**THE 2011 CAL STATE FULLERTON TITANS:** In 2011 an uncharacteristically inconsistent Titan squad seems at times to have done it with mirrors. Injuries again have been a problem. The offense lacks power. The defense has been shaky at times (.966 vs. the opponents' .964, 57 unearned runs allowed vs. 53 by the opposition). Base running and bunting have been very un-Fullerton-ish. Down the stretch the Titans often were playing four freshmen up the middle where traditionally your strength should lie in centerfielder Michael Lorenzen, second baseman Greg Velasquez, shortstop Keegan Dale and catcher Jared Deacon. Yet they won 11 of the last 13 games and finished 10-5 in 1-run games and 9-2 in 2-run games.

Pitching has been the saving grace with a staff ERA of 2.85. Noe Ramirez (8-3) has pitched like an All-American around a minor arm problem and two weeks off for a sprained ankle. Tyler Pill has been the unlucky starter, 6-1 with a 2.08 ERA. O'Connell is 7-3 (2.42) despite a mid-season slump and Nick Ramirez has worked his way into the Titan single-season (second behind Scott Wright's 22 in 1984) and career (tied for first with Chad Cordero) record books with 16 saves in 16 opportunities for a total of 34.

The Titans won the opening Big West Conference series, 2-1, over UC Davis, and held or shared the top spot the rest of the season, finishing at 19-5 with a 3-game edge over UC Irvine. The team won 40 games for the 26th time in the program's 37th Div. I season. The regional appearance will be the 20th in succession and 33rd overall.

**CAL STATE FULLERTON REGIONAL TIDBITS:**

- This is Fullerton's 33rd NCAA Regional appearance in its 37th year of Div. I baseball. The exceptions were 1985, 1986, 1989 and 1991. The current string of 20 CONSECUTIVE appearances is third longest in the nation behind Miami (39) and Florida State (34).
- Cal State Fullerton has a national championship in 4 decades (1979, 1984, 1995 and 2004) in just 36 years at the Div. I level.
- Fullerton is 89-35 (.718) all-time in Regional play - including 30-7 (.811) at Goodwin Field, 16-8 (.667) in Super Regional action, and 34-27 (.557) in 16 College World Series appearances. The Titans are 139-70 (.665) all-time in the NCAA postseason.
- Fullerton has won eight Regionals in a row and 19 total - including a national best 11 on the road (two each in Fresno and Baton Rouge and one each at USC, Austin, Starkville, Stillwater, South Bend, Tempe and San Diego). The Titans NEVER hosted a regional before 2000 but this will be their tenth at home (8-1) - they lost the first (USC) and have won the last eight.
- The Titans have NEVER gone winless in Regional play. They have gone 0-2 only once in a Super Regional (2008) and five times in Omaha (1975, 1982, 1990, 2007 and 2009).
- Since the Super Regional format was begun in 1999, Miami and Cal State Fullerton have won more regional tournaments (10) than any other school. Florida State is next with 9.
- In Regionals that have gone to seven games... Fullerton is 19-1 in Regional Game No. 7s. The only loss came in 1976 at Washington State, 7-2.

**A BIT ABOUT ILLINOIS:**

- Coach: Dan Hartleb, sixth season
- 28-25 overall, 15-9 co-champs of Big Ten (29th title)
- Won the Big Ten Post-Season Tournament for automatic berth
- NCAA Experience: 9th appearance, first since 2000
- Common 2011 opponents with Fullerton: 0
- Series History: CSF leads, 3-1, all in Fullerton; 0-1 vs. former Coach Augie Garrido in 1990
- The Fightin' Illini swept three games to win the Big Ten Tournament at Ohio State, beating the Buckeyes (5-4) and regular season co-champ Michigan State twice (4-1, 9-1). They have won 8 games in a row and 16 of their last 20 after going 9-14 to start the season.
- Team offense: .284 average with 28 HRs and 95 SBs
- Team pitching: 4.84 ERA with 31 HRs allowed
- **Statistical leaders:** Brothers Josh (junior shortstop) and Justin (sophomore utility) Parr are the leaders with 35 RBI and a .333 batting average, respectively. Outfielder Willie Argo has stolen 25 bases. The top starter is John Anderson, 7-6 with a 4.40 ERA in 16 starts. Closer Wes Braun is 2-0 with 6 saves and a 0.49 ERA, allowing only 1 earned run in 18.1 innings.

- Common 2011 opponents with Fullerton: 4-0 vs. Pacific, 1-4 vs. Texas A&M
- Series History: First meeting. (Kansas State and Kansas are the only current Big 12 baseball programs that have never faced a Fullerton baseball team).
- The Wildcats had never been to the NCAA Tournament until 2009 and now they are making their third consecutive trip. They went 2-2 at the Big 12 Tournament, twice beating Oklahoma and twice losing to Texas A&M. They had won 6 of 7 games going into that event.
- Team offense: .280 average with 34 HRs and 123 SBs
- Team pitching: 4.21 ERA with 31 HRs allowed
- **Statistical leaders:** All juniors – infielder Jason King is the leader at .333 with 10 HRs and 57 RBI (and 16 stolen bases); outfielder Nick Martini is hitting .326 with team-best 24 stolen bases. The top two starters are both 5-4 – lefthander Kyle Hunter has a 4.26 ERA and righthander Matt Applegate has a 4.31 ERA. Closes James Allen is 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA and 17 saves.

