Conditions in wartime France, relative to study, became intolerable, and finally, with much regret, Mrs. Franklin and I have been forced back to America. Thus is ended the year that the Rosenwald Fund arranged for me. I feel the greatest disappointment and also a certain amount of bitterness; but naturally nothing that has happened to me compares with the war itself for those who must live in it.

Meanwhile we have settled in New York, where I can do some work on John Taylor (of Virginia), who, along with Edward Livingston(of New York and Louisiana), is a genius unknown in America because he is an American.

I have a letter from Mr. Reynolds, asking me to suggest candidates for fellowships. Last year at Dillard was a young Harvard historian who struck me as very able, I should think he could ^{do} excellent work on the reconstruction period. Unfortunately his name has escaped me for the moment.
