WELCOME TO CAMPUS

The Cal State Fullerton campus is located in the heart of Orange County, located within 40 miles of three major airports: Los Angeles International to the north, Ontario to the east, and Orange County/John Wayne to the south. The campus is located immediately adjacent to the Orange (57) Freeway, which is accessible from most major Southern California freeways.

Titan Stadium is located near the intersection of Yorba Linda Blvd. and State College Blvd. Parking is available in lots "C" or "A" for \$8 on weekdays from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. and Friday's until 5 p.m. Parking is free on weekends.

FROM LAX (36.2 MILES):

Take the 105 freeway east toward Norwalk (17 miles) ... merge onto the 605 south (2.4 miles) ... take the 91 east toward Riverside (13 miles)... take the 57 north ... exit Yorba Linda Blvd. (fourth exit on your right) ... turn left onto Yorba Linda Blvd. ... turn left at Associated Road (second light) ... turn right into Lot "C."

FROM ONTARIO (28.2 MILES):

Take the 10 freeway west (12 miles) ... merge onto the 57 freeway south (15 miles) ... exit Yorba Linda Blvd. ... turn right onto Yorba Linda Blvd. ... turn left at Associated Road (first light) ... turn right into Lot "C."

FROM ORANGE COUNTY (17.8 MILES):

Take the 55 freeway north (3.6 miles) ... merge onto Interstate 5 north towards Los Angeles (4.2 miles) ... take the 57 freeway north towards Pomona (6.7 miles) ... exit Yorba Linda Blvd. ... turn left onto Yorba Linda Blvd. ... turn left at Associated Rd. (second light) ... turn right into Lot "C."

WOMEN'S SOCCER INFORMATION

Information on the women's soccer program can be accessed via the Internet at FullertonTitans.com. The website contains news, results, statistics, schedule information, and weekly notes as well as links to audio/video webcasts, live stats, and information on all of the university's 15 varsity athletic squads. Box scores and match recaps will be posted as soon as possible following the match.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS & INTERVIEW REQUESTS

Interviews with Cal State Fullerton women's soccer coaches and student-athletes **MUST** be coordinated through Jason Spencer in the sports information office. Home phone numbers or email addresses of student-athletes will not be released under any circumstances. Players and coaches can be made available before or after practice, depending on availability, at a time beneficial to both the media member and student-athlete. No interviews will be granted the day of a match.

Credentials will be issued on a match-by-match basis only. Requests must be made either via fax, email, or phone at least 24 hours in advance of a weekday game or by 5 p.m. on Friday for a weekend contest. The media pass list will be kept at the ticket table at the main entrance to Titan Stadium. Press seating is located in the press box located upstairs on the west side of the stadium. Postgame interviews will be held on the field following a 10-minute cooling off period.

PHONE LINES & INTERNET ACCESS

The press box is equipped with phone lines and high-speed wireless Internet for use by visiting SID's and members of the media. Please contact Jason Spencer in the media relations office as far in advance as possible to reserve a phone line and booth for radio or Internet broadcasts.

PARKING GUIDELINES

Parking regulations are enforced from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. on Monday-Thursday and from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Friday. There is no charge for parking during the weekends. Daily permits are available from vending machines at the entrance to each parking lot for \$8 (bills and quarters accepted).

Cal State Fullerton Sports Media Manager Jason Spencer is in his 13th year coordinating media efforts for the university's women's soccer, men's basketball, and women's golf programs while also serving as the webmaster for the athletic department's website, FullertonTitans.com.

Prior to arriving in Orange County, Spencer spent 18 months as the Assistant Media Relations Director at the University of Portland in Oregon where he worked primarily with the women's volleyball, women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, and men's and women's tennis teams.

During his time in the Pacific Northwest, Spencer also worked as a Communications Assistant with the now defunct Portland Fire of the WNBA during its inaugural season in the Rose City, responsible for writing the team's game notes, managing the press room during games, and assisting with the franchise's various public relations efforts.

A native of Fresno, Calif., Spencer graduated from the University of Southern California in 1999 with a bachelor's degree in broadcast journalism and a minor in sociology.

There, he was as a student assistant in the USC sports information office for three-and-a-half years, contributing to the 1999 men's and women's tennis media guide as well as the 1999 women's rowing media guide, and served as the public address announcer for Trojans baseball games at Dedeaux Field for four seasons.

He also spent two-and-a-half years on staff of the *Daily Trojan* student newspaper, including a semester as Sports Editor, covering such beats as women's golf, men's water polo, men's tennis, baseball, and football.

Spencer, 36, currently resides in Riverside with his wife, Katie, and their son, Nathan, who was born July 24, 2008. All three share the same birthday.

WELCOME TO TITAN STADIUM

As Cal State Fullerton establishes itself as one of the nation's elite programs, the cornerstone can be seen in the form of Titan Stadium.

Completed in 1992, the 10,000-seat facility has been called by many "one of the finest soccer facilities in the nation." With deference to the much larger but fan-unfriendly Rose Bowl, site of the 1994 World Cup and the 1999 Women's World Cup, Titan Stadium is the second-best soccer facility in Southern California behind only the Home Depot Center in Carson – the home of the Los Angeles Galaxy and Club Deportivo Chivas USA of Major League Soccer as well as the U.S. Soccer Federation's national team training headquarters.

