HEAD COACH AL MISTRI

Al Mistri is in his third decade as men's soccer coach at Cal State Fullerton yet he maintains the passion and commitment to improving the program that he had in his rookie season in 1981. As a part-time Titan coach while still teaching at Damien High School in LaVerne, he kept the program vibrant in the 1980s. His appointment to a full-time coaching position and the construction of Titan Stadium in the 1990s allowed him to establish the program as a perennial national title contender. And now in the new century his aim is to increase the presence of Titan soccer in the community.



"We've put the men's soccer program on the map, so to speak, the last 10 years and now it's time we make it a more concrete factor in the university and the community," said Mistri, who has compiled an impressive 229-150-31 record while playing the strongest competition he could schedule.

"We've brought in and developed quality players and always played an exciting brand of soccer. A wide-open style has been our trademark and now there's an outlet for our players to play professionally. We've had eight or nine players at a time making a living at soccer. We've also reached for a unique audience that includes a lot of first-generation college students."

Mistri will have even more energy and time to devote to his program in 2001 now that he has relinquished control of the women's program that he founded in 1993.

"This is the first time since 1992 that I can worry about just one thing," said Mistri. "We've got sufficient funding and staffing so that we can finally see all the players we want to see in recruiting. I have two ex-Titan assistants on the staff -- Bob Ammann is from the 1980s and Eddie Soto is from the 1990s. I think it's another part of the stability of the program. We are well beyond just being survivors here."

Titan soccer has long been successful on the pitch with an all-time Div. I winning percentage of just under .600 (291-190-44, .595). But the support and respect for the program hasn't been as good. There were five head coaches during the six seasons prior to Mistri's arrival. Even then the team seldom got new uniforms and the laundry was done in the Mistri residence.

But the 54-year-old native of Bologna, Italy, can see tangible progress. Local bus rides have given way to flights for tournament appearances across the country. The Titans go to New Jersey (Rutgers) this year to continue a trend of East Coast trips to Vermont, Virginia and South Carolina in the past few years. They've also competed in tournaments in Texas, Kentucky, Colorado and Washington in the past seven seasons as well as taken almost annual trips to USD and UCLA.

"To be the best, you must play the best," says Mistri of his scheduling philosophy. Fullerton annually opens the season with a Labor Day Weekend FILA Tournament that typically features teams boasting recent NCAA playoff appearances. The Titans always play UCLA at least one each season and this year they play both Cal and Stanford in the Bay Area.

Since the stadium was erected for the 1992 season, the Titans' overall record is 118-58-11 (.660) with no losing seasons. In the last three seasons the Titans are 43-16-3 (.718). And with better players has come the influence of professional soccer, bringing both plusses and minuses. Products of the Titans' men's program are now scattered on numerous professional rosters and Brian Dunseth and Joe DiGiamarino were members of the 2000 U.S. Olympic team, giving Mistri four Olympians including soccer Hall of Famer Rick Davis (at Damien HS) and former Titan Mike Fox.

"I'm OK with the professional situation," says Mistri, who has seen several stars leave for pay before their eligibility had expired. "It's an outlet and a boost for soccer. It's part of what we are about."

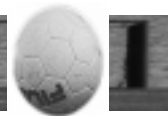
The Titans reached a new zenith last Spring when senior Duncan Oughton, who already had graduated in seven semesters, was selected in the first round of the MLS draft by the Columbus Crew. Oughton also was Cal State Fullerton's male scholar-athlete of the year for 2000-01.

Mistri, who is surpassed only by fencing Coach Heizaburo Okawa (22nd season) in campus seniority, is ranked No. 22 in victories among active Div. I head coaches and his .596 winning percentage puts him in the top 50. He boasts five trips to the NCAA playoffs in the past eight years with a 7-6-1 record. His best season was in 1993 with a 16-7 mark as Fullerton won three successive road playoff matches and reached the Final Four at Davidson, NC. Mistri's 1986 team won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association championship to earn him his first NCAA trip.

