Dear Dr. Perry: Your letter has arrived in Dr. Bousfield's absence from the city. It will be brought to his attention when he returns to the office, and I know he will be pleased to have heard from you.

We are completely out of the report you request on venereal disease control made by the Fund in Tennessee. You may, however, be able to find a copy in a library under the title of "Syphilis in the Rural Negro Population in Tennessee," by James A. Crabtree and E. L. Bishop, reprinted from the American Journal of Public Health, Vol. XXII, No. 2, February, 1932.

In the meantime, I am sending you, under separate cover, some material which may be of interest to you, among which you will find a book entitled, "Shadow of the Plantation." If you have not already read this book, I think you will find it of particular interest since it is the result of a venereal disease control survey of Macon County, Alabama, which was made by Dr. Charles S.