The stadium features 2,000 chair-back seats and 2,500 bleachers with backrests in the western grandstand and about 5,000 seats on concrete steps along the eastern sideline. The pitch has an underground drainage system that allows it to be almost perfectly flat and is of maximum width and length (75 x 120 yards). The press box seats more than 50 and there are 10 booths for broadcasting, hospitality, etc.

The stadium shell was completed on Jan. 15, 1992. The first event was commencement on May 30, 1992, and the first soccer activity was a scrimmage between Fullerton and Biola University on Aug. 22, 1992.

The first collegiate men's soccer game was Cal State Fullerton vs. UC Santa Barbara on Sept. 5, 1992, followed that evening by Fullerton vs. Cal State Northridge in football.

During the summer of 1998, the field level locker room was completed and concessions stands and restrooms were built on the eastern terrace.

During the month leading up to the 1994 World Cup, Titan Stadium played host to several international exhibitions featuring the United States team. The Colombian team trained at Fullerton and several other nations used the facility after Colombia was eliminated.

In 1993 and 1994, Titan Stadium served as the home of the Los Angeles Salsa of the American Professional Soccer League. Los Angeles lost to Colorado, 2-1, in the 1993 APSL Championship held in Titan Stadium. In 1993, the Titan women's team appeared on the scene and played Southern California rival USC to a 1-1 tie in the first-ever women's match at Titan Stadium. In 1994, the Cal State Fullerton men's team hosted its first NCAA Tournament games ever when the Titans played host to, and defeated, San Diego and San Francisco in the first two rounds of the tournament. UCLA also used the facility in 2003 for its fall football camp.

The playing surface was totally renovated in July of 2005 and played host to the Big West Conference Women's Soccer Tournament and the first two rounds of the NCAA Women's Soccer Tournament later that year. In 2010, Titan Stadium became the home of the United Soccer League's L.A. Blues professional team.

The stadium is only part of the larger Titan Sports Complex, which was financed by a unique arrangement with the city of Fullerton and an on-campus Marriott Hotel. A baseball stadium seating 3,500 fans, a two-diamond softball complex seating more than 1,000, an all-weather running track, renovated tennis courts, and an auxiliary soccer field all were part of the original \$10 million project that has seen more than \$5 million in improvements.

With its proximity to Hollywood, Titan Stadium has become a favorite location for movies, commercials, and video games. Numerous professional stars from many sports have been featured.

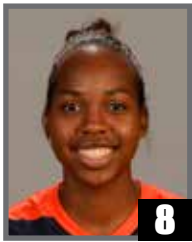

What can Brown do for you? Plenty.

Since returning to his alma mater as an assistant coach with the Cal State Fullerton women's program in 2004, Demian Brown has been an integral part of developing the Titans into an emerging national contender over the last nine years.

In that span, the former Fullerton letter winner and two-time Big West Conference Coach of the Year (2007, 2012) has helped the Titans to a 92-77-15 (.541) overall record with a quartet of Big West regular season titles, three conference tournament crowns and back-to-back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Tournament - including a trip to the "Sweet 16" in 2005 and a second round berth in 2006.

Now in his seventh season at the helm of the Fullerton program, Brown looks to continue the tradition of success that fans of Titans' soccer have come to expect.

Hired as only the third head coach in the history of the program in February of 2007, Brown's Division I head coaching debut was nothing short of stellar, becoming the first-ever, first-year, first-time head coach in the history of the conference to lead his team to both the league's regular season and tournament titles and only the second first-year head coach to win a regular season title, joining former Titans' coach Ali Khosroshahin in 2001.

Fullerton compiled a 12-8-2 overall mark in Brown's rookie campaign and a 6-2 mark in Big West play for first place (the third time in Brown's four years that the Titans have stood atop the conference), earning the top seed for the league tournament at Titan Stadium. Under Brown's direction, Fullerton clinched its third consecutive Big West Tournament title and subsequent NCAA berth with a penalty kick victory over Cal Poly in the championship.

For his efforts, he was named the Big West Coach of the Year.

The 2008 season was a little bit of a struggle as the Titans, faced with the loss of their top three scorers and returning only 13 of the team's 31 goals from the previous year, limped to a 7-11-1 overall mark and a 2-6 finish in conference play. Eight of their 11 losses came by a single goal with five of those defeats coming in the last 10 minutes.

Faced with one of the toughest schedules in school history, Fullerton did pull-off victories over nationally-ranked squads California and UC Santa Barbara and opened the year with four straight wins for only the second time in the history of the program and the first since 1995.

His third season at the helm was nothing short of heartbreaking as the Titans finished 6-8-5 overall, but ended 4-3-1 in the Big West Conference for a fourth-place tie, missing out on a league tournament berth on tiebreakers. Fullerton, which suffered five one-goal losses and battled to a pair of scoreless draws during the year, did end its campaign on a high note, going unbeaten (3-0-1) over their final four matches that included conference wins over UC Davis, Long Beach State, and Pacific. The five draws were a school record while the six overtime matches were just one shy of the school mark set in 1993 and 2007 (7).

