SATURDAY AT HAMELINE FIELD

The Bulldogs have started 0-4 for the first time in school history and will head to Staten Island, N.Y., for a showdown with Wagner, a team they have gone 3-1 against all-time.

LAST TIME OUT

For 50 minutes, it appeared the Bulldogs would remain unbeaten on Homecoming under head coach **Marty Fine**. A fumble on the three-yard line with 10:44 remaining, however, turned the game on its head. Leading 21-17 at the time, the Bulldogs watched as the Dukes rattled off 18-straight points over the final 10 minutes to post a 35-21 win.

Jordan Brown's eight-yard touchdown run got the Bulldogs on the board first and **Jordan Harris's** 20-yard touchdown reception tied the game at 14-14 with just 40 seconds left in the first half. Harris's second touchdown reception of the game with 2:18 left in the third quarter gave Bryant their final lead.

Both Brown and Harris set program records as Brown became the school's all-time leading rusher and Harris became the school's all-time leading receiver. **Mike Westerhaus** threw for a career-high 276 yards and two touchdowns and freshman **Chuckie Wingate** led the Black and Gold with 12 tackles.

LAST YEAR IN SMITHFIELD

In a game that featured eight lead changes, the final one was the most important as the Bulldogs held on for a 30-28 victory over Wagner on Homecoming and Reunion Weekend last season. Neither team led by more than four points throughout the game with Jordan Brown's two-yard touchdown run at the beginning of the fourth quarter putting the Black and Gold on top for good, 30-28.

Brown added a three-yard plunge in the second quarter and Mike Croce threw for 245 yards and two touchdowns. His 65-yard touchdown pass to Jordan Harris put the Bulldogs up momentarily, 24-21, midway through the third quarter. Bryant closed out the victory by limiting Wagner to just 25 yards of offense in four fourth quarter possessions.

SCOUTING THE SEAHAWKS

Coming off a decisive victory over Central Connecticut on National TV last weekend, the Seahawks return home with a great deal of momentum. Wagner picked up its first win, 31-13, over the Blue Devils after starting the season with three consecutive losses. Two of the losses came by less than five points as they fell to Florida Atlantic, 7-3, and Georgetown, 13-10.

Wagner is led by a pair of veteran offensive players in running back Dominique Williams and quarterback Nick Doscher. A former Minor League player in the Kansas City Royals organization, Doscher rushed for 65 yards and threw for another 112 in the win over Central. Williams picked up 121 yards and two touchdowns on 21 carries. Pat O'Connor and CO Prime are Wagner's top two defensive players.

BULLDOG QUICK HITS

— Bryant is 0-4 for the first time in school history. The Bulldogs had started 0-3 on just one other occasion in since the program began in 1999.

— It is just the third time the Bulldogs have lost four-straight games in a season. Bryant lost five in a row during the 2009 season.

— The Bulldogs are also 0-3 at home this season, marking the first time since 2004 that they have lost three games at Bulldog Stadium.

— Bryant started five underclassmen on defense against Duquesne. Freshman defensive back Chuckie Wingate made his first-career start.

INTERVIEW POLICIES

Postgame Interviews: Bryant University locker rooms are closed to all media. A 10-minute cooling off period will be strictly enforced, after which the Bryant head coach and requested players will be made available to the media. Postgame interviews will be conducted outside each team's respective locker room. Requests for visiting coaches and players should be made through the opponent's sports information contact.

Player/Coach Interview Policy: Interviews other than those immediately following a contest must be requested and arranged through a member of the Bryant University athletic communications staff. Interviews will be arranged by the athletic communication staff at a time that will not interfere with the student-athlete's academic schedule. Requests should be made at least one day in advance to allow proper notification to the player or coach. At no time will the home or cell phone number of a coach or player be released to the media. In the case of telephone interview requests, arrangements will be made for the student-athlete to contact the requesting media member.

MEDIA POLICIES

Working Press Credentials: Press and photographer media credentials will be issued to members of the working media only. Credentials for all Bryant home games can be obtained by contacting the Athletic Communications Office in writing or by telephone. Credentials will be left at will call. Press pass requests should be made no later than 24 hours prior to a home contest to ensure space availability.

