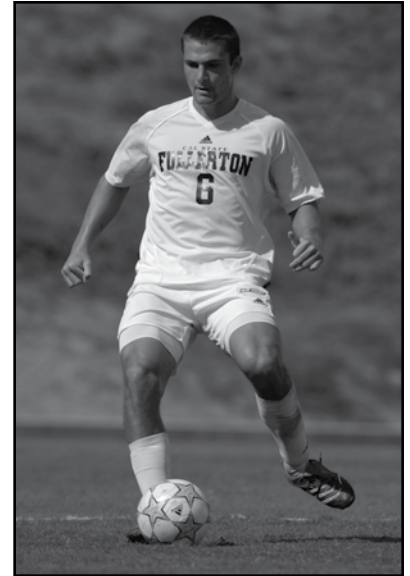

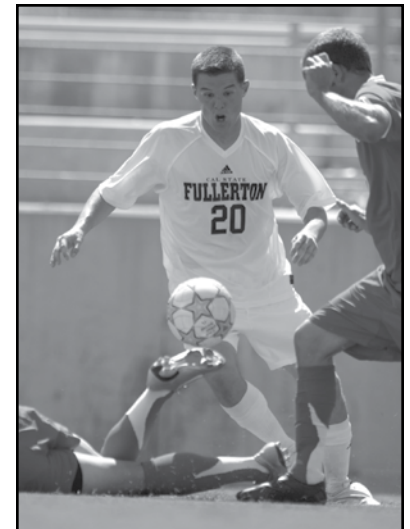

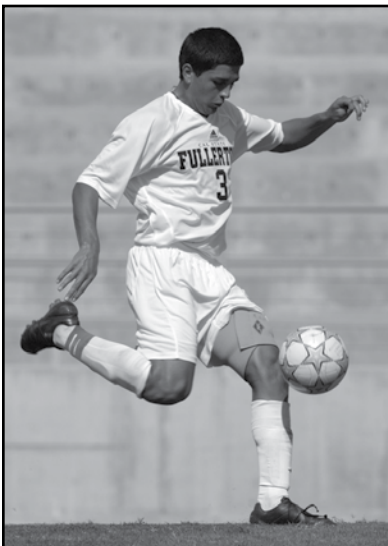

Coach Bob Ammann

After 15 years on the Titans' coaching staff and four years as a Titan player, Bob Ammann was the obvious choice to succeed Al Mistri as head coach and try to bring the Titans' men's soccer program back to the



prominence it enjoyed in the 1980s and 1990s.

Ammann, 43, was promoted on Dec. 5, 2005, to replace Mistri, who retired after the 2005 season. Ammann had been a full-time assistant for the previous 11 years and prior to that term he served four years as a part-time coach. During his coaching tenures the Titans made five trips to the NCAA Tournament, reaching the national semifinals in 1993 and the quarterfinals in 1994.

In his inaugural 2006 season, Ammann saw the Titans increase their victory total from four to seven (7-11-1). Two of their losses came by one goal to eventual national champion UC Santa Barbara, the first in double overtime. Two other losses came in overtime where the Titans finished 1-3-1. Last year the Titans improved slightly to 7-10-3 (1-1-3 in overtime) despite a rash of injuries that further weakened a thin bench. Ammann brought more than 30 players to 2008 pre-season camp to alleviate the depth problem.

"I am extremely honored and very excited to be taking charge of the men's soccer program at my alma mater," said Ammann upon his appointment. "I appreciate this opportunity and look forward to bringing the program back to the national prominence that we once had. There is a lot of work that needs to be done, but I am confident and very eager to make sure that the necessary steps are taken to achieve our goals."

"We were very excited to have Bob assume the head coaching duties," said Director of Athletics Brian Quinn. "We have great confidence in his abilities and are confident he will get the program back on the right track. The program is funded to the maximum of 9.9 scholarships and we're looking at additional ways to improve it."