- The Cardinal is 5-4 in its last 9 games including 2-0 at Cal and 2-1 vs. Arizona to conclude the Pac-10 schedule. The Cardinal played a tough early schedule, going 1-2 against each of three national powers -- Texas, Vanderbilt and Rice.

- Team offense: .298 average with 23 HRs and 29 SBs

- Team pitching: 3.50 ERA with 20 HRs allowed

- **Statistical leaders:** Stephen Piscotty (sophomore third baseman) has the best batting average at .361 while freshman first baseman Brian Ragira leads with 41 RBI and shares the lead with 4 HRs. Sophomore outfielder Jake Stewart leads with 8 stolen bases. The winningest starter is sophomore Dean McArdle at 7-4 with a 4.15 ERA. The best ERA by a starter is sophomore Mark Appel at 3.02 with a 5-6 record. The closer is junior Chris Reed at 6-2 with 8 saves and a 2.61 ERA (48 Ks in 48.1 IP).

**LAST MEN STANDING:** The Titans have been one of the two final teams to be standing at season's end five times at the Div. I level, and have walked away with the national championship four times over four decades (1979, 1984, 1995, 2004). The Titans were the College World Series runners-up in 1992 after losing to Pepperdine, 3-2 in the championship game.

**DID YOU KNOW?** The Titans are the 14th all-time winningest team (with a minimum of 25 years at the Div. I level) in the NCAA according to the 2011 NCAA Record Book with a .650 winning percentage (1772-949-14 over 45 season). The Titans are also the 10th winningest team of the 2000s in terms of winning percentage (.696 over 11 seasons) and are 7th in the nation in total victories in that same time frame with 488. Only Florida State, Rice, Texas, South Carolina, Wichita State and North Carolina have more total victories in the new century.

### ALL-BIG WEST CONFERENCE AWARDS:

- **Player of the Year / First Team 1B-LHP Rick Ramirez** - Ramirez, a three-time All-Big West First Team selection, has shown dominance on both sides of the baseball in 2011, and goes into this weekend's Fullerton Regional hitting .285 with a league leading nine home runs at the plate while also serving as the Titans' closer. For that, the junior is being watched by the College Baseball Foundation as a possible recipient for the John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award and by USA Baseball for the Golden Spikes Award (semifinalist). At the plate, Ramirez is a huge threat from the left side, pacing the Titans in hits, doubles, home runs, RBI, total bases, slugging percentage and walks. On the mound, there has been nobody better in the Big West at the end of the game. Ramirez is a perfect 16-for-16 in save opportunities, becoming just the second Titan reliever to ever successfully close out as many games in a season. Last Sunday, the Anaheim native picked up his 34th career save, tying him with former All-American and major leaguer Chad Cordero for the most saves in a Titan career. Ramirez is 1-0 with a minuscule ERA of just 1.12 in 21 appearances this year. He has struck out 31 batters in 24 innings of work.

- **Coach of the Year Dave Serrano** - Serrano (174-71 at CSF) has guided the Titans to four straight 40-win seasons, three Big West Conference titles, four straight postseason appearances, three consecutive Super Regional appearances and led them to Omaha in 2009. Serrano has directed the 2011 Titans to a 40-15 overall record and a 19-5 mark in Big West play. It hasn't been easy for the fourth year skipper, as he has had to work around a rash of injuries that has resulted multiple position changes and nearly 40 different line up configurations. The former Titans relief pitcher, oversees a pitching staff that is leading the Big West in ERA, strikeouts and fewest walks. This is Serrano's second consecutive coach of the year honor.

- **Freshman Player of the Year / Second Team OF Michael Lorenzen** - The rookie Lorenzen has had a fine freshman campaign, and despite missing nearly three weeks with a wrist injury, has posted the team's highest batting average (.350) while stealing a league-leading 19 bases over 46 games. A fine defender, Lorenzen has not only made the routine plays, but has made numerous sparkling catches and throws from right field, resulting in a move to the captain's chair in center late in the season. On Apr. 10 against UC Irvine, Lorenzen showed it all, legging out a three-run, go-ahead triple, while making two highlight reel defensive catches in front of a national television audience. In all, seven Titans were recognized with all-conference honors.

- **First Team RHP Noe Ramirez** - Right-handed ace Noe Ramirez joined Nick Ramirez (no relation) as other Titan first team honoree. The junior from East Los Angeles enters the postseason in a tie for the best Big West earned run average at 1.74, ranks second in the conference in both wins (8) and opponents' batting average (.183), and third in strikeouts. On the year, Noe has been a part of two Titan shutouts and compiled a 5.5-to-1 strikeout to walk ratio. He has allowed just 16 earned runs in 82.2 innings overall and just five of those in Big West action.

- **Second Team Utility Players Tyler Pill and Anthony Trajano** - Pill has been Mr. Steady all season long as one of the nation's better two-way players. The junior out of Covina has gone 6-1 with a 2.08 ERA in 14 starts this season and finished the regular season as the Big West's leader in strikeouts. With the bat, he has hit .324 with a home run and 28 RBI as the team's primary designated hitter. Pill is also on the National Collegiate Baseball Writer's Association watch list for the Dick Howser Award issued to the nations top collegiate baseball player. Trajano has been one of the Titans' unsung heroes, quietly producing a well rounded game that has seen him play extended periods of time at second base, shortstop and third base. In 41 games the junior from Moreno Valley, Calif., has hit .317 with 23 RBI and 29 runs scored.