The 2011 campaign saw Fullerton finish just 6-13 overall, but was once again in the hunt for a postseason tournament berth entering the final

weekend of the regular season. The Titans, who finished 3-5 in league play, faced a somewhat difficult slate with four opponents ranked among the nation's top 25 (and another receiving votes at the time of the match). Senior Christina Murillo (second team) and junior Casey Volk (honorable mention) were among the postseason award winners from the Big West while the offense, which finished with just 13 goals and 37 points in 2009, underwent a dramatic turnaround, nearly doubling its output to the tune of 23 goals and 63 points.

In 2011, Brown and the Titans began to turn things around, posting the school's first winning record in four years at 9-8-3 while finishing just outside the race for the Big West Tournament with a 3-4-1 mark. A battle-tested Fullerton squad tied an NCAA record with 11 overtime matches, going 4-4-3 in those contests, and was one of three Big West schools to finish in the top 75 in the final NCAA RPI, all the while helping defender Caitlin Mellano and forward Ann Marie Tangorra to All-Big West

Conference Second-Team honors. In addition, redshirt junior Stacey Fox was named to the NSCAA All-West Region Third Team -- the first Titan since Jenae Gibbens in 2008 to earn such an honor.

The Titans continued the momentum in 2012, winning the Big West Conference regular season title with a 7-2 mark en route to their second-consecutive winning season at 10-9-1 overall. The top-seeded team heading into the playoffs, Fullerton returned to the Big West championship match following a penalty-kick win over host UC Irvine, before falling in overtime to Cal State Northridge to narrowly miss out on the league's automatic NCAA Tournament bid. After opening 1-5, the Titans finished 7-2-1 in their final 10 matches as eight players earned All-Big West honors -- including the team's first, first-team honorees since 2008 in Stacey Fox, Ann Marie Tangorra, and JeAnne Mazeau -- while Christina Burkenroad and Morgan Batcheller were named to the league's inaugural All-Freshman Team and Brown was named the conference's Coach of the Year for a second time. Nationally, Fox was named to the NSCAA All-West Region Second Team.

While at Fullerton, Brown has tutored some of the Big West Conference's best defensive players as the Titans have had three Big West Defensive Players of the Year in All-American Marlene Sandoval (2005), Erica Janke (2006), and Jenae Gibbens (2007). In addition, 16 different players have earned 23 first-team all-conference honors with 21 more named to the All-Big West second and honorable mention teams.

Since joining the Titans, Brown has had a tremendous impact on the defensive side of the ball, helping coach the Titans' defense to a pair of record-setting seasons. Under his direction in 2004, Fullerton set single-season records for shutouts (8), fewest shots allowed (183) and fewest goals allowed (18). Brown and the Titans improved on that effort in 2005, setting new marks for fewest goals allowed (15), fewest shots allowed (161) and shutouts (12) while also tying the record for consecutive shutouts in a single season with four.

Prior to his collegiate coaching debut, Brown guided the Cal-South Women's Soccer State Select Team to the George F. Donnelly Cup title in January of 2006, posting a perfect 4-0 record at regionals and outscoring teams from Massachusetts, Illinois and Tennessee by a combined 8-0 total to win the crown.

During the summer of 2011, Brown also assumed the reins of the Los Angeles Strikers of the United Soccer League's W-League four matches into the franchise's inaugural season and recently completed a full season at the helm of the club in 2012.

Brown came to Cal State Fullerton after spending five years as an assistant coach for the men's program at UC Irvine, helping lead the Anteaters to the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Tournament in 2000 and coaching the 2001 Big West Conference Defensive Player of the Year (Saul Wolf).

His coaching experience also includes working with numerous club programs, including the Slammers FC out of Newport Beach, Calif., where he served as head coach for seven years, the Orange Junior Soccer Club in Orange, Calif., and, most recently, the Fullerton Rangers. Brown also was the boys head coach at Canyon High School in Anaheim, Calif., leading that school into the CIF quarterfinals in 2000.

A 1997 graduate of Cal State Fullerton with a degree in communications, Brown was a four-year letter winner for former Head Coach Al Mistri as a defender for the Titans from 1992-94 and 1996, helping Fullerton to the semifinals of the 1993 College Cup.

He was selected to the 1993 NCAA All-Tournament Team and was a two-time All-MPSF selection, finishing his career with four goals and three assists. Brown also competed in the 1994 U.S. Olympic Festival in St. Louis.

He currently resides in Fullerton with his wife, Gina, sons, Mathias and Xavier, and daughter, Dalia.

Diego Bocanegra returns to the sidelines of Titan Stadium for his fifth season on head coach Demian Brown's staff, but his first as the program's associate head coach after being elevated to the spot in February, 2013.

"I am very happy to announce the promotion of Diego to Associate Head Coach of the Cal State Fullerton women's soccer program," Brown said. "This is well-deserved for his dedication, work ethic, and overall commitment to the success of our program. I look forward to our work together in the coming seasons and feel confident that the program will continue to achieve our highest goals."