Ammann was a Titans' goalkeeper during the 1983 through 1986 seasons. He posted 12 career shutouts including six in the 1986 season



when he helped the Titans capture the Pacific Coast Athletic Association championship and an NCAA Div. I playoff berth. His best goals against average was 1.250 in 1985, his junior season. His younger brother, Mike, was the Titans' goaltender 1990 through 1993 and went on to a long career in professional soccer.

"I'm proud of the fact that I have been involved with six Cal State Fullerton NCAA Tournament teams," says Bob, who was the goalkeeper in 1986,

a part-time coach in 1993 and 1994 and a full-time assistant coach in 1996, 1998 and 2000.

Bob played at the professional level for Neuchatel Xamax of the Swiss First Division in 1989 and 1990. He also played for Brighton and Hove Albion F.C. in England, the Edmonton Brickmen of the Canadian Soccer League and the Los Angeles Salsa of the American Professional Soccer League.

Ammann is one of five former Titan student-athletes now serving as head coach at his or her alma mater, joining Demian Brown (women's soccer), Dave Serrano (baseball), Michelle Gromacki (softball) and John Elders (cross country / track and field). The Titans have had several more in that category at one time including former coaches Lynn Rogers and Julie Knight-Bowse (women's gymnastics), Dan Lewis and Ardeshir Asgari (wrestling), Donny Daniels (men's basketball), George Horton (baseball) and Mike Hinojos (fencing).

Ammann was born on May 27, 1965, and he graduated from Mater Dei High School in Santa Ana. Bob and his wife, Liz, and their infant children Robert Anton and Faith Elizabeth, live in Corona.

Assistant Coach Adam Reeves

Adam Reeves returns for a fifth season as an assistant coach and his third as the top aide for the Cal State Fullerton men's soccer program.

Reeves had been the second assistant his first two years, reuniting with the Titans' program after a four-year hiatus. He then served as the "right-hand man" for Head Coach Bob Ammann in the summer of 2006 until getting a permanent appointment on Aug. 31 when Eddie Soto took a position at UCLA.

A two-year letterman for the Titans in 1998 and 1999, Reeves transferred to the University of Washington to complete his soccer eligibility. He played one season at left back for a Huskies' team that advanced to the second round of the NCAA Playoffs. He then returned to Fullerton and earned his bachelor's degree in kinesiology in 2003.

Reeves, 29 on Sept. 9, played in 12 matches for the Titans as a

freshman and started in all 18 of his appearances as a sophomore in 1999, helping the Titans to a 14-5 record. He had 8 assists to tie for the team lead.

Reeves coached for six years with the Fullerton Rangers Soccer Club, where he began his coaching career handling the boys under 11 and under 15 squads. He began work at CSF on his master's degree in kinesiology with an eye toward a full-time collegiate coaching position.

Currently a Placentia resident, Reeves played four years at Rio Mesa High School in Oxnard and was team co-most valuable player in his junior and senior seasons. He was married in January to Catie Garrett, a former CSF distance runner.

Season Preview

As part of Cal State Fullerton's preparations for the 2008 men's soccer season, the Titans scheduled a 5-day "mini-camp" at the U.S. Olympic Training Center in Chula Vista. The goal: to get to know each other.

"We have so many new guys and this is the shortest pre-season practice session I can remember," explained third-year Head Coach Bob Ammann. "I think we'll start doing it on a yearly basis, too. It gets everyone away from the routine on campus."

Ammann has assembled a pre-season roster of 36 players, mostly in response to last year's shortage of bodies that prevented the team from practicing 11-on-11 and left his bench woefully shorthanded.

"There's good news and bad news in having so many new players – 24 at last count. We will give a lot of people a lot of playing time early in the season and, hopefully, their play will determine who the regulars are going to be."

Fullerton's Aug. 1 roster included 10 returning lettermen, 2 redshirts, 3 4-year transfers, 1 community college transfer, 14 traditional freshmen, 1 freshman from Germany, 1 NAIA transfer from Germany via Missouri and 2 redshirt freshmen who did not practice with the team last year. It does not include the talented Farfan twins – Michael and Gabriel – who departed after their sophomore seasons to pursue professional opportunities.