• **Honorable Mentions Richy Pedroza and Ivory Thomas** - Pedroza has had to work around injuries to both shoulders but has maintained his status as one of the league's most pesky hitters. The sophomore from Covina, Calif., has hit .346 on the year, good for second on the team, and is one of the team leaders in runs despite playing in just 41 games. Thomas led the Big West in on-base percentage, reaching base nearly 50 percent of the time. The outfielder started the season in a platoon role, but later became the Titans' everyday centerfielder, then leftfielder and leadoff man after the series at Hawaii. Overall Thomas has hit .293 with a home run and 16 RBI while sharing the league lead in stolen bases (19) with teammate Lorenzen.

**BIG WEST CHAMPIONSHIP TIDBITS:**

• The Titans have a 655-228-1 (.742, 37th year) record all-time in conference play dating back to the 1975 season. Fullerton is 482-182 (.725, 29th year) all-time in PCAA/Big West games and 173-46-1 (.789, 8 years) while playing within the SCBA.

• Cal State Fullerton has won at least a share of 25 Div. I conference championships dating back to 1975.

• Fullerton has three PCAA conference titles (1975-76 and 1987), eight SCBA titles (1977-84), and 14 in the Big West Conference era (1990-91, 94-95, 1997, 1999-2001, 2004-06, 2008 and 2010-11)

• Augie Garrido (head coach from 1975-1987, 1991-96) won 14 conference championships as the Titans' head coach. Larry Cochell (1988-90) won one. George Horton (1997-2008) led the Titans to the league title seven times and Dave Serrano now has three.

• Cal State Fullerton has won 9 of the last 13 Big West Conference championships, sharing it in both 2000 (w/ Nevada) and 2008 (w/ Long Beach).

**TITAN TIDBITS:**

• The Titans have been tough when it counts late in the game going 30-0 when leading after six innings, 34-1 when leading after 7 innings and 35-0 when leading after eight innings. The one late-inning loss came on Mar. 11 at LSU. The Titans were leading 4-3 after seven, but the Tigers rolled a four in the bottom of the eighth and went on to win 7-6.

• The Titans have had 10-or-more hits in 14 of their last 19 games and 20 of their last 30. They had just 14 double-digit hits in the first 36 contests of the year.

• The Titans have gone consecutive games without an error just five times this season. The longest errorless game streak for Fullerton this year has been four games (Feb. 27 to Mar. 5). The Titans have one 4-game streak, one 3-game streak, and three 2-game streaks.

• **Richy Pedroza** has the Titans' longest hitting streak heading into the Fullerton Regional at five games. In those games the infielder has hit .400 (8-for-20) with three doubles, a triple, three RBI and nine runs scored. The Titans longest hitting streaks of the year totaled just 10 games. **Pedroza** and **Tyler Pill** each had a 10 game streak earlier in the season.

• When **Tyler Pill** hits for himself on days he pitches, he is 12-for-35 (.343) with four runs scored and five RBI. In his career though, Pill is hitting .4115\*9/48.667 (23-for-56) on days he pitched.

• At season's end we will see the true effect the new BBCOR bat restrictions have made on the college game. As far as the long ball, it has made quite an impact in Fullerton. Through 55 games, the Titans have hit just 17 home runs as a team – **Nick Ramirez** had 16 last year by himself. Fullerton has never finished with fewer than 28 home runs (1975) in any season.

• Who is the team's best 2-out hitter you ask? You make the call. **Carlos Lopez** is 14-for-43 (.326) with 18 of his 33 RBI coming with two down. **Jared Deacon** has quietly extended innings going 15-for-41 (.366) and **Richy Pedroza** has the second-most RBI in the two out situation with 13. **Tyler Pill** has the most two-out hits (17) and **Nick Ramirez** is right behind with 16.

• Since the Titans' Apr. 26 game at San Diego, they have relied heavily on a young foursome playing up the middle. The freshman group of catcher **Jared Deacon**, shortstop **Keegan Dale**, second baseman **Greg Velazquez** and centerfielder **Michael Lorenzen** have combined to hit .303 (116-for-383) with three home runs and 58 RBI.

• The Titans have been in 15 games that have been decided by just one run so far in 2011. In those 15 one-run games, the Titans are 10-5, with five of the wins happening in come-from-behind fashion. Twenty-six of Fullerton's games have been decided by two runs or less, with the Titans going 19-7 in those affairs.

• **Noe Ramirez** has given up just 2 earned runs over his last three appearances spanning 15 innings (1.20 ERA), but even better, he has given up just five earned runs since Mar. 25 at Hawaii. Over those last eight appearances, the right-hander has an ERA of 0.92 (5 ER in 48.2 IP).

• **Colin O'Connell** has walked just six men all year in 70.2 innings... that translates to .76 walks per nine innings pitched. If the right-hander continues his pace, he will rank second in a Fullerton single season behind Wes Roemer's amazing mark of 0.41 walks per nine innings set in 2006.

