

Dear Mr. Levin:

ing a total of \$1,649.83 disbursed for the shop supervisor out of the \$2000 aid sent from your office, leaving an unused balance as of June 30, 1931 of \$356.45, which includes a \$6.28 balance on July 1, 1930. We do not have the total expenditures for the salary and expenses of this supervisor. The state departments of education file monthly reports of the other shop supervisors, showing the amount spent for salary and expenses during the month, and we make payments monthly to them.

In the final report for 1930-31 made to us by Louisiana they show a balance on hand of \$530.63, of which amount \$356.45 is a balance on the shop supervisor fund and \$174.18 an unused balance on the expenses of the traveling librarian. In keeping with our policy we would like to have them refund the \$174.18 to close out the account. Shall we have them return the balance for the shop supervisor. or will you take that up direct with them? We shall postpone making request for the refund until hearing from you.

The balance of \$356.45 left in the account of Rosenwald Vocational Shop Supervisor is the balance that we had on June 30. When this project was started two or three years ago, the employment of a shop supervisor began on September 1. His twelve months' employment, therefore, ends on August 31, and we considered that the annual appropriation for maintaining this project dated from September 1 and expired on August 31. On July 3 we issued a check against this balance for \$141.66, the salary for the Shop Supervisor for the month of June, reducing the balance to \$214.79. Please advise me.



Dear Miss Elvidge: State Superintendent T. H. Harris of Louisiana, at our request, has revised the commitment for the vocational (shop) supervisor in his state for next year, reducing the salary from \$1,900 to \$1,620 a saving of \$280 - and the item for replacement and repairs from \$600 to \$100 -- a saving of \$500. The traveling expense allowance is to remain at \$600. He states that the total amount for salary, equipment. and expenses will be \$2,320, and that the Fund's portion for next year will be \$748.39, the state paying \$1,571.61. As this item is set up on your books instead of ours, I suggest that you make the adjustments for the fourth year.