"I think our team was better than our record showed last year," said Ammann of a 7-10-3 campaign that included some heart-breaking losses and ties. An inability to score proved to be the major shortcoming as the Titans were shut out six times and totaled only 23 goals in 20 matches.

"We went out to get people who we think will put the ball in the back of the net. Deniz Sevinc from Germany will be a huge addition. He's a prototypical college forward – fast, strong and powerful. He will cause defenses fits, yet he is very team oriented. He will be a freshman but we expect he will be a team leader.

"We hope to have Celso Alvarez (Soph., Rio Hondo JC) ready to go. He should see significant playing time and will have three years to play for us. Jamall Farquharson (Jr., Cal State Bakersfield) is very fast on the flank and I think he fits into our style of play better than he did at Bakersfield.

"Of the other freshmen, I think Nick Posthuma (Pasadena, St. Francis HS) will see considerable playing time. He's good in the air and a fighter – a real physical kid. And Jesse Horta (Atwater HS) was a major goal scorer in his youth career. He's not as physical but more technical.

"And Joshua Meyer (redshirt, Cerritos College) is eligible for this season and he is a real threat."

The Titans do return their leading scorer from 2007 in Shay Spitz, who moved from defense to forward at mid-season and finished with 5 goals and an assist. At 5-foot-7, 145 pounds, he was a surprise factor a year ago. The only other returning players with a Titan goal to their credit are senior midfielder Jacob Shumway, who scored twice, and junior defender Matt Sanders, who had one goal.

Defense was Fullerton's strength in 2007 as the Titans allowed more than one goal in only seven matches. Kevin Puder was 0-1-1 in the net as a junior behind graduated Brent Douglas and is the most experienced of five goalkeeper candidates.

"He's a senior but he will be challenged," said Ammann, who had to use three goalkeepers in the first six matches of last season due to injuries.

Sophomore Tyler Andrews played more minutes (409 to 289) last season than Puder while going 1-3-1. Three freshmen also will be in the

picture – Trevor Whiddon from Rancho Buena Vista High School in San Diego, Pablo Gonzalez from Arlington High School in Riverside and Chris Quaresma from Marina High in Huntington Beach.

Joining Sanders, an honorable mention All-Big West Conference selection, on the back line will be letterman T. J. Detviler and possibly Tony Terrazas along with some combination of redshirt Armando Padilla (West Covina HS), transfers Justin Burney from Colgate and Mark Nelson from Humboldt State and freshmen Omar Tena (Bel Air HS, El Paso, TX), Jonathan Birt (Calvary Chapel HS, Santa Ana) and John Meza (Arlington HS, Riverside).

"We hope Terrazas is healthy. He had hernia surgery over the summer," added Ammann.

The midfield is probably the most wide open area of the lineup. Ryan Kaylor and Andres Jarquin each has a season under his belt – Kaylor after transferring from Mt. Sac and Jarquin coming in from Guatemala.

"We're optimistic that Andres will be ready to go now that he knows what to expect. It was a major adjustment for him coming in from Guatemala and learning the pace and physicality of the college game."

A freshman to watch in the midfield is one who doesn't act like a freshman – Michael Denny from Rancho Bernardo High School in San Diego.

"He is tough and has great feet," said Ammann of one of his top recruits. "He's a threat to score but also is a good distributor. At 190 pounds, he won't lose too many physical battles. He is excellent on free kicks and I foresee him developing into a team captain type. And I think Eric Escobedo (Bell Gardens HS) will do well. He's very technical and was on the Chivas Academy team."

With a new abbreviated scheduling format in the Big West this season, Ammann sees great things ahead for the conference with recent powerhouse UC Santa Barbara having its hands and feet full with several serious challengers.

"Our goal is to finish in the top four, and hopefully No. 1 or No. 2 so we can host one of the semifinal games in the new post-season tournament," said Ammann. "The Big West is one of the top four conferences in the country but last year we didn't have the fourth-most teams in the NCAA Tournament. Now that we don't play every other team in our league twice, we will have a much better chance and will be better able to protect ourselves from each other."