• Freshman **Michael Lorenzen** has driven in a run in seven of his last eight games totaling 11 RBI. He has also scored in 10 consecutive games totaling 13 runs. Lorenzen has figured in 24 of the Titans' 62 runs scored over the last 10 games.

**PILL UP FOR DICK HOWSER AWARD:** Junior Tyler Pill was named a Dick Howser Award semifinalist by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) on May 20. The Howser Award, in its 25th year, goes to the top player in college baseball and will be presented to the winner on June 21, 2011, at TD Ameritrade Park prior to the fourth day of competition at the College World Series. Pill, a two-way player for the Titans, has a 5-1 record with a 2.26 ERA in 83.2 innings over 13 starts for the Titans and is leading the Big West Conference with 93 strikeouts. Pill's career strikeout to walk ratio ranked 6th in CSF's Top 10 behind Noe Ramirez, at 5.0-to-1 (225-to-45). At the plate, the Covina native is hitting .319 with nine doubles and 24 RBI as an outfielder and designated hitter. Pill is the

only Big West player on the list of 36 released by the NCBWA, and he, UCLA's Trevor Bauer and Utah's Trevor Cron are the only representatives of schools west of the state of Texas. The NCBWA works in conjunction with the St. Petersburg Area Chamber of Commerce and the College Baseball Foundation on the award voting. The Dick Howser Award is presented by Easton Foundations.

**NICK RAMIREZ A SEMIFINALIST FOR GOLDEN SPIKES:** Junior first baseman-pitcher Nick Ramirez is one of 30 semifinalists for the 2011 Golden Spikes Award presented by USA Baseball to the nation's top amateur player. Ramirez is one of the nation's most productive two-way players. He will carry a 1-0 pitching record with 16 saves in 16 opportunities and a 1.12 earned run average into this weekend's NCAA Regional Tournament at Goodwin Field. He leads the Big West Conference champion Titans' offense with 9 home runs, 45 runs batted in, 15 doubles and 32 walks. Three Titans have won the award in the past -- Tim Wallach in 1979, Phil Nevin in 1992 and Mark Kotsay in 1995. Ramirez was a finalist for the 2010 John Olerud Award, presented to the nation's best two-way player.

**BASEBALL AMERICA'S TOP 200 DRAFT PICKS:** The staff of Baseball America released its Top 200 rankings of players for this June's MLB First-Year Players Draft, and three Titans were found among the nation's elite high school, junior college and college levels. **Noe Ramirez** was ranked No. 93 and also was tabbed one of the three college pitchers with the best command (1. Danny Hultzen, LHP, Virginia, 2. Taylor Jungmann, RHP, Texas, and Ramirez at No. 3). Two-way player, **Tyler Pill** came in at No. 162 as a pitcher and **Nick Ramirez** came in at No. 197 as a two-way player. There are scouting reports on each of the individuals on the Top 200. A Baseball America subscription is required.

**SMARTY PANTS:** Redshirt sophomore outfielder **Carlos Lopez** earned Capital One Academic All-District Second Team honors for his performance in the classroom as well as on the field as announced by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) on May 6. Lopez, a communications major, has maintained a cumulative 3.32 GPA while participating with the Titans' nationally prominent baseball team for the past three seasons. Through May 26, the Northridge native is hitting .350 - good for fourth in the Big West Conference - with two home runs and 30 runs batted in, and has struck out just nine times in 137 at bats. His performance on the field has helped the Titans remain atop the Big West Standings with three games left in the regular season. To be eligible, student-athletes must have a 3.30 GPA while having participated in over 50 percent of his team's games. Lopez is one of four Big West players on a first or second team in District 8. He joins UC Irvine's D.J. Crumlich, UC Davis' Eric Johnson and Long Beach State's Brennan Metzger on the annual list. Lopez was Cal State Fullerton's Male Scholar Athlete of the Year for 2010.

**STATISTICAL NATIONAL RANKINGS (TEAM Top 25):** Coming into the week, the Titans rank nationally in the following statistical categories: Sacrifice bunts (9th, 75), fewest walks per nine innings (4th, 2.27), fewest hits allowed per nine innings (25th, 8.11), ERA (13th, 2.85), hit by pitch (12th, 88), sacrifice flies (22nd, 32) win/loss percentage (12th, .727), strikeouts per nine innings (14th, 8.2), triples (11th, 24).

**STATISTICAL NATIONAL RANKINGS (INDIVIDUAL Top 25):** Coming into the week, individuals players rank nationally in the following statistical categories: Hit by pitch (Ivory Thomas, 18th, 18), ERA (Noe Ramirez, 18th, 1.74), Fewest hits allowed per nine innings (Noe Ramirez, 9th, 5.66), Fewest walks allowed per nine innings (Colin O'Connell, 6th, 0.76), saves (Nick Ramirez, 7th, 16).

**TAKING A DOS:** The Titans have been hit by 88 pitches through 55 games (12th in the nation). If they reach the 100 HBP plateau, it will be just the sixth time in school history that will have happened. Fullerton holds three of the top 20 records in NCAA history when it comes to HBPs and rank as high as 6th all-time with 124 doses in 2009.