He has coached dozens of professional players at Fullerton including U.S. Olympian and National Team pool player Mike Fox, who also played for the Wichita Wings (MISL); Bob Ammann of the Edmonton Brickmen, Los Angeles Salsa (APSL) and a team in Neuchatel, Switzerland; and Lewis Garcia of the Los Angeles Kickers. More recent professional players include MLS veteran goalkeeper Mike Ammann, now of D.C. United, who began his professional career with a stint with Charlton, a First Division team in England; Paul McDonnell, Ken Hesse and Ricky Rodriguez with the 1997 Anaheim Splash of the Continental Indoor Soccer League and recent MLS players Brad Wilson, Joe DiGiamarino, Peter Lak, Joey Franchino and Brian Dunseth. Antonio Martinez (Dallas) and Colby Jackson (New York/New Jersey) both were selected in the 2000 MLS draft and Martinez is a regular with Dallas. And now Oughton is a significant player for Columbus.

PERSONAL FILE: Mistri attended the University of Bologna in Italy before coming to Southern California, where he graduated from Cal Poly Pomona in 1970. He received his U.S. Soccer Federation "B" coaching license in 1973 and his "A" license in 1976. Mistri was at the helm of one of the top high school programs in Damien of LaVerne. In a 10-year stint, Mistri posted a 190-40-14 record while participating in the CIF playoffs nine times. Two of his top players were Mike Hunter and Rick Davis. Hunter played for the Los Angelesazers in the MISL and Davis debuted at 19 years of age for the New York Cosmos of the NASL and was the captain of the U.S. National Team along with being a U.S. Olympian in 1984 and 1988. Al and his wife, Nikki, live in Fullerton. They have two adult children -- Michelle, a graduate of UC Santa Barbara, and Jeffrey, a graduate of Cal State Fullerton.

ASSISTANT COACHES



Assistant Coach Bob Ammann

Bob Ammann is in his 11th season as an assistant coach at Cal State Fullerton, his seventh on a full-time basis. His tremendous experience as a coach, professional player and former Titan has been a tremendous benefit to the coaching staff. His experience as a first-class goalkeeper has been of particular value to the Titan squads.

Ammann graduated from Cal State Fullerton in 1986 after a storied playing career (1983-86) as a Titan under Head Coach Al Mistri. He posted 12 career shutouts including six in the 1986 season when he helped the Titans capture the Pacific Coast Athletic Association championship. His best goals-against average was 1.250 in 1985, his junior campaign.

Ammann played at the professional level for Neuchatel Xamax of the Swiss First Division in 1989 and 1990. He also played for Brighton and Hove Albion F.C. in England, the Edmonton Brickmen of the Canadian Soccer League and the Los Angeles Salsa of the American Professional Soccer League.

Born on May 27, 1965, the Mater Dei High School (Santa Ana) graduate was followed to Cal State Fullerton by younger brother Mike, who also was a goalkeeper for the Titans (1990-93). Mike is a veteran of Major League Soccer, playing in 2001 for D. C. United.

Bob lives in Fullerton.

Assistant Coach Eddie Soto

Former Titan All-American Eddie Soto joins the Cal State Fullerton men's program as a coach for the 2001 season. The Titans' career scoring leader until last season, Soto brings the unique perspective of current professional playing experience as well as thorough knowledge of the Fullerton system to the Titans' student-athletes.

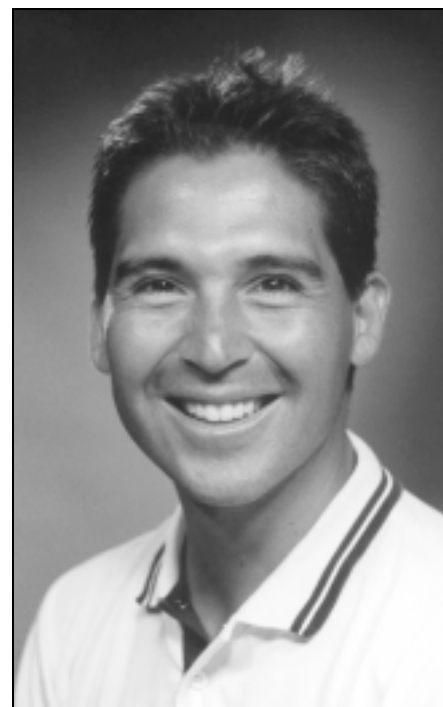
Soto played for Head Coach Al Mistri in the 1992 through 1994 seasons and graduated in 1995 with a degree in kinesiology. In three seasons he scored 38 goals and totaled 96 points, both of which were school career records until surpassed late last season by Duncan Oughton (41 goals, 97 points in four seasons). Soto still holds the single-season record for goals with 18 in 1994. He was a second-team All-American in 1992 by the National Soccer Coaches Association and earned

honorable mention honors from *Soccer News* in 1993 when he led the Titans to the "Final Four" of the NCAA tournament.

