

Procedures for Student Quarantines

In visiting with members of our medical professional advisory committee, it was shared that the possibility of our students being exposed to COVID-19 or testing positive for COVID-19 is more likely this year. While we can not require the vaccination, it was encouraged that all adults be vaccinated to protect our faculty and staff as well as to limit the exposure on campus. Therefore, when indoors, we must ensure that everyone properly wears masks and it is especially important during large gatherings like chapel.

When a student has tested positive for COVID-19 and/or has been required to quarantine at home, the following will occur: Once the school nurse has verified the student needs to quarantine:

- Students will check RenWeb and Google Classroom to get assignments.
 - If assignments are not posted in RenWeb or Google Classroom then the teacher must send assignments (via email) the first full day the student is absent.
 - If assignments/supplies need to be picked up by a parent, then they should be prepared and ready for pickup by the end of the first full day the student is absent.
 - When communicating with parents, faculty should confirm that the parent is able to pick up assignments and the student is able to complete assignments. If the parent or student has been diagnosed with COVID, then neither may be able to adhere to our expectations.
- Students will complete school work asynchronously.
 - Faculty will continue to teach in-person (unless the entire class is required to quarantine.)
 - Faculty will not teach in-person and on-line simultaneously.
- All faculty should designate a specific time each day to connect with students who are in quarantine. This time should be consistent for specific days, but may vary depending on the day. For example, faculty may be available each Monday at 2:15 p.m., but unavailable on Thursdays at 3:30 p.m.
- Faculty and students will connect at least *once* each day while the student is out for quarantine to review tasks and support student learning.
- The teacher and student will agree upon the due dates of assignments as well as time to reschedule any assignments/assessments/projects due during quarantine.
- Students will receive full credit for all assignments while out for quarantine.

If the school deems it necessary to quarantine an entire grade level, there will be synchronous virtual/distance learning. Early childhood and elementary teachers will create the schedule for virtual instruction. Students will login to Google Meets at the appropriate times for instruction. Middle school teachers will follow the teaching schedule for middle school. Middle school students will utilize Google Classroom and login to Google Meets.

This is only the case for students who are required to quarantine. This is not a practice we will employ for students who are absent for any other reason (i.e. non-COVID-19 illnesses, travel, vacations, etc.).