**RACKING UP THE SACS:** The Titans have cooled down in terms of sacrifice bunts in the second half of the season. At one point this season, they were on pace to break the century mark in sac-bunts, a feat only four teams in the history of the NCAA have accomplished. Despite the lower frequency, the Titans (75 SACs) are still in the nation's Top 10. Fullerton is currently ninth in the country behind the nation's leaders UNC Greensboro and Texas (88).

**NICK RAMIREZ AND SAVES:** Nick Ramirez is a perfect 16-for-16 in saves this season and is now tied with former Titan All-American and major leaguer Chad Cordero for the most saves in a Titan career with 34. His next save will set the new mark for which Titan relievers will be compared. So far this season, Ramirez has passed Adam Jorgenson and Kirk Saarloos (22 saves), Ted Silva (26 saves) Vinnie Pestano (27 saves) and Scott Wright (32 saves) on the career list and, for the time being, sits even with Cordero, who saved his 34 games from 2001-03. Nick's 16 saves on the year ranks him alone in second place in a single season. The single-season record is held by Scott Wright, who recorded 22 saves for the 1984 national champions. That 1984 team played 86 games.

**TWO-WAY CLOSERS:** Nick Ramirez and Titan Hall of Famer Mark Kotsay are the only two players that both hit and pitch on the Fullerton all-time Top 10 saves list. Kotsay saved 14 games in his career, 11 of those in 1995 en route to a national championship. Kotsay was a career .404 hitter with 45 home runs and 216 RBI. He was 3-2 with 14 saves (10th all-time at CSF) and compiled a 3.90 career ERA. Ramirez is a career .311 hitter with 35 home runs and 151 RBI and is 5-4 with 34 saves and a 2.64 ERA on the mound. Ramirez is currently on the College Baseball Foundation's John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Watch List.

**JUST ONE MORE THING:** Regarding Nick Ramirez's saves... did you know that 13 of them have come on the tail end of Noe Ramirez starts? You can tack on one more if you count games that Noe Ramirez pitched in. Both Ramirez's were a part of a relief effort that beat the UCLA Bruins on May 25, 2010 at Goodwin Field.

**TOP 10 IN TATERS:** Junior Nick Ramirez (35 career home runs) his now in sole possession of ninth place in Cal State Fullerton's career home run Top 10. He has surpassed former Titan slugger Ryan Owens (1997-99) -- bumping him into the 10 spot -- and knocked former Titan first baseman Aaron Rifkin (1999-01) from the list. Owens hit a lofty 23 home runs in 1999. Up next for Ramirez are Titan legends Phil Nevin and Tie Wallach who each hit 39 bombs in their careers. The most long balls hit in a Titan career came off the bat of Mark Pirruccello from 1979-82. He belted 50 homers in his four-year career.

**CAREER NUMBERS FOR NOE:** Noe Ramirez has pretty quietly put up some of the best numbers in Cal State Fullerton history. In all, his 29 wins ranks him tied for 9th all-time in a career with former southpaw Jon Smith (1998-2001), and just one win away tying Ricky Romero (2003-05) for 8th. His current 2.61 ERA places him 6th all-time and his 310 strikeouts sees him in 6th place, behind Romero (311) and Tim Thompson (312, from 1980-83). He ranks 5th in strikeouts per nine innings

(9.31), 5th all-time in fewest walks per nine innings and has a career strikeout to walk ratio of 5.1-to-1 (310-to-31), ranking him 5th all-time in a Titan career.

**TIME FLIES:** New speed-up-the-game rules have definitely shown their faces in the box scores when it comes to time of game. Forty-seven of Cal State Fullerton's 55 games (85 percent) this season have been completed in under three hours, 32 of them in under 2:45, and three finishing in under two hours (although the one at Hawaii was just 7 innings long). Last year, 39 of Fullerton's 64 games were under three hours (61 percent) with a season low of 2:18.

**WINNING, TITAN STYLE:** Take that Charlie Sheen! With a series win over Pacific (Apr. 29 to May 1), Fullerton has guaranteed itself another winning season, making that 37 in a row at the Div. I level. Since 1975, the closest any team has come to a .500 record was in 1989 when Larry Cochell's Titans went 30-27, and finished 5th in the PCAA with an 10-11 mark in league.

**SERRANO'S MILESTONE VICTORIES:** The Titans' 4-3 victory over Long Beach St. was Head Coach Dave Serrano's 250th career victory. In six seasons a head coach Serrano has averaged over 41 wins per season and has hit three milestones since joining the Titans back in 2008 (win No. 250, 200 and 150).

**SERRANO'S FULLERTON MILESTONE:** The 3-2 win on Mar. 27, 2011 was Dave Serrano's 150th as the Titans' head coach. Former Titan skippers Augie Garrido and George Horton also won their 150th games in their fourth seasons. Garrido won his 150th game in 206 baseball games. Horton reached the plateau in 213 games and Serrano has now done it in 214 games (with much more aggressive schedules).

**EVERYBODY SAID SO:** Cal State Fullerton was the unanimous favorite to win the Big West Conference according to the 9 Big West Coaches. The Titans claimed all nine first-place votes in the poll totaling 81 points and were followed by UC Irvine and UC Riverside, which tied for second with 65 points apiece. The poll was rounded out by Cal Poly (50), Long Beach State (47), UC Santa Barbara (36), Pacific (26), UC Davis (22) and Cal State Northridge (13).