Press Box: Only credentialed members of the media, coaches, league officials and designated administrators will be allowed in the press box area. The Bryant Athletic Communications Office will provide a game program, current press release, pregame statistics and game notes prior to each contest. A full boxscore, play-by-play, drive chart and other applicable game material will be distributed at halftime and at the end of the game.

Media Work Room: Ample work space with power outlets, telephones and internet access will be available for media members who need to file postgame reports. For men's and women's basketball contests, the Bulldog Room, located on the second floor of the Chace Athletic Center, will serve as a media workroom and postgame interview location.

Radio: Radio stations planning to broadcast Bryant home contests must make arrangements with the Athletic Communications Office at least two weeks prior to the requested game. Telephone lines will be supplied by the university, provided the requested notice is given. All calls must be made either on a collect or calling card basis.

Did You Know?

Bryant's first ever win over a Division I program came against Wagner in 2008. The Bulldogs defeated the Seahawks on the road, 24-14, on Sept. 27, 2008.

- Undefeated last season when leading after the third quarter, the Bulldogs fell to 0-1 in that situation this year.
- Bryant eclipsed the 400 total yards of offense mark on Saturday against the Dukes, compiling 405 yards.
- Over the last three games, the Bulldogs have turned the ball over 10 times. They fumbled twice and threw two interceptions against Duquesne.

BROWN BECOMES ALL-TIME LEADING RUSHER

A formality heading into the season, Jordan Brown cemented himself as Bryant's all-time rushing leader on Saturday against Duquesne. The senior from Glastonbury, Conn., carried the ball 28 times for 105 yards and a touchdown, giving him 3,598 career rushing yards. After carrying the ball five times for 23 yards and a touchdown on the first drive of the game, Brown passed Andre McLeod with a seven-yard run on first down at the 6:12 mark of the first quarter. Brown's eight-yard touchdown run was his 36th-career score, tying him with Lorenzo Perry for the program record in that category.

HARRIS BREAKS RECEIVING RECORD

After missing week three against Maine, junior wide receiver Jordan Harris returned against Duquesne and became Bryant's all-time receiving leader. The Lincoln University, Pa., native broke the previous record of 1,650 held by Justin Kix with a diving touchdown grab with 40 seconds left in the first half. The touchdown grab tied the game at 14-14. Harris finished with 136 receiving yards and now has 1,711 in his career.

HARRIS FILLING UP RECORD BOOK

Jordan Harris not only became Bryant's all-time receiving leader on Saturday vs. Duquesne, he continued to put his name all over Bryant's record book. He caught seven passes for 136 yards and two scores against the Dukes, giving him his first 100-yard game of the season. The seven catches are fifth all-time in a single game and the 136 yards are the second-most in a single game. Harris set the single-game record last season with a 224-yard performance against Albany and now holds four of the top six receiving games in school history. His two touchdown receptions give him 14 in his career, tying him with Justin Kix for second all-time.

WINGATE SHINES IN FIRST START

With Michael Johnson scratched late last week, freshman Chuckie Wingate made his first start at cornerback for the Black and Gold against the Dukes. With Duquesne trying to exploit him, Wingate played extremely well, leading the Bulldogs with 12 tackles, 10 of the solo variety. The Bergen Catholic product has made 19 tackles in four games this season and is the second freshman to lead the Bulldogs in tackles this season (Aaron Dixon - Week 3).

WESTERHAUS HAS CAREER DAY

Junior quarterback Mike Westerhaus threw for a career-high 276 yards and two touchdowns in a losing effort against Duquesne last Saturday. Westerhaus completed 17-of-36 passes and did throw two interceptions. The passing yardage is the sixth-highest in a single game in school history and the 36 attempts are also sixth all-time. Westerhaus has thrown for 700 yards and four touchdowns this season.

FOWLER SHOWING BIG-PLAY POTENTIAL

A week after hauling in his first-career catch, sophomore **Kelvin Fowler** continued to show that he is ready to be one of Bryant's top receivers. Fowler's catch last week was for 29 yards and he followed it with receptions of 33 and 30 against Duquesne. In the first quarter, Fowler grabbed a Westerhaus pass along the sideline and kept himself inbounds to put the Bulldogs into Duquesne territory. His second catch was nearly identical as he hauled in a 30-yard strike from Westerhaus along the Bryant sideline to put the ball at the Dukes 34. The Bulldogs would tie the game on the same drive.