Soto's professional career has taken him all over the world. He began with the East Los Angeles Cobras of the USISL and he most recently played locally for the Orange County Zodiac and Waves. He also was a star on the pro beach soccer circuit.

Born on June 14, 1972, Soto was a product of Cerritos High School. He was the CIF 3-A Player of the Year in 1990 and was a member of the U.S. under-18 and under-20 national teams. He was a two-time high school All-American and began his collegiate career with one season at Chapman University in 1991.

Eddie and his wife, Stephanie, are new home owners in Long Beach where they live with son Fabrizio and daughter Isabela.

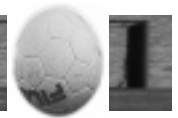

2001 SEASON PREVIEW



The need to merely reload, not rebuild, is the sign of a successful, stable intercollegiate athletic program. And, because he has built the latter, Cal State Fullerton men's soccer Coach Al Mistri isn't overly concerned about how significant roster losses from his NCAA playoff team of last season will affect the Titans' prospects for 2001.

"Because of the degree of success we have achieved, I personally feel good about this year's team as well," said Mistri. "We expect to compete for a national title every year and we won't hide behind our losses. We demand these expectations of ourselves and lacking experience is just an added obstacle.

"We recruited well and we'll just have to be patient. We expect to be good and strive to be good every year. But it's hard to say how things will work out -- that's the nature of the beast."

The Titans lost Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Pacific Division Player of the Year Duncan Oughton as a first-round draft choice of the Columbus Crew of the Major League of Soccer. He had more than twice as many goals (17) as any other Titan in a 15-6-1 season and the runnerup scorers, Art Ramirez and Ricky Melendez, were seniors as well. At the other end of the pitch, the Titans lost all 2,104 minutes of their goalkeeping crew with junior Sean Rockwell committing himself to medical school, sophomore Josh Saunders transferring to California and senior Scott Alexander graduating.

"We have all the confidence in the world in Sam Reynolds as our goalkeeper this year," said Mistri of the 6-foot redshirt freshman from Davis, who sat out last season after enjoying a prep career that saw him lose only one match in three years. "And backing him up we have an outstanding freshman in Scott Wilson from South Torrance High School and Jeff McKeever, who is from Mater Dei High and played two seasons at the University of Tulsa.

"Sean is to be commended for his commitment to academics. He just couldn't work around his biology labs and his pre-med studies."



The Titans do return four starters, mostly on the defensive side. A pair of All-MPSF selections - first-team Ray Ramirez and honorable mention Keith Buckley -- are the senior leaders of the squad. Ramirez has national team experience and professional potential. The leading returning scorer is junior David Dischner, who had 6 goals and 3 assists last season for 15 points in 20 starts.

"Dischner clearly is an offensive force," said Mistri. "He started several matches for us as a freshman in 1999 and he has scored some significant goals in his two seasons.

"We hope Walter Camargo can realize his potential this season and be the kind of player he was as a senior in high school," said Mistri of the senior who transferred in a few years ago. "And we picked up a seasoned player in Brian Treat, who has one year to play after transferring from Fullerton JC and Culver-Stockton College in Missouri."

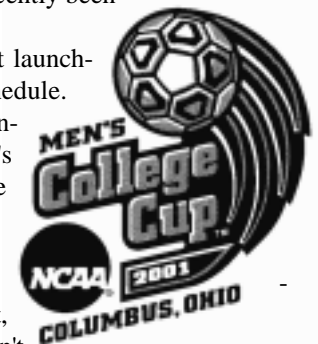
Other returning lettermen are Jason Clifford, a sophomore from Huntington Beach; Tim Donnelly, a junior midfielder from Long Beach; Sean Giudice, a 6-foot-2 sophomore forward from Davis; sophomore forward Hector Orellana from East Los Angeles, junior midfielder Matt

Terry from La Habra Heights; and sophomore forward Brent Whitfield from Long Beach.