**ALL-AMERICAN ARMS:** Thanks to superb years from **Noe Ramirez**, Daniel Renken and Dylan Floro in 2010, the Titans extended their nation-best string of seasons with an All-American pitcher to 13. That is – by far – the longest streak in the nation. The last time the Titans did not have an All-American pitcher was 1997. Going back to 1992, the Titans have had at least one All-American pitcher in 18 of the last 19 seasons.

**TEAM USA:** Cal State Fullerton has been a pipeline of talent to USA baseball supplying 5 Olympians, 3 US National Team members, 19 Collegiate National Team members and a coach since 1984. Last summer, **Noe Ramirez**, **Nick Ramirez** and **Dave Serrano** represented the USA and Cal State Fullerton with the Collegiate National Team that won the silver medal at the V FISU Championships in Tokyo, Japan. Serrano became the first Titan head coach to serve on a Team USA coaching staff, serving as the pitching coach on Bill Kinneberg's (Utah) staff. Noe's summer was highlighted by helping to throw the Collegiate National Team's first no-no since 2009. He combined with Vanderbilt's Sonny Gray and TCU's Kyle Winkler, to blank Korea at Coleman Field in Cary, North

Carolina. He finished 0-0 with 5 saves and a 2.70 ERA in a team-high 9 appearances (all in relief). Nick batting .290 with a pair of home runs and 14 RBI in 16 games at first base. He also made 4 appearances on the mound, going 0-1 with a save and a 1.59 ERA in 5.2 innings.

**2011 TITANS IN THE DRAFT (in alphabetical order):** Ten Titans on the current roster have been selected in the MLB First-Year Players draft at least once in their baseball career. Newcomer Joe Terry has been drafted in each of the last two seasons, and comes to Fullerton after being selected by the White Sox in the 8th round of last year's draft. Michael Lorenzen also looks to increase his draft status with a few seasons under his belt in Fullerton. The freshman outfielder was a 7th round pick by the Rays last year.

The only Titan team to win as few as 30 games was the 1989 squad skippered by Larry Cochell. The Titans have never had a losing season at the Div. I level. Ricky Hazel (Troy SID) put together a list of active 30-win seasons last season. Fullerton is tied for third with Clemson and behind Arizona State and Miami. Pepperdine, which was ranked No. 5, saw its 32-year streak ended in 2010.

**BASEBALL AMERICA PRO RANKINGS:** Baseball America has listed Titan right-handed pitchers **Noe Ramirez** (Junior) and **Dylan Floro** (Sophomore) and outfielder **Michael Lorenzen** (Freshman) among its Top 50 college players in each class with the greatest professional potential. Lorenzen (No. 18 of 50 freshmen) comes to Fullerton after bypassing a chance to go pro after high school when he was selected in the 7th round of the 2010 MLB Draft by Tampa Bay. He was a four-time All-Freeway League star for Fullerton HS and was named the league's MVP as a senior. Floro (No. 15 of 50 sophomores) is coming off a solid rookie campaign that saw him earn Freshman All-American status by two other organizations, after going 7-2 with a 3.26 ERA over 27 appearances in 2010. He had nearly a 7-to-1 strikeout to walk ratio and was named the Big West's Freshman Pitcher of the Year. Ramirez (No. 25 of 50 juniors) has been listed as a Baseball America All-American in each of his first two seasons with the Titans, and ranks 28th on the its Top 100 College Draft Prospects released Jan. 3. Ramirez finished 2010 12-1 with a 2.54 ERA and struck out 119 in 106.1 innings. He was named to the Big West's first team and was also a semi-finalist for the College Baseball Foundation's Pitcher of the Year Award. The right-hander also went on to compete with Team USA over the summer, taking home the silver medal in the FISU championships.

**TOP 10 RECRUITING CLASS:** The Titans placed in the Top 10 in two preseason recruiting polls done by Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball in the Fall. Baseball America had Fullerton ranked No. 10 in the nation, while Collegiate Baseball had them at No. 8. Fourth-year Head Coach Dave Serrano and his staff will welcome eight freshman and seven junior college transfers to the program that finished within one out of a College World Series appearance in 2010. Headlining this year's class are a couple of Top 10 draft picks in freshman Michael Lorenzen and Cerritos College transfer Joe Terry. Lorenzen was a 7th round selection by the Tampa Bay Rays and ranks 140th in Baseball America's top prospects. Terry was an 8th round pick by the Chicago White Sox and looks to fill a spot in the lineup vacated by former Titan infielders Christian Colon and Corey Jones.

**ALL IN THE FAMILY:** Six players on the current Titan roster have had family members come through the Cal State Fullerton baseball program. **Anthony Hutting** is the cousin of former Titan standout and current San Francisco Giant outfielder Aaron Rowand who played at Fullerton from 1996-1998. **Richy Pedroza** is the brother of former Titan outfielder Sergio Pedroza. The elder brother roamed the Goodwin Field outfield from 2003-2005. **Tyler Pill** is the younger brother of Brett Pill, who played first

base from 2004-2006 and is now nearing a big-league call-up with the San Francisco Giants. **Dylan Floro** is the younger brother of current undergraduate assistant coach, Brock Floro, who pitched with the Titans in 2009. **Austin Kingsolver's** father, Kurt, was a national champion with the 1979 Titans. **Chad Wallach** is the son of CSF Hall of Famer and former Major League All-Star, Tim Wallach. Chad also is the younger brother of former Titan catcher/first baseman, Matt, who played at Fullerton in 2007.