Hired to his position in March of 2009 following a successful two-year run as head coach at NCAA Division II Cal State San Bernardino, Bocanegra was lauded nationally in 2012, named the NSCAA Far West Regional Assistant Coach of the Year, joining Olivet Nazarene's Joshua Macharia (Great Lakes Region), Central College's Katelin Gannon (Midwest Region), Virginia's Ron Raab (Middle Atlantic Region), Marywood University's Tony Roma (North Atlantic Region), La Salle's Ally Kenney (Northeast Region), North Carolina's Bill Palladino (South Region), and Auburn's Amy Berbarry (South Atlantic Region) on the honor roll.

Bocanegra compiled a combined record of 18-13-9 with the Coyotes, helping guide three players to All-California Collegiate Athletic Association honors in 2007 and four in 2008 when they finished 10-5-5 overall and 7-4-3 in conference play, just narrowly missing out on a postseason berth. He previously served two years as an assistant for Coach Noah Kooiman, a former Titan player, for both the men's and women's squads at CSUSB, and was an assistant coach for the men's team at UC Riverside for three seasons.

Prior to Bocanegra's arrival, Cal State San Bernardino had posted a 14-37-6 overall record and a 9-30-5 mark in CCAA play from 2004-06.

An extensive background in club soccer also fills Bocanegra's resume. The Alta Loma resident coached the Alta Loma Arsenal Girls and Boys teams in various age categories for many years and later became an assistant and then the head girls' coach at Alta Loma High School, his alma mater. Bocanegra's playing career included several stops -- the Alta Loma Arsenal, Alta Loma High School, the Olympic Development program, Grand Canyon University in Arizona, UCLA and finally 1997 at Fresno State, where he earned a bachelors degree in liberal studies.

He currently coaches U18 girls squad for the Fullerton Rangers while also serving as the club's college advisor.

Bocanegra resides in Upland with his wife, Kellie, their daughter, Isabella, and their son, Luca. Diego's younger brother, Carlos, is a member of the U. S. National Men's Soccer Team after enjoying an All-American career at UCLA.

Cal State Fullerton graduate and standout midfielder Stacey Fox has been hired as an assistant coach with the Titans' women's soccer program, Head Coach Demian Brown announced today. Fox takes over for the departed Lauryn Pehanich, who resigned to become the head coach at the University of La Verne on Dec. 21.

"I am very excited to add Stacey to our staff," Head Coach Demian Brown said. "She had an incredibly positive influence in the program as a player and captain. Now, as a coach, she will be able to continue to use that influence with the women as we strive to repeat the success of last season. Her ability to connect to the women and guide our attacking players will be extremely beneficial."

Fox completed her collegiate career with Fullerton in 2012, earning All-West Region Second-Team honors from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America -- one of only 10 Titans to be named to the all-region team since 1996 and only the third to earn multiple awards from the NSCAA, joining Karen Bardsley (third team in 2002, second team in 2006) and Jenae Gibbens (third team in 2007-08).

"I am very honored and excited to get the opportunity to return to CSUF women's soccer program as an Assistant Coach," Fox said. "I have so much pride in this program and cannot wait to help contribute to it's success."

A first-team all-conference performer for the first time in her career as a senior, Fox led the Titans in scoring 2012, finishing with a team-high seven goals and 16 points to go with two assists and three game-winning strikes. She started 17 of the 18 matches she appeared in, helping Fullerton to a 10-9-1 overall record and a Big West regular season title with a 7-2 mark in league play.

After suffering a season-ending injury that sidelined her for all of 2010, Fox was a third-team NSCAA All-West Region selection as a redshirt junior in 2011, finishing tied for second on the team in points (10) and tied for the team lead in goals (5) in 15 starts. She also tied for the team lead in points (6) and goals (3) as a sophomore and was an All-Big West Honorable Mention choice as a freshman, appearing in all 19 matches as a rookie and leading the team with five goals and 13 points.

Fox finished her Titans career ranked ninth on the school's all-time list in career points (45), sixth in goals, (20), ninth in goals per game (0.29), tied for third in game-winning goals (6), and seventh in shots (110).

A four-year letter winner in net at Saint Mary's College in Moraga, Calif., Kellan Wilson returns to the Titan Stadium sidelines for his second season as a volunteer assistant with the Cal State Fullerton women's program working with the Titan goalkeepers.

Under his tutelage in 2012, Titan keeper Lindsey Maricic ranked in the top five in the Big West Conference in goals against average (3rd - 0.98), save percentage (4th - .783), and shutouts (2nd - 5) while starting 15 of the team's 20 matches and earning All-Big West Conference Honorable Mention honors.

As a collegian, Wilson played four seasons for the Gaels in 1999-01 and 2003, leading the West Coast Conference in saves three times with 115 stops in 2000, 85 more in 2001, and 110 in 2003 as a senior. He ranks second all-time in school history with 311 saves, seventh in career goals against average (1.66), second in wins (22), tied for fourth in shutouts (9.5), and fifth in minutes played (4,620).