But newcomers must come through under pressure. Mistri points to Cypress College transfer Adriano Lima and Irvine Valley College transfer Cameron McKinnon as well as freshmen Jason Ashurst from Stockdale High in Bakersfield, Brent Barnes from Capistrano Valley High and Andrew Sam from London, England, as the most promising going into training camp. He also is anxious to see in person Jyrki Kylahelko, a defender from Finland who sought out the Titans' program.

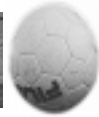
"We still have a very tough schedule, although we don't have 10 road matches in a row as last year," said Mistri. "We play 60 per cent of the 'Pac 5' in a span of two weeks with matches against Cal and Stanford in the Bay Area and one at UCLA. We open with Clemson, which is a national title possibility, and play St. John's and Rutgers, which have recently been in the NCAA tournament.

"But I'm most excited about launching the Big West Conference schedule. We finally are in an established conference and playing soccer. There's really only one other true conference in the West playing soccer and that's the West Coast Conference. Everything else was a conglomerate - the Pac-10 and the Mountain West, for example, -- groups that really don't

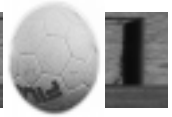
want soccer. We have a chance to be a nationally competitive conference and we look forward to the opportunity."

Handicapping the new alignment is risky at best, but Mistri is a willing prognosticator.

"UC Irvine is fully funded and will be very difficult for us. They have that 'UC' brand to brandish. UC Riverside has all the ingredients to be competitive right off the bat. Cal State Northridge will be vastly improved and UC Santa Barbara and Cal Poly are potential spoilers."

The Titans open the season with their annual FILA Labor Day weekend classic which features Clemson, Cal and Loyola of Maryland. In road tourneys they will face Cal and Stanford in the Bay Area, St. John's and Rutgers in New Jersey and South Carolina and Saint Mary's at UCLA. And, of course, there is their annual clash with the Bruins, this season on Sept. 23 in Westwood. The Titans have won four of the last five meetings but all of the wins have come at home.

BIG WEST CONFERENCE



The Big West Conference enters the 2001-02 academic year for its 33rd year of operation but its first since 1991 to feature men's soccer.



Over the past three decades, the conference has striven for athletic and academic success and this year should be no different as the Big West welcomes two new members in Cal State Northridge and UC Riverside. A total of 10 teams will compete in 17 sports this year with six -- Fullerton, UC Irvine, Cal State Northridge, UC Riverside, Cal Poly and UC Santa Barbara -- vying for the men's soccer crown with a home-and-away round-robin schedule.

The longest-running conference member is Long Beach State, which was one of the original members of the league when it was formed back in 1969. UC Santa Barbara, another original member, is tied for the second-longest tenure, with 30 years vested into the conference (The Gauchos left the conference for two seasons in the mid-70s). Pacific has also been a member for 30 years, joining in 1971. Three other members joined in the mid-to-late 1970s including Cal State Fullerton (1974), UC Irvine (1977) and Utah State (1978). The next pair of current members joined in the mid-90s as Cal Poly and Idaho came into the league for the 1996-97 season.

The Big West Conference was formed as the Pacific Coast Athletic Association on July 1, 1969. However, the unofficial history of the conference pre-dates that point of time, extending back to 1967.

Cal State Los Angeles, Fresno State, Long Beach State and San Diego State were members of the California Collegiate Athletic Association, long recognized as the nation's premier college circuit.

That conference was classified college division, and therein lay a major source of dissatisfaction. Since 1963, the four institutions had captured 16 national titles. The number swelled to 21 if the mythical football championships were included.

With no more territory to conquer at the college division, a step up to university ranks had to be considered. Therefore, officials of the seven colleges and universities assembled as a body in May of 1969, tied up loose ends and less than two months later the PCAA was born. The name was changed to the Big West for the Fall of 1988.