Every coach bemoans the strength of his schedule but Ammann has legitimate reasons to be fearful.

"About one third of our schedule (6 matches) is against teams (5) that were in the NCAA Tourney last year," he points out before itemizing the obstacles. "We open against Alabama A&M at Northridge and they will be very fast. Then we face Georgetown which I think returns every starter. UNLV is similar to us, in the third year of a rebuilding phase. And Cal State Bakersfield is now a bonafide Div. I team.

"Then we go to Air Force and Denver, where you have the altitude and difficult conditions to deal with. In Seattle we always have a difficult time and we face two NCAA teams in Washington and Portland. They play each other the week before so maybe they will beat each other up. Washington always has been a difficult team for the Titans.

"Then we go to Bradley for one match. They expect a crowd of 4,000 or 5,000 – they don't have football or women's soccer and they are coming off an NCAA tournament season. It will be a great environment."

That takes care of September and leaves the Big West schedule plus a non-conference game against Houston Baptist, a team transitioning to Div. I.

"With the tournament now, there won't be any meaningless games."

History of Titan Soccer

While the Cal State Fullerton men's soccer program reached unprecedented heights in the 1990s, success was not lacking in the formative years. Coaches and players in the 1970s and 1980s laid

the groundwork for the national success the Titans now enjoy. Unfortunately, most of the pre-Div. I records are lost and there are only snippets of the program's accomplishments in the early seasons.

Paul Fardy from 1970 through 1972 and he led the program into Div. I status in the 1975 and 1976 seasons.

The Titans made annual trips to the NCAA playoffs in the early 1970s, but probably the single most memorable game in early Titan soccer history occurred at the Santa Ana Bowl on Oct. 30, 1974. 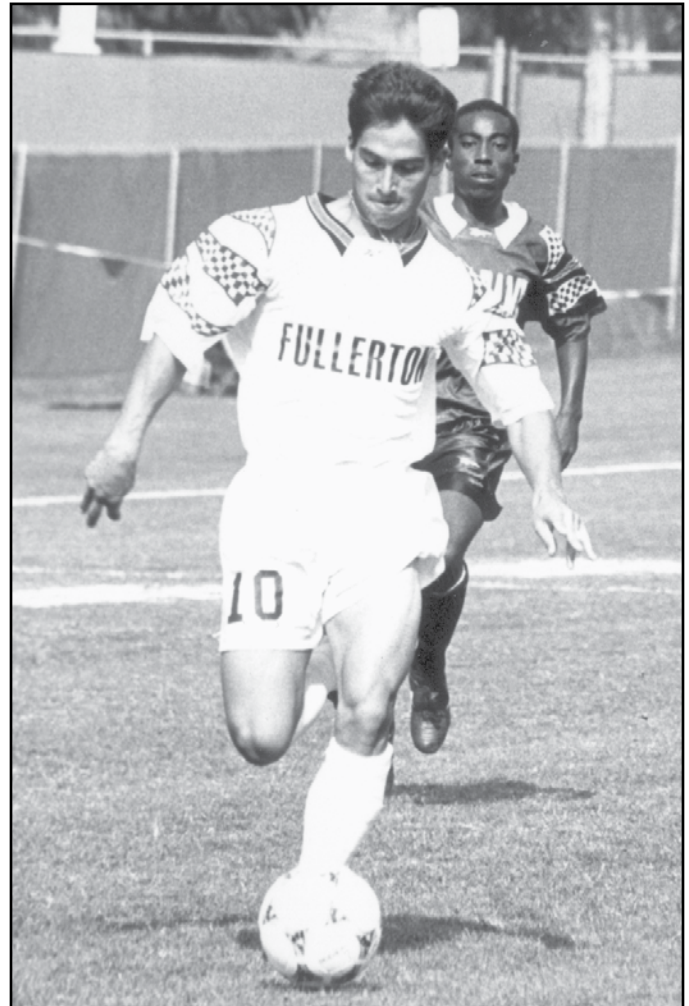

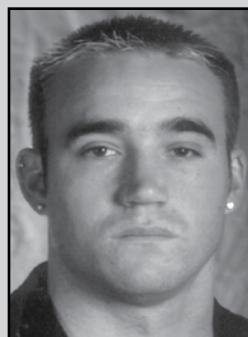

In August of 2000, the Titans' Olympic ranks swelled to three with the selection of 1995 &

1996 teammates Joe DiGiamarino and Brian Dunseth to the U.S. squad. Dunseth was named team captain by Coach Clive Charles. Fullerton joined UCLA and Virginia (two each) as the only college programs with more than one product on the squad, which became the first American team to advance to the second round.