**HOME GROWN:** Thirty-three of the Titans' 34 players list their hometown with the borders of the great state of California. Only one player, Spencer Ofelt, calls another state "home." Ofelt is from Puyallup, Wash., and comes to Fullerton as a transfer from Western Nevada College in Carson City, Nev.

**CULTIVATING PROFESSIONAL TALENT:** According to Baseball America's Aaron Fitt (thanks for the research), Cal State Fullerton has been a pipeline to the major league farm system over the past 11 years, producing 89 draft selections, 9 of which came in 2010. Behind the Fullerton is Arizona State (87, 10 in 2010) Rice (85, 7 in 2010), Long Beach State (77, 8 in 2010), and Miami (74, 5 in 2010), rounding out the Top 5.

**GOT THE CALL:** The 49th former Titan made his way to the bigs when David Cooper (2006) was called up by the Toronto Blue Jays on Apr. 30. Cooper played for Fullerton in 2006 as a freshman out of Tokay High School in Stockton, Calif., and batted .305 with two home runs and 37 RBI before transferring to the University of California, Berkeley, for the 2007 and 2008 seasons. The left-handed hitter was an All-Big West Conference honorable mention for the Titans and helped them reach the College World Series. In Omaha, he made quite a splash by flirting with a then 23-year-old record for the most consecutive hits in a CWS session. He had seven straight hits to tie Terry Francona (1980) for second most in the CWS record book, just one hit shy of the record set by Dave Magadan in 1983 and Barry Bonds in 1984 and went on to earn All-CWS honors in the process. Cooper led all players with a .533 average (8-for-15) while knocking in five runs as the team's designated hitter. Following the 2006 season, Cooper transferred to Cal where he put up All-American numbers, hitting a career .370 (4th all-time at Cal) with 31 home runs (7th all-time at Cal), and became the 17th pick in the first round of the 2008 MLB First-Year Player's Draft. Cooper joins former Titans left-hander Ricky Romero on the Blue Jays. The two missed playing with each other at Fullerton by one year. Romero was the winning pitcher against the Yankees in Cooper's big league debut (0-for-4 with a walk).

**IN THE BIGS:** With the addition of Toronto's David Cooper, The Titans now have eight former players currently in the big leagues. Cooper joins players Justin Turner (New York Mets), Ricky Romero (Toronto), Kurt Suzuki (Oakland), Reed Johnson (Chicago - NL), Vinnie Pestano (Cleveland), Aaron Rowand (San Francisco), and Mark Kotsay (Milwaukee), as well as coaches Tim Wallach (Los Angeles 3rd base coach) and Mike Harkey (New York - AL bullpen coach) in the bigs. Last year Cal State Fullerton had 9 of its former players play in the majors last season and had its 48th player (Pestano) make his big league debut. Chad Cordero, Johnson, Kotsay, Mike Lamb, Pestano, Romero, Rowand, Suzuki and Justin Turner each made their way into big league games in 2010.

**PROMOTIONS FOR TITAN HALL OF FAMERS:** Titan Hall of Famers and Golden Spike Award winners Tim Wallach (1978-79) and Phil Nevin (1990-92) have been promoted to new positions in professional baseball beginning in 2011. After two seasons as the Los Angeles Dodgers' AAA affiliate (Albuquerque Isotopes) manager, Wallach has been promoted to the major league club and will man the third base coaching box under new Dodgers skipper Don Mattingly. Nevin got his feet wet in the minors after coaching the independent Orange County Flyers of the Golden Baseball League in 2009. In 2010, Nevin managed the AA Erie SeaWolves in the Detroit Tiger organization and was promoted to manage the AAA Toledo Mud Hens in 2011. Nevin played three of his 12 major league seasons for the Tigers. In 1997, he and Matt Walbeck were traded from Detroit to the then-Anaheim Angels. Walbeck managed the same Erie team to the Eastern League playoffs in 2007.

**WALLACH'S CALL TO THE HALL:** The College Baseball Foundation announced on Feb. 21 that Tim Wallach, one of the finest players to ever wear a Cal State Fullerton baseball uniform, will be enshrined in the National College Baseball Hall of Fame in Lubbock, Tex, on July 3.

Wallach will join Terry Francona (Arizona, 1978-80), Danny Goodwin (Southern University, 1972-75), Dick Groat (Duke, 1951-52), Coach Ralph Waldo Emerson Jones (Grambling State, 1926-77), Oddibe McDowell (Arizona State, 1983-84) and Coach Bill Wilhelm (Clemson, 1958-93) in the seven-man 2011 induction class.

After prepping at University High School (Irvine, Calif.) and playing junior college ball for two years at Saddleback College (Mission Viejo, Calif.), Wallach transferred to Fullerton where he had a pair of monstrous seasons that eventually led him to being selected in the first round of the 1979 Major League Draft by the Montreal Expos.

At Cal State Fullerton Wallach posted a career .392 batting average (2nd all-time at CSF), 39 home runs (7th all-time at CSF) and 182 RBI (6th all-time) in just two seasons (1978-1979) under legendary Head Coach Augie Garrido.