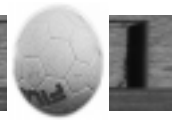

HISTORY OF TITAN SOCCER



While the Cal State Fullerton men's soccer program reached unprecedented heights in the 1990s, success was not lacking in the formative years. Coaches and players in the 1970s and 1980s laid the groundwork for the national success the Titans now enjoy. Unfortunately, most of the pre-Div. I records are lost and there are only snippets of the program's accomplishments in the early seasons.

The Titans' trip to the Final Four at Davidson in 1993 for a third-place national finish was not the closest they have come to a national championship. In 1973, CSF went 15-3 and advanced to the Div. II title game in Springfield, Massachusetts,

losing to Missouri-St. Louis, 3-0. Coach Dennis Checkett had served as assistant to Coach Paul Fardy from 1970 through 1972 and he led the program into Div. I status in the 1975 and 1976 seasons.

The Titans made annual trips to the NCAA playoffs in the early 1970s, but probably the single most memorable game in early Titan soccer history occurred at the Santa Ana Bowl on Oct. 30, 1974. A near full-house crowd of more than 6,000 showed up to see the playoff-bound Titans play the UCLA Bruins to a 1-1 tie. Another memorable moment occurred in 1974 when the Titans took advantage of a whistle blown in the stands. Host San Diego State's players re-

laxed and the Titans scored an easy and decisive goal for a 3-2 win at the old Aztec Bowl.

Morrison Gave Titans Presence in Old NASL



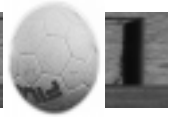
Dave Morrison was featured on the cover of the Nov./Dec., 1976, issue of *titanSports*, a magazine produced by the CSF communications department. "He could become the best goalkeeper ever to come out of California, he's that good," said his coach, Dennis Checkett. Morrison was born in Seattle but grew up in Livermore and Fountain Valley, California.

Dave Morrison was one of the earliest Titans to advance to the professional ranks. A four-year standout as goalkeeper for the Titans from 1975 through 1978, he was a member of the Los Angeles Aztecs of the North American Soccer League from 1978 through 1980, when the league ceased operations.

"I didn't play much, but it was an honor just to be around the great players and our coach, Rinus Michels," said Morrison, who currently manages an L.A. Fitness Center in Fountain Valley. "My most memorable moment was a playoff game at Edmonton (Drillers) when he sent me in for a shootout. That's when you had one player line up 35 yards out and try to score. I stopped him and we won."

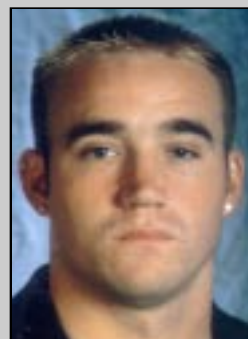

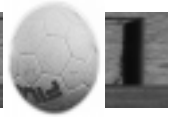

Mike Fox (1979-82) was the first Titan to make a big name for himself in soccer upon graduation. He was on the U.S. Olympic team in 1984 and the U.S. national team from 1985-87. He played with numerous professional teams including the New York Cosmos of the North American Soccer League.

In August of 2000, the Titans' Olym-

pic ranks swelled to three with the selection of 1995 & 1996 teammates Joe DiGiamarino and Brian Dunseth to the U.S. squad. Dunseth was named team captain by Coach Clive Charles. Fullerton joined UCLA and Virginia (two each) as the only college programs with more than one product on the squad, which became the first American team to advance to the second round.

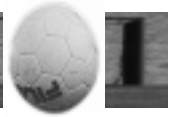

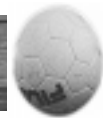

returned home after spending a number of seasons with Charlton, a member of England's First Division. He played in 2000 for New York/New Jersey and was the leading vote getter for the All-Star Game. Wilson also spent some time in Germany with F.C. Saarbrucken.

The Waves, the "farm team" for the Galaxy, played their home games at Santa Ana Stadium and featured as many as five Titans in the lineup at one time including current Titan assistant coach Eddie Soto, who also established himself as a star on the pro beach soccer circuit, and Peter Lak, who also has been on the Galaxy. Others have included Colby Jackson, Paul McDonnell, Ricky Rodriguez, Art Temblador, Sheldon Thomas and Ken Hesse.