COVITZ CAN'T BE STOPPED

Sophomore defensive end **Jeff Covitz** just continues to make big plays for the Black and Gold. The Reading, Mass., native picked up three tackles against Duquesne, including a huge sack on third-and-three that gave the Bulldogs the ball back late in the third quarter. He has picked up 2.5 sacks this season and has collected a sack in six of his last eight games dating back to last season.

BRYANT SPECIAL TEAMS EXCELLING

In terms of starting field position, the Bulldogs should have had a much better fate on Saturday against Duquesne. That starting field position was thanks to a great showing from the punt defense unit on special teams. Leading 7-0 in the first quarter, **Ricardo McCray** broke through and blocked the punt to give the

Did You Know?

The Bulldogs have lost four or more consecutive games just three times in school history. Other than this season, the Black and Gold lost five-straight in 2009 and four-straight in 2000.

Bulldogs the ball at the Dukes 35. Bryant was unable to score on that drive. Then, leading 21-17, in the fourth quarter, **Eloma Johnson** stuffed Charlie Leventry's punt and the Bulldogs recovered on the Dukes 24. Again, however, the Black and Gold were unable to score. On the season, the Bulldogs have blocked five kicks.

MIDDLE QUARTERS KILLING BULLDOGS

Take out the second and third quarters and the Bulldogs record might look a bit different this season. Currently, the Black and Gold are getting outscored 100-24 in the middle two quarters as opposed to 60-42 in the first and fourth quarters. Mike Westerhaus's nine-yard touchdown pass to Jordan Harris in the third quarter against Duquesne was Bryant's first third-quarter score this season. Last season, the Bulldogs were outscored 173-163 in the second and third quarters.

BRYANT HAS BEST DAY IN THIRD DOWNS

Bryant showed many signs of improvement on Saturday with one of those being in third down conversions. Heading into the game at 12-for-44 in those situations, the Bulldogs went 9-for-16 against Duquesne. In its previous three games Bryant had not converted more than five third down attempts. The previous best was a 5-for-13 showing against Saint Francis (PA) in week two.

BULLDOGS FOND OF SEAHAWKS

To many Bulldog fans, Wagner will always be a fond memory. Playing their first season as a Division I school, the Bulldogs traveled to State Island and defeated the Seahawks, 24-14, for their first-ever win over a DI school. Bryant has enjoyed playing the Seahawks over the past four seasons, posting a 3-1 record against them, including a pair of victories on Homecoming.

BULLDOGS 0-4 FOR FIRST TIME IN SCHOOL HISTORY

For the first time in school history, the Bulldogs have started a season 0-4. They hadn't started 0-3 since 2002 and are now 0-4 following a 35-21 loss to Duquesne. The four-game losing streak is the longest within a season since the Bulldogs dropped five-straight during the 2009 season. Bryant also lost five consecutive games during the 2000 season. Dating back to last season, Bryant has lost its last five games and no Bryant team has ever lost six-straight games over any period of time.

PRESEASON NOTES

BULLDOGS NAME 2012 CAPTAINS

Senior's **Jordan Brown**, **Jordan Kelly**, **Chris Willadsen** and **Colin Sullivan** and junior's **Mike Westerhaus**, **Connor McNamara** have been named captains for the 2012 season. Brown is the only two-year captain in the group after serving as one of five captains last season.

FIVE BULLDOGS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-NEC

Led by reigning NEC Offensive Player of the Year **Jordan Brown**, five Bulldogs were selected to the 2012 Preseason All-NEC team. Brown was selected at both the running back position and the kick return position. Joining Brown on the preseason squad was junior wide receiver **Jordan Harris**, senior right tackle **Chris Willadsen**, senior defensive end **Jordan Kelly** and junior defensive back **Jeremy Woodson**.

A FINE JOB

The winningest football coach in program history, **Marty Fine** begins his ninth season at the helm of Bryant football this afternoon. In eight previous seasons, Fine has put together 53-36 (.602) record. That includes a 13-13 record against NEC competition and a 19-25 record against Division I opponents. Fine earned his 50th career win last season as the Bulldogs defeated Stonehill, 42-7.