Following his career at Saint Mary's, Wilson's playing career included professional stints overseas in Germany with VfL Osnabruck (2005-08) and Finland with Helsinki IFK (2010-11), helping the latter to the championship of the Finnish 2nd Division, and a stop with the San Francisco Seals in the USL's Premier Development League in 2008-09 where he stepped away from his spot in net to lead the team in goals.

Wilson's coaching experience includes three years as the junior varsity coach at Acalanes High School in Lafayette, Calif., one season at his alma mater in 2008-09, and one year with the Seals in 2009-10.

Under the direction interim head coach Ali Khosroshahin (Big West Coach of the Year), the 2001 Cal State Fullerton women's soccer team laid claim to its first Big West Conference regular season title since 1996 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history, finishing 13-7 overall and 8-1 in Big West play just one year after ending the 2000 campaign with an 8-12 overall record and a seventh-place finish in the league. After a sluggish start to the season (0-3), the Titans earned their first win with a 5-0 shutout of Stony Brook and they rarely looked back from there, following up an overtime loss at San Diego State with seven consecutive victories (allowing just three goals in that span) and winning five of their final six contests (including the last three-in-a-row) to clinch the Big West crown and postseason berth. One of 16 first-timers in the field of 64, Fullerton made the short 50-mile trip to host and No. 3 national seed UCLA in Los Angeles where the Titans held the powerful Bruins' offense scoreless for the first 45 minutes before Staci Duncan's header gave the home side a 1-0 lead. Tracey Winzen then added two more in the 71st and 82nd minutes on free kicks from just outside the penalty area for the final 3-0 score. First-team All-Big West honorees Tennli Ulicny, Michele Bannister, Jenny Mescher, and Kellie Cox powered the Fullerton offense, combining for 36 of the team's 48 goals on the season. Mescher tied for the league lead in goals scored (11) while Bannister was the Big West's top individual scorer with 10 goals and five assists (25 points). Freshman defender Vanessa Valentine was a second-team selection while midfielder Erica Jacalone, defender Deena Miller, and goalkeeper Laura Janke were honorable mention honorees. Ulicny was also named to the NSCAA All-West Region and Soccer Buzz West Region Third Team while Khosroshahin was the latter's regional coach of the year runner up. Following the season, Cox was selected to participate in the United States Under-19 National Team Camp while Nadia Hernandez and Deanna Plascencia were invited to camp with Mexico's national team.

The most successful team in the history of the Cal State Fullerton women's soccer program, the 2005 edition of the Titans accomplished a number of firsts: winning their first-ever match in the Big West Conference Tournament, clinching their first-ever Big West tournament title, became the first Big West school to host an NCAA Tournament match, earned their first-ever wins in the NCAA Tournament with victories over UNLV and USC, and became the first Big West school to advance past the second round of the NCAA's since the league began sponsoring women's soccer in 1996 (whew!). All that leading to a school-record 19 wins overall and the school's fourth Big West Conference regular season title with a 6-1 mark. A season-opening loss to San Diego State at home (2-0) was one of the few blemishes on the Titans' resume all year as that jumpstarted a four-match winning streak that included wins over Auburn and South Carolina before a loss to No. 6 Santa Clara briefly derailed them. Four more victories, including a win over nationally ranked Utah, followed before Fullerton was sidetracked once again with a loss at UC Riverside to kick-off Big West play. However, that proved to be only a speedbump as the Titans took off from there, winning seven-straight contests to close out the regular season -- a mark that was extended to a school-record 11 consecutive victories heading into their NCAA Third Round match-up at Virginia. Numerous records -- mostly on the defensive end -- were set in the process as Cal State Fullerton also set single-season marks for winning percentage (.826), fewest defeats (4), most home victories (10), fewest goals allowed (15), most shots (409), fewest shots allowed (16), and most shutouts (12), while tying the mark for the most consecutive shutouts (4). Offensively, 12 different players scored goals while 10 finished with multiple goals on the year, matching the records set for both categories in 1996. Seven Titans were named to the All-Big West First Team and 11 were honored by the coaches overall -- both school-record totals -- while head coach Ali Khosroshahin was named Coach of the Year for a second time. Seniors Kellie Cox (6 goals, 2 assists) and Kandace Wilson (7 goals, 4 assists) were named Co-Offensive Players of the Year, senior Marlene Sandoval was the league's Defensive Player of the Year, and junior Karen Bardsley was the conference's Goalkeeper of the Year for a second time. Nationally, Sandoval was named an NSCAA and Soccer Buzz Second-Team All-American and All-West Region first-teamer while Kandace Wilson was named to the NSCAA all-region third-team.