Indoor soccer also has some Titan connections. McDonnell, Hesse and Rodriguez played in 1996 for the Anaheim Splash of the Continental Indoor Soccer League at the Arrowhead Pond of Anaheim.

Perhaps the best-known Titan was Mike Fox, whose career at CSF ran from 1979 through 1982. He debuted professionally for the New York Cosmos, joining former Titan goalkeeper Dave Morrison in the North American Soccer League. Fox played in the



The Cal State Fullerton men's soccer program has been well represented at the professional level in a variety of venues and the advent of Major League Soccer (MLS) has provided another opportunity beyond college soccer for players. According to *Soccer America*, about 70 per cent of MLS players have collegiate experience and only five schools (UCLA, Virginia, Fresno State, Indiana and Southern Connecticut) had more products than Cal State Fullerton play in an MLS game in 1998.

Head Coach Al Mistri and his coaching staff are aware of the new opportunities after college for players and they work to create an environment at Fullerton that will benefit everyone.

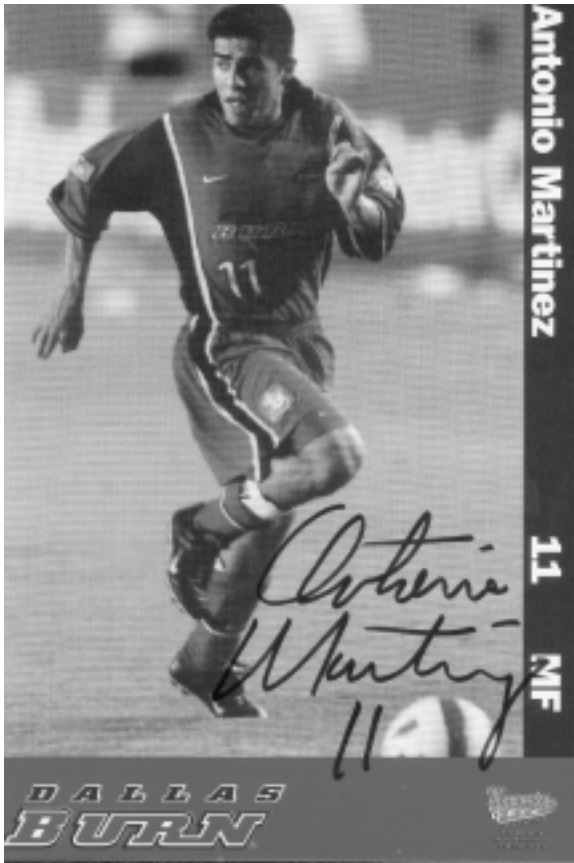
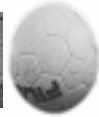
"The quality of our schedule is a clear indicator of the professional opportunities that players have here at Cal State Fullerton," said Mistri. "We take a serious approach for our training and our overall level of the program guarantees exposure for our players."

The Titans regularly compete against "A" League teams such as the Orange County Waves (formerly Zodiac) in pre-season exhibitions. The Los Angeles Galaxy has worked out in Titan Stadium and used Titans as "enemy" players in scrimmages.

The Titans have a slew of former players currently playing professionally including four in the MLS as of August in Mike Ammann of D.C. United, Brian Dunseth of the Miami Fusion, Antonio Martinez of the Dallas Burn and rookie Duncan Oughton, a first-round draft choice of the Columbus Crew, which at press time had the best record in the MLS.

Ammann (Kansas City) and midfielder Brad Wilson (Los Angeles) both played in the MLS' inaugural season. Ammann