YOU MAY KNOW HIS FATHER

Two members of this year's team, **DJ Randle El** and **Jimmie Johnson**, have very notable fathers. DJ's father, Antwaan, won Super Bowl XL with the Pittsburgh Steelers and was also a member of the Washington Redskins. Jimmy's father, Jimmie Johnson Jr., was drafted by the Redskins in 1989 and played in 118 games over 10 years in the NFL. He was a member of the Redskins when they defeated Buffalo in Super Bowl XXVI and now is an assistant coach for the Minnesota Vikings.

BULLDOG SECONDARY BACK IN FULL FORCE

Despite losing senior **Tyler Carter**, the Bryant defensive secondary returns fully intact after an impressive 2011

campaign. Juniors **Jeremy Woodson**, **Max Machado** and **Michael Johnson** are all back and will be joined by sophomore **Sebastian Amedee** and freshman **Charles Wingate**. Woodson was a Second Team All-NEC selection last season and Machado was the NEC Defensive Rookie of the Year during the 2010 season.

BROWN AND WOODSON BACK AS RETURN SPECIALISTS

Not only are **Jordan Brown** and **Jeremy Woodson** standouts at their primary positions, both are extraordinary kick returners for the Bulldogs. The two rank first and third in career kick return yards in school history, while Brown has returned a program record three punts for touchdowns. Brown was recognized as a First Team All-NEC selection last year at the kick return position and found his name on the Preseason All-NEC team in the same position. Last season, Woodson earned a majority of the action late in the season as teams began kicking away from Brown. Woodson average 24 yards per return, while Brown averaged 25.9.

BRYANT ON NATIONAL TV OCT. 6

The Bulldogs will be on national TV for the third-straight season as a part of the NEC's football TV package. This season, Bryant's home game against NEC preseason favorite Albany on Oct. 6 will be televised nationally on Fox College Sports (FCS), ESPN3, Cox (RI) and Time Warner Cable (Albany). Last season, the Bulldogs defeated Sacred Heart, 26-6, in front of a nationally televised crowd. It will be the first nationally televised football game ever at Bulldog Stadium. Kickoff is slated for 12:00 p.m.

BROWN AND HARRIS EARN NATIONAL RECOGNITION

Junior wide receiver **Jordan Harris** was named a Second Team Preseason All-American by Beyond Sports Network and earned a spot on the College Football Performance Awards wide receiver watch list. Senior running back **Jordan Brown** was earned preseason All-American recognition from three different outlets as Beyond Sports Network tabbed his as a first team selection, The Sports Network named him to the second team and Phil Steele slated him on the fourth team.

BROWN NAMED TO WALTER PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST

After finishing ninth in Walter Payton Award voting as a junior, **Jordan Brown** finds himself back on the watch list to begin the 2012 season. Brown was atop the country in nearly every rushing category and received two first-place votes in the voting.

BULLDOGS WELCOME UCONN TRANSFER

Bryant will welcome an FBS transfer for the 2012 season as fullback **Mark Hinkley** comes over from UCONN to play as a graduate student. Last season, Hinkley played in all 11 games for the Huskies, starting nine of the contests.

He caught seven passes for 49 yards and a pair of touchdowns on the season. Hinkley caught TD passes against Buffalo and Cincinnati and had his best receiving game against West Virginia, catching three passes for 28 yards.

BULLDOGS PICKED THIRD IN NEC PRESEASON POLL

Receiving two first-place votes for the first time in program history, the Bulldogs were slated to finish third in the annual NEC Preseason Coaches Poll. The Black and Gold were picked to finish behind 2011 champion Albany and runner-up Duquesne. Bryant has defeated the eventual league champ in each of the last two seasons (Albany in 2011 and Robert Morris in 2010). The Bulldogs have now received a first-place vote in each of the last two seasons.