The biggest question for the 2006 Cal State Fullerton women's soccer team would be what would the Titans do for an encore after their record-setting campaign just one year earlier that resulted in an appearance in the third round of the NCAA Tournament. Returning only 11 letterwinners and losing six of its top seven scorers from 2005 (a group that accounted for 30 goals and 79 points), the Titans would be forced to grow up in a hurry, heading into the fray with a roster that featured 21 underclassmen out of 36 players (including 14 true or redshirt freshmen). The cupboard wasn't entirely bare as Fullerton's core group of four seniors led the way led, offensively, by midfielders Lauryn Welch and Desiree Flint and defender Erica Janke and goalkeeper Karen Bardsley in the back. A road-heavy schedule that saw them play only six home matches all season forced the Titans to get used to playing in hostile environments, but the going was easy in the beginning, opening with four wins and a scoreless draw in their first six matches that included a win at No. 5 Texas A&M. That's when the going got rough as four defeats followed -- three of those against nationally ranked opposition -- with the final blow being dealt against Arizona on Sept. 28, ending Fullerton's 11-match home winning streak and Welch's season when she suffered a season-ending leg injury just five minutes in. The pain was lessened as the Titans opened conference play 3-0 with wins over UC Riverside, Pacific, and Cal State Northridge, but had to fight for one of four Big West Tournament berths after finishing 4-2-1 and in third place during the regular season. Once there, however, Fullerton had to shake off a dismal Big West Tournament record after posting a 2-3 mark in four previous trips, but the Titans did not disappoint in winning their second-straight tournament title as the No. 3 seed. Fullerton posted a pair of 2-1 wins over league regular season co-champion UC Santa Barbara and fourth-seeded Cal Poly, which upset top-seed and host Long Beach State in the opener. The win over the Mustangs came thanks to the foot of tournament MVP Kristen Boujos, who scored twice in the championship match after scoring just two times all season, including the game-winner in the 77th minute. The league's automatic berth granted the Titans a third trip to the NCAA Tournament and, again, a short jaunt to Pacific-10 Conference rival UCLA where they were matched-up against another Southern California rival, Loyola Marymount, in the first round. Goals by Erica Janke, Boujos, and Brianna Buffington, and a defense that held the Lions to just six shots on the night set up yet another NCAA Tournament match-up with the Bruins and a historically similar result. UCLA scored three times in the first 47 minutes en route to the win before Casey Schostag spoiled the shutout with a goal in the 76th minute. Goalkeeper Bardsley was spectacular in net, saving 14 shots from the high-powered Bruins offense while facing 29 shots overall. Janke and Bardsley were named to the All-Big West First Team, earning league Defensive and Goalkeeper of the Year awards, respectively, while Welch, Flint, and Jenae Gibbens were second-team selections.

Back-to-back Big West Tournament titles, back-to-back NCAA Tournament berths, and one of Cal State Fullerton's own came back to lead them as head coach. Demian Brown, a former letter winner for the Titans' men's team (1992-94, 1996), became only the third head coach in the history of the program after serving three years as an assistant, beginning a new era for Cal State Fullerton women's soccer. A stocked roster full of 14 letter winners and eight returning starters off a team that advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament a year earlier helped pace the Titans to their second-consecutive season at 12-8-2 overall and a 6-2 mark in Big West Conference play -- good for their fifth league regular season title. However, the "Demian Brown Era" didn't get off to a rosy start for the first-time head coach as Fullerton opened the campaign winless in its first three contests, which included a narrow, 2-1, defeat at the hands of then-No. 1 Portland in Seattle. The suffering didn't last long, however, as Brown's charges turned things around with three-straight wins over such big names as Washington, No. 14 California, and Oklahoma, surrendering only two goals in that stretch and jumpstarting a string of six wins in the Titans' next seven matches, including a victory over league newcomer UC Davis to open conference play. Non-conference road victories over San Jose State and Fresno State ended the run as Fullerton ran into a speed bump on the coast, falling at UC Santa Barbara and Cal Poly in shutouts before returning home to battle then-No. 6 Santa Clara, scoring with just under a minute remaining to draw even with the perennial powerhouse Broncos before falling in overtime. That would be Fullerton's last defeat for a long time as the Titans rattled off five-consecutive victories in conference play, including a key, 1-0, win over Long Beach State on the road that was, eventually, the difference between Fullerton serving as the top seed or the No. 2-seeded team in the Big West Tournament. Serving as host of the conference's postseason event for the second time, the Titans battled fourth-seeded UC Irvine into double overtime before 2006 Big West Tournament MVP Kristen Boujos netted the game-winner in the 105th minute to set up an epic clash with No. 3 Cal Poly, which upset the second-seeded 49ers in its seminal clash. The Mustangs, which handed Fullerton a 1-0 double-overtime loss earlier in the season, and the Titans battled through 110 minutes of scoreless soccer as the conference's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament would then be decided by penalty kicks. Fullerton converted on its first three attempts while Cal Poly had one go wide, setting up a game-winning attempt that was turned away by goalkeeper Alii Tramel. The Mustangs evened things up on their next attempt and Trammel turned away yet another to give Cal Poly the advantage. Ashley Vallis' attempt missed high on what would have been the game-winner, sending the match to a sixth round. Nicole Scheid converted her try to give the Titans the lead before Tournament MVP Shayla Sabin came up big on the final attempt to the day, diving to her left to get a hand on Whitney Sisler's try and knocking it away to end the match and give Fullerton an unprecedented third-straight Big West Tournament title. For the second-straight season, and the third time in four trips to the NCAA Tournament, the Titans would be sent to UCLA for postseason play as Fullerton looked to snap an 0-for-10 skid against the powerful top-ranked Bruins, but 2007 would not be its year. The host side scored three times in the first 39 minutes and Fullerton could manage only an 84th-minute strike by freshman Christina Murillo in a 3-1 loss. Head Coach Demian Brown was named the league's Coach of the Year while Shayla Sabin (Goalkeeper of the Year), Jenae Gibbens (Defensive Player of the Year), and Stacey Thompson (Midfielder of the Year) also earned individual honors. Brianna Buffington and Lauren Cram were named to the all-conference first team while Nicole Scheid and Caset Schostag were represented on the second team. Gibbens also added to her mantle as an all-region honoree by the NSCAA and Soccer Buzz while earning ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-America Third Team honors.