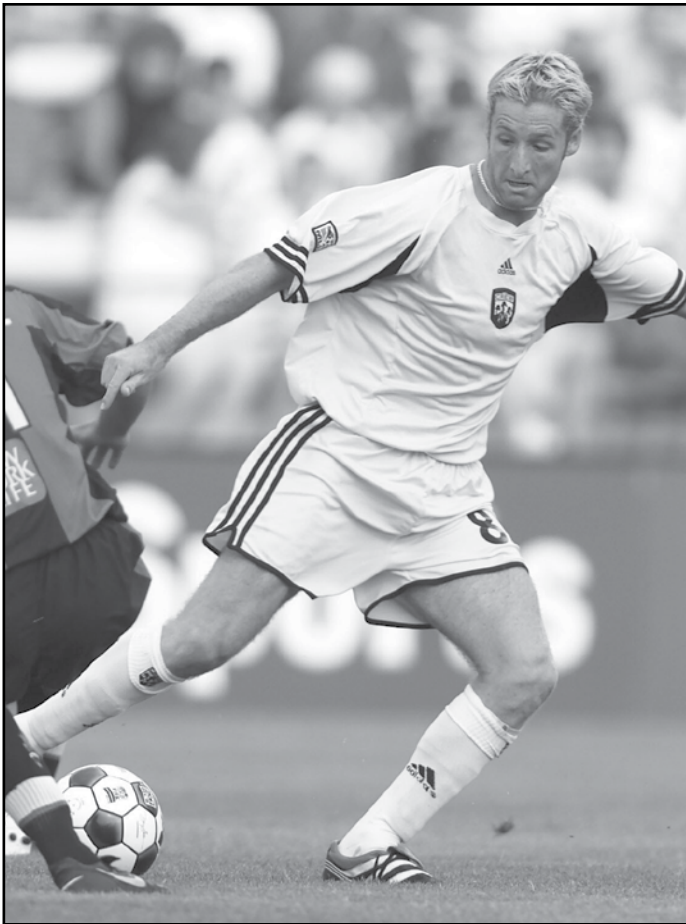

Titans in the Pros

The Cal State Fullerton men's soccer program has been well represented at the professional level in a variety of venues and the advent of Major League Soccer (MLS) has provided another opportunity beyond college soccer for players. According to *Soccer America*, about 70 percent of MLS players have collegiate experience and only five schools (UCLA, Virginia, Fresno State, Indiana and Southern Connecticut) had more products than Cal State Fullerton play in an MLS game in 1998.

The Titans have regularly competed against "A" League teams such as the Orange County Waves (formerly Zodiac) in pre-season exhibitions and the Los Angeles Galaxy of MLS in Spring action. The Galaxy, which played many of its matches in Titan Stadium before the opening of the Home Depot Center, also has used Titans as "enemy" players in scrimmages in Titan Stadium.

The Titans had four players on MLS rosters in August, 2003, in Joey DiGiamarino of the MetroStars, Brian Dunseth of Dallas, Antonio Martinez of the Galaxy and Duncan Oughton of Columbus. The list grows to six if you added New England's Joey Franchino and San Jose's Josh Saunders, who finished up at Washington and Cal, respectively.

Mike Ammann (Kansas City) and midfielder Brad Wilson (Los Angeles) both played in the MLS' inaugural season. Ammann returned home after spending a number of seasons with Charlton, a member of England's First Division. He played in 2000 for New York/New Jersey and was the leading vote getter for the All-Star Game. Wilson

also spent some time in Germany with F.C. Saarbrucken.

