for consideration will be the tract in order that census data may be used. After ranking tracts and districts, an intensive study will be made of the Negro elementary schools in these districts to ascertain the extent to which they are aware of and responding to areal needs in training boys and girls.