A FAN'S GUIDE TO SOCCER - A GLOSSARY OF SELECTED SOCCER TERMS

Not meant to be a comprehensive list, but will help those in identifying the most commonly used terms in the sport. Complete list (edited here to include NCAA applications) courtesy CBC Sports.

GENERAL JARGON

Against the run of play: When one team scores after launching a counterattack soon after it regains possession of the ball, that team is said to have scored "against the run of play."

Attacking third: The third of the field where one team is trying to score on the opposing team's goal.

Bicycle kick: A shot on goal taken by a player who has his back to the net and kicks the ball while both of his feet are in the air.

Booking: A term used to indicate when the referee has cautioned a player with a yellow or red card. A player is said to have been "booked." Also known as a caution.

Cap: A recognition earned by a player whenever he plays in an international game for his country. A player becomes "capped" each time he plays for his country.

Chip pass: A pass lofted into the air from one player to a teammate. Used primarily to elude a defender by kicking the ball over his head.

Chip shot: A shot towards the net that is lofted into the air in an attempt to sail the ball over the goalkeeper's head and under the crossbar and into the goal.

Counter-attack: An attack launched by a defending team immediately after it regains possession of the ball. A counterattack in soccer is equivalent to a fast break in basketball.

Cross: A pass from an attacking player near the sideline to a teammate in the middle or opposite side of the field.

Dead ball situation: Any restart of the game, following a stoppage by the referee, when the ball is put back into play by the attacking team. (i.e.: a direct or indirect free kick or a corner kick).

Dissent: When a player expresses disagreement by word or action with any decision of the referee. A yellow card is usually handed out as punishment for dissent.

Dribble: The act of controlling the ball with the feet while moving on the field of play.

Formation: The arrangement of players into positions on the field. A 4-4-2 formation consists of four defenders, four midfielders and two forwards.

50/50 ball: A loose ball contested by a player from each team, usually after an errant pass or a goal kick.

Half volley: Taking a shot on net just as the ball bounces off the ground.

Header: Use of the head to pass or control the ball, or to take a shot on net.

Marking: Guarding and defending a player to prevent him from advancing the ball towards the net, making a pass or getting the ball from a teammate.

Midfield: The area of the field near the centre line; the area patrolled by the midfielders.

Narrowing the angle: A goalkeeping technique used to reduce the area of the goal that an attacker could shoot. This lowers the odds that the attacker will score.

Nil: British term meaning the score for one side is zero. A score of 1-0 is one-nil in English soccer parlance.

Offside trap: The act of the defenders moving forward together in order to place an opponent in an offside position, thereby creating an offside infraction.

Overlap: A tactic where a player moves past a teammate who has the ball down the sideline in order to put himself in a better position to receive a pass.

Own-goal: A player accidentally putting the ball in his own net, thus scoring a goal for the opposing team.

Pitch: British term for a soccer field.

Set play: A planned strategy that a team employs when a game is restarted with a free kick. Also known as a set piece.

Tackling: The act of taking the ball away from an opposing player by kicking or stopping it with one's feet.

Through ball: A pass played into the space behind the defenders for a teammate to run on to.

Tracking: Moving and staying with an opponent who has made a run to another part of the field.

Trap: When a player uses his body to slow down and control a moving ball, most often using the chest, thighs or feet.

Volley: Any ball kicked by a player when it is in the air.

Wall: A line of defending players pressed together shoulder-to-shoulder to protect their goal against a free kick. The wall makes it more difficult for the opposing player to score by reducing the amount of open goal area to shoot at.

THE FIELD

Goal area: The rectangular area (20 yards wide by 6 yards deep) in front of each goal from which all goal kicks are taken.

Goal-line: The field boundary running along its width at each end. Also called the end-line.

Halfway line: The middle line that divides the field into two equal halves. Also known as the centre line.

Penalty area: A rectangular area (44 yards wide by 18 yards deep) with its long edge on the goal line; the goalkeeper may use his hands to block or control the ball only within this area. Also known as the 18-yard box.

Penalty spot: The small circular spot located 12 yards in front of the centre of the goal-line from which all penalty kicks are taken.

Sideline: A line that runs the length of the field on each side. The line from which all free throws are taken. Also known as the touchline.