The Waves, the "farm team" for the Galaxy, played their home games at Santa Ana Stadium and featured as many as five Titans in the lineup at one time including Eddie Soto and Peter Lak. Others have included Colby Jackson, Paul McDonnell, Ricky Rodriguez, Art Temblador, Sheldon Thomas and Ken Hesse.

Indoor soccer also had some Titan connections. McDonnell, Hesse and Rodriguez played in 1996 for the Anaheim Splash of the Continental Indoor Soccer League at the Arrowhead Pond of Anaheim.

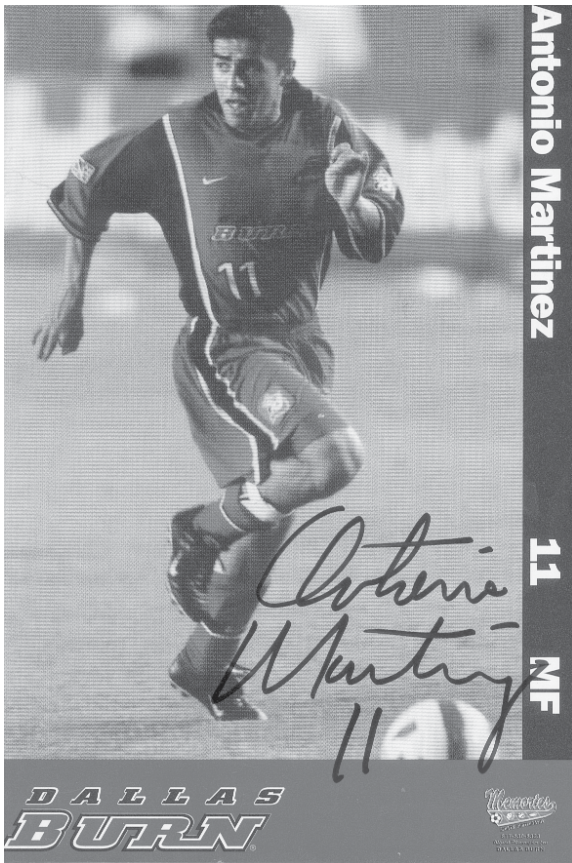
Perhaps the best-known Titan was Mike Fox, whose career at CSF ran from 1979 through 1982. He debuted professionally for the New York Cosmos, joining former Titan goalkeeper Dave Morrison in the North American Soccer League. Fox played in the Major Indoor Soccer League with the Las Vegas Americans (1984-85), Wichita Wings (1985-90) and the St. Louis Storm (1991). He also spent time with the California Emperors (1990-91) and the Los Angeles Salsa (1992-94).

Ammann's brother and current head coach, Bob, was also a pro standout. After his Titan career (1983-86), Bob made his first pro start for the Los Angeles Heat of the American Professional Soccer

He then went to Europe where he played for Brighton, a Second Division team in England. His career continued with the Edmonton Brickmen of the Canadian Soccer League and Neuchatal Xamax, a First Division team in Switzerland.

A more recent Titan keeper made headlines in the 2007 season, Sam Reynolds got a tie and a win in his first two starts for Toronto of the MLS.

Former Titans also have made an impact in the soccer coaching ranks. Noah Kooiman is head coach at Cal State San Bernardino and Ali Khosroshahin is in his second season as head women's coach at USC after a six-year run at Fullerton, where he has been replaced by former Titan Demian Brown. Ray Ramirez coaches at Diamond Ranch High School and Mt. San Antonio College in Walnut. Other high school coaches include Mike Lussier at Servite of Anaheim, Curt Bauer at Santa Margarita and Spencer McDearmon at Woodbridge in Irvine.

