AMENDMENT

G

Modify property tax exemption for disabled veterans

Colorado should extend its Homestead exemption to veterans, injured in the line of duty, who have been federally qualified as TDIU (or classified as having a service-related disability that has rendered them unemployable). **VOTE YES**

PROPOSITION

JJ

Retain additional sports betting tax revenue

Proposition JJ proposes allowing the state to keep sports betting tax revenue above \$29 million per year. **NEUTRAL**

AMENDMENT

H

Judicial discipline procedures and confidentiality

Referred by the state legislature, Amendment H creates an Independent Judicial Discipline Adjudicative Board, separate from the Colorado Supreme Court. **NEUTRAL**

PROPOSITION

KK

Firearms and ammunition excise tax

Proposition KK provides mental healthcare for veterans, youth, and victims of domestic violence and other violent crimes with a tax on firearms, firearm parts, and ammunition. **VOTE YES**

AMENDMENT

I

Constitutional bail exemption first degree murder

Amendment I would make first degree murder an "unbailable" offense unless the proof "is evident or the presumption is great." **VOTE YES**

PROPOSITION

127

Prohibit bobcat, lynx, and mountain lion hunting

Proposition 127 would prohibit killing, wounding, pursuing, entrapping, or discharging a deadly weapon at bobcats, lynx, and mountain lions in Colorado. **NEUTRAL**

AMENDMENT

J

Repealing the definition of marriage in the constitution

Marriage is a basic right, and Colorado's Constitution should reflect this right for all state residents. **VOTE YES**

PROPOSITION

128

Concerning eligibility for parole

Proposition 128 is a "scare tactic" initiative aimed to increase state spending on prisons, jeopardize safety for wardens and inmates, and disincentivize educational and mental health programs for inmates. **VOTE NO**

AMENDMENT

K

Modify constitutional election deadlines

Under Amendment K, the Colorado Secretary of State and county clerks would have more time to finalize ballots ahead of printing. **VOTE YES**

PROPOSITION

129

Establish qualifications and registration for veterinary professional associate

Proposition 129 would create a mid-level position called a Veterinary Professional Associate, or VPA. **NEUTRAL**

AMENDMENT

79

Constitutional right to an abortion

Abortion is health care, and Amendment 79 protects the right to abortion care in Colorado's constitution. **VOTE YES**

PROPOSITION

130

Funding for law enforcement

Proposition 130 falsely claims to fund first responders, but restricts the funds to local law enforcement only - not fire fighters, EMTs, or mental health professionals. **VOTE NO**

AMENDMENT

80

School vouchers in K-12 education

Amendment 80 is designed to weaken and divert funds from public education, and pave the way for taxpayer funded, private school voucher programs. **VOTE NO**

PROPOSITION

131

Establishing an all-candidate primary and ranked choice voting

Proposition 131 would make elections in Colorado more expensive to administrate, do away with Colorado's post-election audit and is designed to confuse voters and decrease participation. **VOTE NO**
