Dear Mr. Stern: The ten schoolhouses of seven-teacher type or larger, completed between January 1 and June 30, 1930, are listed on the attached sheet, giving cost, Fund's aid and per cent of cost.

Mr. Credle has made two visits to Sylvania, Georgia. The last time he was there he took pictures of the completed building. He considers it up to standard in every way, even equal to some of the best constructed buildings in North Carolina.

There has been a considerable depression in some sections of the South concerning excessive unemployment which has greatly reduced the cost of labor and materials in some sections, making the cost of buildings temporarily 10% to 25% less than that of six months ago. A few places are taking advantage of this unusual situation which we hope will not last long. I do not think we should penalize them for this, so long as they build the schools strictly according to plans and specifications. The type of building constructed at Sylvania usually costs \$25,000, and I am sure you will be pleased with it when you see the picture.

At the meeting in Atlantic City it was finally decided that we should make no county-wide requirements in giving aid on a specific school of seven-teacher type or larger but that we should make a brief study of the community which the school is to serve to see that it meets reasonable conditions in keeping with the regulations of the Fund for schools of this type. It was also agreed that this brief report should be written up on regular forms and that we should have another form calling for some county-wide information which might have some bearing on our decision in giving aid on this particular school, but which would serve in the main to focus our thinking on the whole problem of giving aid on a county-wide basis in future years. It was understood that every application of this type would be gone over

by this office carefully and if it seemed to meet with approval, would be sent to your office for your information and approval.

Mr. Credle and Mr. McCuistion went to Chicago about the last of August and had a conference with Mr. Embree concerning a number of schools for which applications had been filed. Mr. Embree marked approval on the tabulated sheet which Mr. Credle carried along, but as some of these needed further information he wrote the following statement at the top of the page: "I approve grant not exceeding \$100,000 for projects on this list as approved by Nashville office with such reservations as are indicated on specific items." So far I think Mr. Credle and I have approved applications totalling about \$75,000.

There was one item on the list, Montgomery County, Alabama, which was approved, that we found unnecessary to include for aid after I made a visit and talked it over with the officials so we saved \$6,000 there and saved our reputation as well.

Dear Mr. Harrell: We have figured out the average cost of the various types of buildings over a three-year period - from July 1, 1926 to July 1, 1929 - and have placed in the fourth column approximately 15% of the average cost of each teacher type for this period. In the last two columns we show what the type allotment should be under the new ruling for wood and permanent. The officers may make any adjustments they think proper in these allotments. I think they are about in keeping with our agreement in the conference last Thursday.

We are also placing on the bottom of the page the type allotments, etc., for the vocational buildings as agreed upon in the Chicago conference.