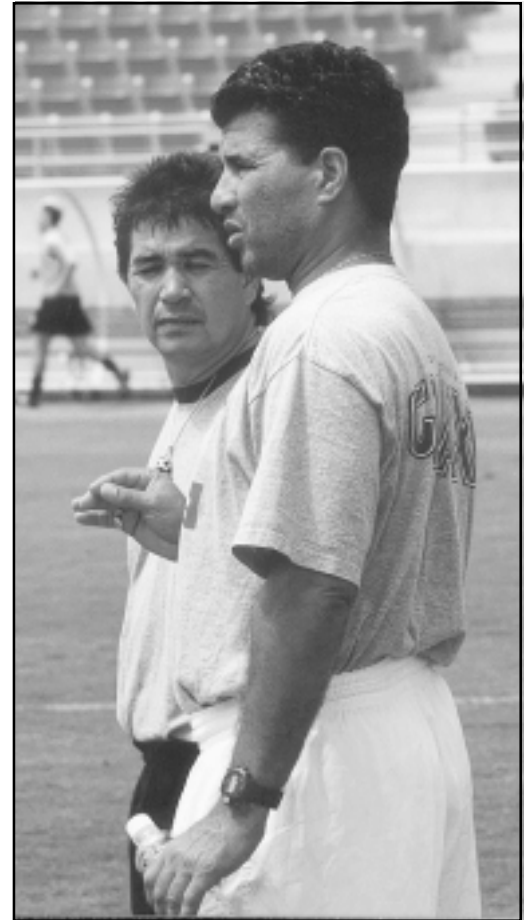

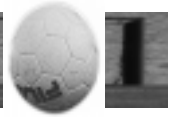


Major Indoor Soccer League with the Las Vegas Americans (1984-85), Wichita Wings (1985-90) and the St. Louis Storm (1991). He also spent time with the California Emperors (1990-91) and the Los Angeles Salsa (1992-94).

A m m a n n ' s brother and current assistant coach, Bob, was a professional standout. After his Titan career (1983-86), Ammann made his first professional start for the Los Angeles Heat of the American Professional Soccer League. He then went to Europe where he played for Brighton, a Second Division team in England. His career continued with the Edmonton Brickmen of the Canadian Soccer League and Neuchatal Xamax, a First Division team in Switzerland.



TITAN STADIUM



As Cal State Fullerton soccer establishes itself as one of the nation's elite programs, the cornerstone can be seen in the form of Titan Stadium. Completed in 1992, the 10,000-seat facility has been called by many "one of the finest soccer facilities in the nation." With deference to the much larger but fan-unfriendly Rose Bowl, site of the 1994 World Cup and 1999 Women's World Cup, Titan Stadium is *without a doubt* the finest soccer facility in Southern California for fans, news media members and players alike.

The stadium features 2,000 chair-back seats and 2,500 bleachers with backrests in the western grandstand and about 5,000 seats on concrete steps along the eastern sideline. The pitch has an underground drainage system that allows it to be almost perfectly flat and it is of maximum width and length -- 75 x 120 yards. The main press box seats more than 50 and there are 10 booths for broadcasting, hospitality, etc.

The stadium shell was completed on Jan. 15, 1992. The first event was commencement on May 30, 1992, and the first soccer activity was a scrimmage between Fullerton and Biola University on Aug. 22, 1992. The first collegiate soccer game was Fullerton vs. UC Santa Barbara on Sept. 5, 1992, followed that evening by Fullerton vs.

Cal State Northridge in football. During the summer of 1998, the field level locker room was completed and concessions stands and restrooms were built on the eastern terrace.

During the months leading to the 1994 World Cup, Titan Stadium played host to several international exhibitions featuring the United States team. The Colombian team trained at Fullerton and several other nations used the facility after the Colombian team was eliminated.

In 1993 and 1994, Titan Stadium served as the home of the Los Angeles Salsa of the American Professional Soccer League. Los Angeles lost to Colorado, 2-1, in the 1993 APSL Championship held in Titan Stadium.

In 1994, Cal State Fullerton hosted its first NCAA tournament games ever when the Titans played, and defeated, the University of San Diego and the University of San Francisco in the first two rounds of the tournament.

The stadium is only part of the Titan Sports Complex, which was financed by a unique arrangement with the city of Fullerton and an on-campus Marriott Hotel. A baseball stadium seating 3,500, a two-diamond softball complex seating more than 1,000, an all-weather running track, renovated tennis courts and an auxiliary soccer field all were part of the original \$10 million project that has seen more than \$4 million in improvements.

With its proximity to Hollywood, Titan Stadium has become a favorite film location for movies, commercials and video games. Numerous professional stars from many sports including soccer's Mia Hamm have been featured. The latest movie production to utilize Titan Stadium was "Rocky and Bullwinkle."