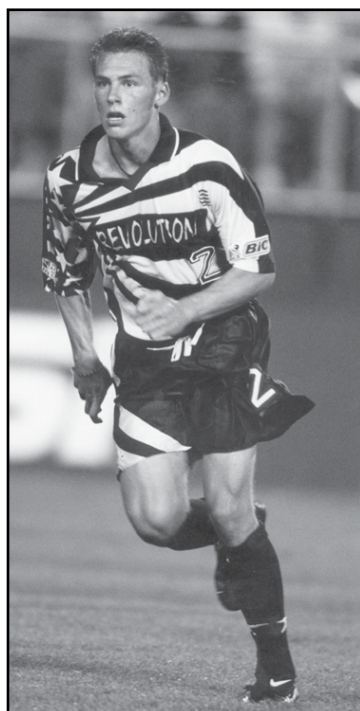
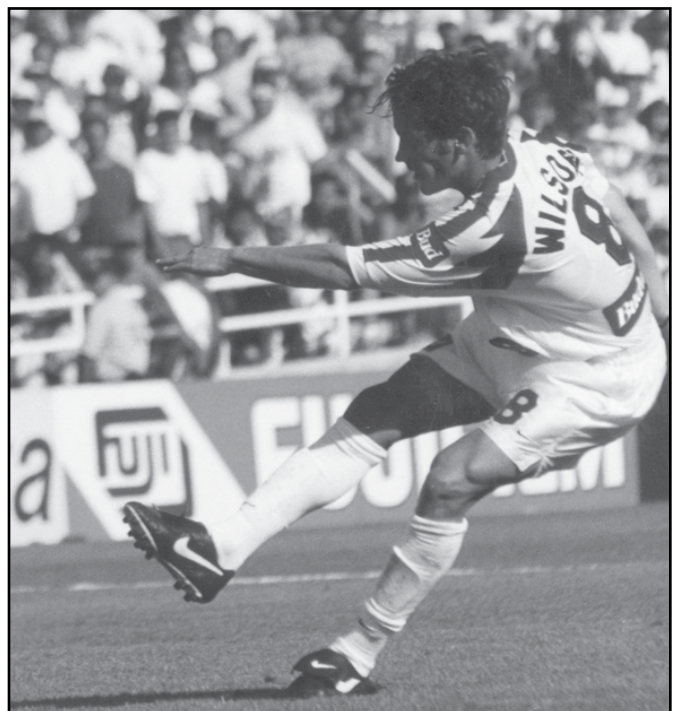

Big West Conference

The Big West Conference enters the 2008-09 academic calendar for its 40th year of operation but only its eighth to feature men's soccer since realignment for 2001. After a mandatory two-year wait after the realignments, the Big West again has an automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament, where both Cal State Northridge and UC Santa Barbara have advanced in each of the past five years' brackets and the Gauchos claimed the 2006 NCAA title.



Over four decades, the conference has strived for athletic and academic success and this year will be no different. A total of nine teams will compete in 17 sports with seven -- Fullerton, UC Irvine, Cal State Northridge, UC Riverside, Cal Poly, UCSB and recent addition UC Davis -- vying for the men's soccer crown with a modified home-and-away schedule in which teams will play two matches less than a full round-robin.

The longest-running conference member is Long Beach State, which was one of the original members of the league when it was formed back in 1969. UCSB, another original member, is tied for the second-longest tenure, with 37 years vested in the conference (the Gauchos left the conference for two seasons in the mid-70s). Pacific has also been a member for 37 years, joining in 1971. Three other members joined in the mid-to-late 1970s including Cal State Fullerton (1974), and UC Irvine (1977). The next pair of members joined in the mid-90s as Cal Poly and Idaho came into the league for the 1996-97 season. (Idaho left after 2004-05 along with Utah State). Cal State Northridge and UC Riverside joined for 2001-02 and UC Davis is in its second year as a full-fledged member.

The Big West was formed as the Pacific Coast Athletic Association on July 1, 1969. However, the unofficial history of the conference pre-dates that point of time, extending back to 1967.

Cal State Los Angeles, Fresno State, Long Beach State and San Diego State were members of the California Collegiate Athletic Association, long recognized as the nation's premier college circuit.

That conference was classified college division, and therein lay a major source of dissatisfaction. Between 1963 and 1969, the four institutions captured 16 national titles. The number swelled to 21 if the mythical football championships were included.