POSITIONS

Attacking midfielder: The most forward-playing midfielder who slots in right behind the forwards and in front of the rest of the midfielders. He supports the offence by providing passes to forwards to set up goals.

Defender: A player who functions primarily in the defensive third of the field and whose major role is to fend off attacks on the goal by the opposing team. Also known as a fullback.

Defensive midfielder: The player positioned just in front of his team's defence who is responsible for marking the opposition's best offensive player.

Flat back: A defensive scheme in which the three or four defenders move in unison, maintaining a formation that is straight across the field.

Goalkeeper: The player positioned directly in front of the goal who tries to stop opposing players to score. The only player allowed to use his hands and arms, though only within the penalty area.

Libero: A defender or midfielder who plays in front of the defence. Similar to a sweeper (who plays behind the defenders) or a screen; however, the libero frequently moves forward to join the attack.

Marking back: A fullback whose primary responsibility is to mark or cover one of the opposing forwards.

Midfielders: The two, three or four players who link together the offensive and defensive functions of a team. Midfielders play in front of the defenders and behind the forwards.

Screen: A defensive midfielder playing in front of the defence charged with the responsibility of collecting loose balls across the width of the field and then distributing passes to teammates up the field.

Stopper: A defender who marks the best scorer on the attacking team, often the opposition's striker.

Striker: An offensive player who plays towards the opposing team's net and tries to score goals. Also known as a forward.

Sweeper: A central defender who plays closest to his own goal behind the rest of the defenders. A team's last line of defence in front of the goalkeeper.

Wingback: A fullback playing in a wide position with responsibility for making attacking runs down the wings.

Winger: The outside forwards who play close to the sidelines whose primary task is to provide the strikers with accurate crossing passes so they can shoot at the goal.

RULES & LAWS

Play the advantage: A judgement made by the official to allow play to continue rather than stopping play to call a foul. The official makes this decision when he thinks the foul did not put the offended team at a disadvantage, or if the foul, should it have been called, would take away a scoring chance for the offended team.

Corner kick: A restart of the game where the ball is kicked from the corner arc into the middle of the penalty area in an attempt to create a scoring chance. Awarded to an attacking team when the ball crosses the defending team's goal-line after being last touched by the defending team.

Direct free kick: A kick awarded to a player after being fouled by the opposition. The player kicks a stationary ball while opposing players are forced to stand 10 yards away from him. A goal can be scored directly from this kick without the ball touching another player.

Extra time: If the score is tied after 90 minutes of regulation, the teams must then play two 15 minute halves (10 minutes in the NCAA) to decide the game. Unlike international soccer, extra time in the NCAA is sudden death; first team to score wins the match. If neither team scores, the match is declared a draw.

Foul: A violation of the rules - including kicking, pushing, shoving, tripping and dangerous or aggressive play - for which an official awards a free kick.

Goal kick: A type of restart in which the ball is kicked from inside the goal area away from the goal. Awarded to the defending team when a ball that crossed its goal-line was last touched by a player on the attacking team.

Handball: A foul where a player touches the ball with his hand or arm; depending on where the offence take place, the opposing team is awarded either a penalty kick or a direct free kick.

Indirect free kick: A kick awarded to a player for a less-serious foul committed by the opposition. The player kicks a stationary ball to a teammate while opposing players are forced to stand 10 yards away from him. A goal can not be scored on an indirect free kick as the ball must first be touched by another player before going into the net - this is why a player kicks the ball to a teammate on an indirect free kick.

Assistant referees: The two officials who assist the lead referee in making his decisions. They monitor the sidelines and goal-lines to determine when a ball goes out of bounds, when a goal is scored or when players are offside; they use a flag to signal their observations.

Offside: A player in an offside position while his team has the ball becomes involved in active play, such as by being the recipient of a pass.

Offside position: The situation where an attacking player, on the offensive half of the field, has put himself in a position where there are fewer than two opponents (usually the goalie and one defender) between him and the goal at the exact moment the ball is kicked forward. This positioning does not constitute a foul until he becomes involved in the play. A player is not offside if he is exactly even with one or both of these defensive players.

Penalty shot: A kick taken from the penalty spot by a player against the opposing goalie. Awarded for the most severe rule violations and those committed by defenders within their own penalty area. Also known as a penalty kick.

Red card: A red card that a referee holds up to signal a player's expulsion from the game; the player's team must then play the rest of the game shorthanded. Presented for violent behaviour or multiple infractions (two yellow cards = one red card).

Referee: The head referee in charge of officiating the game.

Shootout: A tie-breaking device that pits one player against the goalkeeper in penalty kicks. The winner is determined after a best-of-five series of shots alternating with each team. If tied after five, the contest continues with different players until one team scores and the other team doesn't. Used after the teams played two 15-minute halves of overtime with the game still tied.

Throw-in: A type of restart where a player throws the ball from behind his head with two hands while standing with both feet on the ground behind a sideline. Taken by a player opposite the team that last touched the ball before it went over the sideline.

Yellow card: A yellow card that a referee holds up to warn a player for dangerous or un-sportsmanlike behaviour; also known as a caution. Two yellow cards in one game earns a player an automatic red card, signalling his expulsion.