Heading into its first full season of Division I eligibility, the Bryant University football program is in great hands as Marty Fine returns for his ninth season on the Bulldog Stadium sidelines. Fine did more than lead the Bulldogs through the transition process, he kept building a program that will compete for a Northeast Conference championship in the coming years. After guiding the Bulldogs to back-to-back conference championships and NCAA Division II playoff appearances in 2006 and 2007, Fine has now taken the Bulldogs into Division I, where the program has posted 19-21 record against Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams and a 26-18 record over the last four seasons.

The winningest coach in school history, Fine has quickly turned his Bulldogs into competitors within the Northeast Conference. He has orchestrated three seven-win seasons over the past four years and has led his team to a 13-11 record in three seasons in the NEC.

Over the past two seasons, Fine's teams have posted a 14-8 record, including a team-best five wins against NEC competition in 2011. The Bulldogs have also taken home two major postseason honors the past two years as Max Machado was named the NEC Defensive Rookie of the Year in 2010 and Jordan Brown was named the NEC Offensive Player of the Year in 2011. Brown also earned three All-American citations and finished ninth in the Walter Payton Award voting. The Bulldogs have had nine All-NEC selections over the past two seasons and placed five players on the 2012 Preseason All-NEC team.

The 2009 campaign saw the Bulldogs average more than 300 yards of total offense while placing four players on the All-NEC team. Defensive end Don Smith finished fourth all-time in school history with 17 career sacks and earned All-New England honors. Senior running back Jerell Smith finished as the school's all-time leader in all-purpose yards and kick returns.

In addition to his success on the field, coach Fine has been a leader off as well. In 2009, the Bryant football team and coaching staff took part in several community service projects and helped raise support for St. Jude's, Coach for a Cure campaign and the annual "Pie in the Face Contest" that goes to support the Gloria Gemma Cancer Foundation.

In 2008, Fine led the Bulldogs into their first season of Division I play in the fall of 2008 and posted an impressive 7-4 record overall. The Bulldogs earned wins over Division I foes Robert Morris, Duquesne, Wagner, Iona and Saint Francis University.

In 2004, Fine's first as coach of the young Bulldogs, Bryant made vast improvements in almost every statistical category, including setting several school records. Bryant improved in the win column by a game from the previous year and had five players named All-Conference by the Northeast-10, the

most ever for Bryant in the sport of football.

During Fine's second season in 2005, a total of seven players earned Northeast-10 All-Conference distinction. Perry earned all-New England honors with a record 1,335 yards and 17 touchdowns as the Bulldogs went 7-3 overall with more school records falling and a showing in the NCAA Northeast Regional Top-10 rankings for the first time in school history.

In only his third season at the helm of the Bulldog program in 2006, Bryant not only captured a share of its first-ever Northeast-10 Conference Championship, but earned its first-ever berth in the NCAA Division II Championship for which Bryant was rewarded as the host of the first round as the No. 4 seed of the tournament. During the historical 2006 season that saw the Bulldogs go 8-3 overall, the Bulldogs possessed one of the nation's most feared offenses. Led by the standout running of All-American Lorenzo Perry, Bryant ranked 10th in the country in total offense and 10th in rushing offense. In addition to earning Player of the Year honors in the NE-10 and ECAC, Perry became Bryant's first ever finalist for the Harlon Hill Trophy as the nation's top player, qualifying for the final round of eight in voting.

The 2007 season saw the Bulldogs open the year with a school record seven consecutive wins. Picked to finish fourth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Bulldogs went 8-1 in the Northeast-10 Conference to capture the outright league title. Bryant set 10 team and 38 individual records in 2007 including 14 by four-year standout quarterback Charlie Granatell.

