Dear Dr. Alexander: I wish to acknowledge your letter of June 22nd and to state that there is probably less likelihood of the Julius Rosenwald Fund being in a position to assist you than there appeared to be before the last meeting of the Board of Trustees. I had hoped that that meeting would result in a more liberal program. As a matter of fact, just the opposite is true, and we find ourselves much more restricted than we have been in the past. I shall shortly be forced to make formal refusals on a great number of applications which are on file here.

I had an opportunity to talk with Sadie on our recent trip to Texas about your situation. I would not count on the Fund unless you definitely secure the promise of a public health appointment which you agree to accept as a whole-time position. Our funds are entirely too limited to permit allocations under any other circumstances.