With no more territory to conquer at the college division, a step up to university ranks had to be considered. Therefore, officials of the seven colleges and universities assembled as a body in May of 1969, tied up loose ends and less than two months later the PCAA was born. The name was changed to the Big West for the Fall of 1988.

Titan Stadium



As Cal State Fullerton soccer established itself as one of the nation's elite programs, the cornerstone could be seen in the form of Titan Stadium. Completed in 1992, the 10,000-seat facility has been called by many "one of the finest soccer facilities in the nation." With deference to the much larger but fan-unfriendly Rose Bowl, site of the 1994 World Cup and 1999 Women's World Cup, Titan Stadium was the finest soccer facility in Southern California until

the completion of the Home Depot Center in Carson, the new home of the Los Angeles Galaxy.

Titan Stadium features 2,000 chair-back seats and

2,500 bleachers with backrests in the western grandstand and about 5,000 seats on concrete steps along the eastern sideline. The pitch has an underground drainage system that allows it to be almost perfectly flat and it is of maximum width and length -- 75 x 120 yards. The main press box seats more than 50 and there are 10 booths for broadcasting or hospitality.

The stadium shell was completed on Jan. 15, 1992. The first event was commencement on May 30, 1992, and the first soccer activity was a scrimmage between Fullerton and Biola University on Aug. 22, 1992. The first collegiate soccer match was Fullerton vs. UC Santa Barbara on Sept. 5, 1992, followed that evening by Fullerton vs. Cal State Northridge in football. During the summer of 1998, the field level locker room was completed and concessions stands and restrooms were built on the eastern terrace.

During the months leading to the 1994 World Cup, Titan Stadium played host to several international exhibitions featuring the United States team.

The Colombian team trained at Fullerton and several other nations used the facility after the Colombian team was eliminated.

In 1993 and 1994, Titan Stadium served as the home of the Los Angeles Salsa of the American Professional Soccer League. Los Angeles lost to Colorado, 2-1, in the 1993 APSL Championship held in Titan Stadium.

In recent years, the soccer slate has included many international exhibitions and Los Angeles Galaxy and women's pro matches.

In 1994, Cal State Fullerton hosted its first NCAA tournament games ever when the Titans played, and defeated, the University of San Diego and the University of San Francisco in the first two rounds of the tournament.

The stadium is only part of the Titan Sports Complex, which was financed by a unique arrange-

ment with the city of Fullerton and an on-campus Marriott Hotel. A baseball stadium seating 3,500, a two-diamond softball complex seating more than 1,000, an all-weather running track, renovated tennis courts and an auxiliary soccer field all were part of the original \$10 million project that has seen more than \$4 million in improvements.

With its proximity to Hollywood, Titan Stadium has become a favorite film location for movies, commercials and video games. Numerous professional stars from many sports including soccer's Mia Hamm have been featured. The last major studio movie production to utilize Titan Stadium was "Rocky and Bullwinkle."

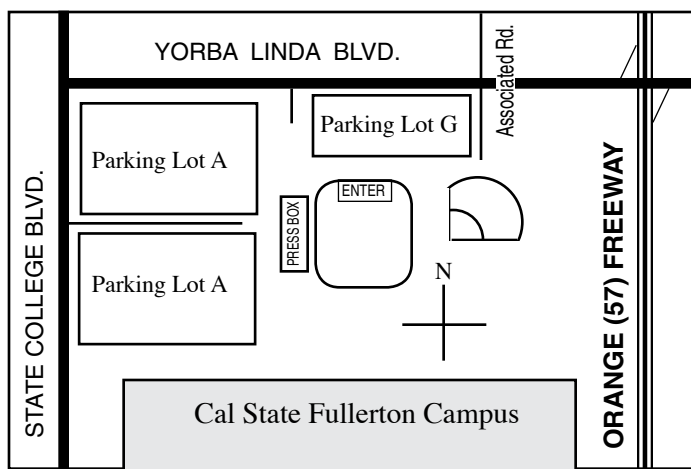