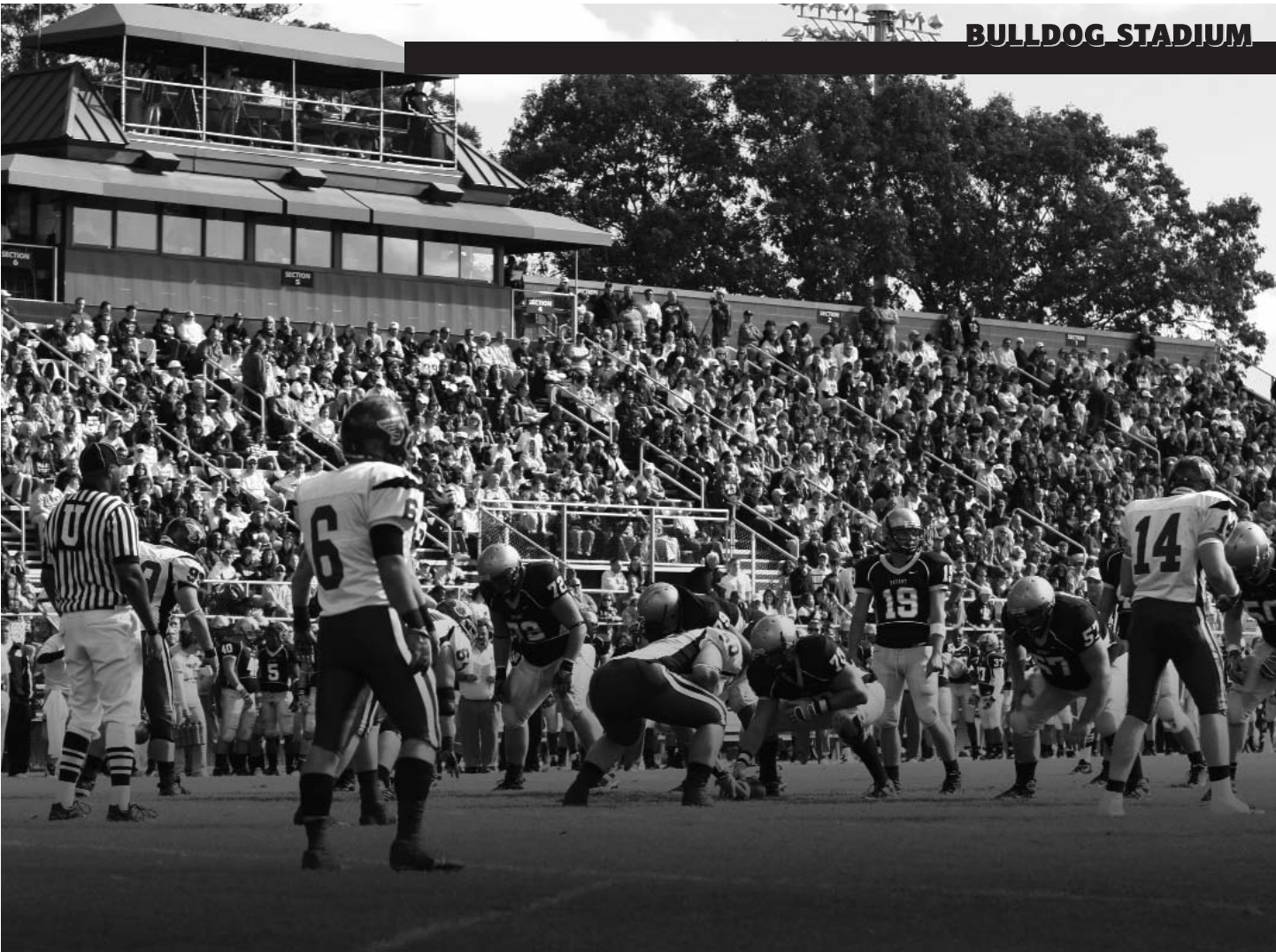
A native of Tarrytown, New York, Fine was the offensive line and special teams coordinator at Iowa State in 2002 and 2003, coaching two all-Big XII Conference performers at the Ames, Iowa school - including Zach Butler who signed an NFL contract with the Carolina Panthers after graduation in 2002.

During the 2002 season, the Cyclones' offensive line allowed the fewest number of sacks in the Big XII Conference and finished the year ranked in the Top-15 nationally with just 1.4 sacks allowed per game (19 total in 14 games in 02). Iowa State was ranked ninth nationally by the Associated Press, the highest ranking in school history with wins over Nebraska, Texas Tech, and Iowa and earned a trip to the Humanitarian Bowl in Boise, Idaho.

Prior to arriving at Iowa State, Fine spent five years as an assistant at Indiana University, coaching the offensive tackles and tight ends, as well as serving as the Hoosiers' special team's coordinator. Indiana was ranked fourth nationally in rushing in 2001 and led the Big Ten Conference with an average of 269.5 yards per game rushing. That same fall, the Hoosiers averaged 435.3 total yards per contest.

