You may remember that in 1937 I applied for a scholarship for further study in my chosen field, Proctology. The application was refused.

I have since returned from European study and am operating rectal clinics at the Mercy and Douglass Hospitals of this city with considerable success.

At Houston during the N.M.A. convention I shall speak on rectal strictures and shall demonstrate a new instrument to use on these stricture cases.
