

Miss Reddick holds a professional four-year certificate and receives \$57.50 per month for seven months or a total of \$402.50. Miss Johnson holds a life professional two-year certificate and receives \$50.00 per month for seven months or a total of \$350.00. The county does not supplement these salaries.

The amounts paid by the Rosenwald people are arranged to provide that each teacher will receive a total of \$85.00 per month for nine months.

Dear Lester: On August 19, 1937, you wrote me that you expected the Red Oak School to operate for nine months, and that the state would pay the regular state scale of salary for seven months. We agreed to take care of the total salary for the additional two months in order to secure a nine-months term.

On September 15 I had a letter from Miss Reddick saying that the school started there on that date. Because of the fact that the state payments were made at varying dates and because our payments have apparently been falling at the end of the month, it is a little difficult for us to determine whether or not the school operated the full nine months. Miss Elvidge, our Comptroller, tells me that she has received a statement from the Red Oak School saying that it has already closed. Our records indicate that this is only eight and one-half months. Will you be so kind as to check this and let us know whether or not we are still owing Miss Johnson and Miss Reddick a half month's salary or whether the last payment Miss Elvidge sent them fulfills our obligation in the matter?