Fine went to Indiana from Colgate where he spent the 1996 season as the Red Raiders' offensive line coach. A 1985 graduate of Western New Mexico University, Fine spent six years as the offensive coordinator (1993-95) and offensive line coach (1990-92) at Indiana State. The Sycamores' offense led the Gateway Conference in rushing from 1992 to 1995 and was ranked in the top-15 nationally during that same time.

A former linebacker at Union College in New York, Fine is a 1985 graduate of Western New Mexico University. He and his wife Betsy have three children.



BULLDOG STADIUM

The centerpiece of Bryant University's outstanding athletic facilities, Bulldog Stadium was completed in 1999 to coincide with the debut of the University's varsity football program.

With a seating capacity of 3500, Bulldog Stadium utilizes a design that is typically reserved for larger stadiums, one that ensures excellent sight lines and maximum comfort for spectators.

A 2500-seat bleacher makes up the home side backdrop, while 1,000 additional seats are available on the visitor's side. There are 300 reserved seats in the stadium, equipped with seat backs and arm rests.

The stadium, which got a facelift in the summer of 2009 with the addition of new and individualized locker rooms, state-of-the-art video technology and coaches lockers, also holds its own athletic training center, office space, concession stand and public restrooms. The Bulldog football locker room, brand new in 2009, is a modern, spacious facility designed to give Bryant student-athletes a comfortable and accommodating team room and video scouting space.

The Bulldog Stadium press box contains booths for both home and visiting coaches, as well as ample work space for game personnel and media. Telephone lines and network connections are available, allowing members of the media to not only file stories on-site, but also track out-of-town scores.

Bulldog Stadium's playing surface is laser-graded, and special turf was installed for the 1999 debut season. In addition to serving as the home of Bryant Football, Bulldog Stadium has been the host of Rhode Island's high school state championship games and the Rhode Island Special Olympics.

- Ricardo McCray scored the only Bulldog touchdown of the day, plunging in from four yards out in the fourth quarter.

- Marist moved to 2-0 in the all-time series, also defeating the Bulldogs in 2008.

- Both Rickey Stevens and David Hood rushed for over 100 yards and Marcus Wasilewski threw for 229 yards and a touchdown.
- Jordan Brown rushed for 63 yards on 17 carries but did not find the endzone.
- Bryant's lone score came in the fourth quarter on a QB sneak by Mike Westerhaus. It was the first rushing touchdown of his career.

- Jeremy Woodson's 95-yard fumble return and Jordan Harris's 32-yard touchdown reception gave the Black and Gold a 14-7 lead in the first quarter.
- Woodson's return matched the longest play in program history.
- After the Red Flash used a touchdown and a safety to take a 15-14 lead in the second quarter, Woodson intercepted his first pass of the season to set up a Bryant score.
- Three plays after the interception, Matt Roncaioli made a leaping grab in the endzone for his first-career touchdown reception.
- It was all SFU in the second half, however, as they scored on a 42-yard touchdown reception and a 58-yard interception return to put the game out of reach.
- Jordan Brown rushed for 125 yards and a touchdown in defeat. The touchdown was the 35th of his career, one behind the program record set by Lorenzo Perry.
- Max Machado (14) and Colin Sullivan (13) both set career highs in tackles against the Red Flash.
- It was the first victory for SFU over the Bulldogs in five tries.

- Up by four, the Bulldogs fumbled on the Dukes three-yard line with a chance to go up by 11.
- Jordan Brown and Jordan Harris became Bryant's all-time leaders in rushing and receiving yards, respectively, in the game.
- Harris caught seven passes for 136 yards two touchdowns. His first TD grab tied the game with 40 seconds left in the first half and his second put the Bulldogs on top, 21-17, in the third quarter.
- Mike Westerhaus threw for a career-high 276 yards and two touchdowns in the game.
- Freshman Chuckie Wingate made his first career start and led the Black and Gold with 12 tackles.
- Bryant turned the ball over four times (two interceptions, two fumbles) and has turned it over 10 times in the last three games.
- Duquesne has now defeated Bryant in each of the last three meetings.