He hit .394 in with 16 home runs and 80 RBI while slugging .715 in 1978, setting single-season school records in all four categories as a junior, and led the Titans to a Southern California Baseball Association (SCBA) championship and a Regional appearance at USC. At season's end, the first baseman was named the SCBA Player of the Year and was drafted in the 8th round of the MLB draft by the California Angels.

Wallach decided to return for his senior season at Fullerton and in 1979 was the best college baseball player in the nation, guiding the Titans to the school's first Div. I national championship with a 60-14-1 record. Behind his .392 batting average, 23 home runs, and 102 RBI (still a school record), the Titans again won the SCBA title, a Regional championship at Fresno State and the College World Series title in Omaha, Nebraska.

Wallach was again named the SCBA Player of the Year as well as an All-American by both The Sporting News and the ABCA, and later went on to win the Golden Spikes Award and The Sporting News' National Player of the Year Award as the nation's top amateur player.

Wallach went on to a 17-year major league career with the Expos, Dodgers and Angels and was a three-time Rawlings Gold Glove-winning third baseman and five-time National League All-Star. He broke into the majors with a home run in his first official at bat, and finished his long career with a .257 batting average with 260 home runs and 1,125 RBI.

In 2000, Wallach briefly returned to Fullerton as an assistant coach with friend and then-Head Coach George Horton.

In 2005, Wallach was among the seven inaugural members of the Cal State Fullerton Athletics Hall of Fame, joining his former college coach (Garrido) as representatives of the baseball program. He is one of 18 former Cal State Fullerton student-athletes in the hall of fame, and one of just five baseball players with such an honor.

Wallach resides in Yorba Linda, Calif., with his wife, Lori, and three sons, Matt, Brett and Chad. Matt Wallach played for the Titans under Horton in 2007 and is now a Dodgers farmhand at the double-A level. Brett is in the Chicago Cubs farm system at the single-A level. Tim's youngest son, Chad, is a freshman on the 2011 Cal State Fullerton roster under Serrano.

Wallach will be the third base coach for the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2011. He has spent the last two seasons managing the Albuquerque Isotopes, the Dodgers' triple-A affiliate.

## DAVE SERRANO

Head Coach / Fourth Season

Cal State Fullerton Head Coach Dave Serrano has proven to be one of the finest coaches in the nation in his first seven years at the Div. I level, posting nearly 42 wins a year for a combined 285-137-1 (.675) career record with both Cal State Fullerton and UC Irvine.

In four seasons at the helm for the Titans, Serrano has guided the national powerhouse to three Big West Conference championships, four straight postseasons, three super regional appearances and a College World Series berth in 2009. In 2010, Serrano earned his first-career Big West Conference Coach of the Year Award after leading the Titans to a first-place finish with a 21-3 conference mark. He repeated the feat this season guiding the Titans to a 40-win regular season and the school's 25 conference championship.

Serrano's four Titan teams have produced 19 All-Americans, two Big West Players of the Year, a Big West Conference Tri-Pitcher of the Year, three conference freshman pitchers of the year, a conference freshman player of the year, 14 All-Big West Conference first-teamers and 22 players selected by teams in the major league draft (including 2 first-rounders in 2010). Those numbers increase substantially for Serrano when you add in his Irvine player's accomplishments; 17 major league draft picks, 17 All-Big West Conference honorees, a two-time All-American and the NCAA's all-time saves leader.

At the helm of an Irvine program, Serrano compiled .633 winning percentage over three seasons and guided the Anteaters to postseason appearances in 2006 and 2007 and their first College World Series in 2007, for which he won Baseball America's National Coach of the Year honor.

In his coaching career, Serrano has posted an impeccable track record that includes continuous Top 20 recruiting classes, 15 postseason bids and seven trips to the College World Series in his previous 16 years at the Div. I level. He has tutored a long list of professional players, six Big West Conference Pitchers of the Year and four freshman pitchers of the year, has been part of the nurturing of seven first-round draft picks and has helped script two Div. I no-hitters.

In eight seasons as Cal State Fullerton's pitching coach and recruiting coordinator under former coach George Horton, Serrano established himself as one of the top assistants in the nation. His recruiting efforts played a large part in the Titans' success, as each of his eight recruiting classes was ranked by Baseball America in its annual Top 20 and two of his classes between 2001 and 2004 ranked No. 2. Collegiate Baseball ranked his 2001 efforts the best in the nation. He was named Baseball America's National Assistant Coach of the Year in 2004 after the Titans went on to win the fourth national championship in school history.

As an assistant at Cal State Fullerton, 29 pitchers and catchers were drafted and 12 of his pupils have gone on to reach the big leagues. Serrano also tutored a trio of major leaguers (most notably Colorado's Todd Helton) during a two-year run as an assistant at the University of Tennessee from 1995-96.

Last summer, Serrano, who has coached 16 players who have gone on to star for USA Baseball National Teams, got his chance to don the Red, White and Blue himself as pitching coach of the US Collegiate National Team. The squad went on to win the silver medal at the FISU Championships in Japan.

Serrano lives in Irvine with his wife, Tracy, and their sons Kyle (15), Zachary (13) and Parker (7).
